OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-60) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (41-67)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 2, 2017 — AT&T PARK — 7:15 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (2-6, 5.74) VS. LHP MATT MOORE (3-10, 5.74) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and have now lost six of the last nine games...are 47-60 (.439) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it marks the third consecutive season the A's have been 47-60 after 107 games... are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 22½ games for the third consecutive day...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have started August trailing by 22½ or more games (1979)... went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 20-22 since then...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 68 days in fifth place this year.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in interleague play for the second consecutive year and seventh time in 21 seasons as they are 4-11 (.267) with five games remaining (two at San Francisco, two at Philadelphia Sept. 15-17)...the winning percentage is tied with Chicago (AL) and Philadelphia for the worst record in the majors and it is currently the worst mark in Oakland history (5-13, .278 in 2009)...have the highest interleague ERA in the majors (6.15) and the third highest opponents batting average (.291)...the ERA is currently the highest in Oakland history (5.77 in 1998) and the batting average is second highest (.299 in 1997)... the offense has drawn 67 walks, which is third most in the majors (NYY 73, CHC 71)...are 202-177 (.533) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-8 (.125) with a run, walk, five strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year...pitchers are 2-for-69 (.029) over the last four seasons and are batting .079 (30-for-378) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 180 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a five-game road trip to San Francisco (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) tonight...are 16-35 (.314) on the road compared to 31-25 (.554) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip marks the A's only five road games over a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16...all 19 games are in California...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have lost seven of their last eight road games...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed one error last night but it led to four unearned runs...have made four errors over the last eight games, which have led to nine unearned runs...for the season, the A's lead the majors in errors (88) and unearned runs (65)...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 79 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 82)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's hit .292 (52-for-178) with 26 runs scored in five games on the last homestand (5.2 runs per game) but are hitting .238 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...the only time in Oakland history the A's hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (995) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have the third most extra base hits (348) and are tied for the fourth most doubles (192).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers allowed at least four runs in all five games on the last homestand while tossing fewer than four innings three times... went 1-2 with an 8.31 ERA (20 er in 21.2 ip) and .380 (38-for-100) opponents batting average on the homestand and are 33-43 with a 4.56 ERA (300 er in 592.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 49) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (78)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.79 ERA (68 er in 161.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have

the fourth lowest post-break ERA in the AL...for the season, are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (59) and tied for third in hit batters (40).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 147 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 236 and ATL, 197)...it is also third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (7)...are tied for second in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8) and tied for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most... are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...have a run differential of -90, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors (SD, -130; SF -113)...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-12...Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win Saturday night to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...he is one of nine active managers with at least 1.000 wins

A's IN JULY: The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the DL (Fowler, Graveman, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl) after having at least seven players on the DL every day from May 24 to July 29...Graveman and Wahl are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl)...have had at least five players on the DL all year.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's split the two-games series in Oakland on Monday and Tuesday to open the season series...won the season series last year 3-1...split two games in Oakland and swept a two-game series in San Francisco...have won 14 of the last 20 games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 21 in San Francisco...in the previous 20 years of interleague play, the A's have won seven season series, split nine and lost four...are 58-54 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-23 in Oakland and 24-31 in San Francisco...are 20-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Rajai Davis is batting .395 (15-for-38) since the All-Star Break after hitting .210 before the break...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list...Jed Lowrie has tied an Oakland record with nine interleague doubles (Damon, 2001).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1924 Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...in 1933 Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...in 1972 Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (2-6, 5.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...is 2-6 over his first nine starts and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with six or more losses over his first nine career games (Mike Morgan 9, Vin Mazzaro 6. Graham Godfrey 6).

THE LONG BALL: Has surrendered at least one home run in seven of his first nine starts and has allowed 11 home runs in 47.0 innings (2.11 per nine innings...the home runs are tied for fifth most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first nine career games (Dan Straily 13, Blake Stein 12, Raul Alcantara 12, Dillon Overton 12, Willie Adams 11)...the most by a pitcher over his first 10 games is 13 by Blake Stein and Dan Straily...nine of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters.

DON'T WALK: Walked a season-high three batters in his last start after issuing two free passes or fewer in each of his first eight starts...has 11 walks in 47.0 innings (2.11 walks per nine innings)...was the only A's pitcher since at least 1913 with two walks or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more in each of his first eight career games...was the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA (9.1 ip, 11 h, 9 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 7 so) in two interleague starts...made his Major League debut with a loss at Miami June 14 and then started and won at New York (NL) July 23.

WITH THE BAT: Is 1-for-2 with a strikeout and two sacrifice hits in four plate appearances...those are his only plate appearances as a professional...had an infield single off Edinson Volquez in the fourth inning on June 14 at Miami for his first Major League hit.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 4-for-31 (.129) with no walks...has a .169 (13-for-77) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .377 (46-for-122) after that... has received one run of support or fewer in five of his nine starts and is 0-5 in those five games...is 2-1 in four starts more than one run of support... opponents are 19-for-48 (.396) with three walks when leading off an inning.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami June 14... became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on June 19 in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on June 24. retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed unearned runs in the third and fourth innings...left after six innings with a 10-2 lead. was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston June 29...retired each of the first 10 batters before allowing a two-run home run to Correa in the fourth and a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on July 9...retired six of the first seven batters before allowing Dyson to score on a Segura grounded into double play in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the fourth...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17 in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Souza in the second and another run in the third when Smith scored on a fielders choice...the A's scored once in the fourth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed a solo home run to Longoria in the fifth and left after seven innings trailing 3-1...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at New York (NL) July 23...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Conforto in the third inning...the A's added a run in the fourth to re-take the lead but he allowed the tying run to score in the sixth inning on a Reyes RBI ground out...Oakland then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Minnesota last Friday in Oakland...allowed four hits and walked two over the first three innings but surrendered just one run on an Adrianza RBI single in the second...then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a Castro RBI double, a Dozier RBI single, a wild pitch and a Lavarnway error...left after 3.2 innings with the A's trailing 5-0.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...was tied for the lead in wild pitches (9)...surrendered just four home runs in $60.2 \ innings,$ an average of $0.59 \ per$ nine innings...all four home runs were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .217 (25for-115) against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (28-for-114) against left-handers...opponents hit .213 with runners in scoring position and were 2-for-23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in five starts at home, 1-2 with a 4.41 ERA in six starts on the road...yielded all four of his home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...did not walk a batter over his final three outings (19.0 ip)... tossed six innings or fewer in each of his first eight starts, six innings or more in each of his final three...the Sounds were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high eight in 4.0 innings April 12 against Oklahoma City and took the loss... allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings... was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.83 ERA): Is scheduled to be reinstated from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow to make his first start since May 19 against Boston (ND, 6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts before going on the DL for the first time from April 15 to 26 with a strained right shoulder...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain retroactive to May 26...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts (10.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 4 hr)...is 0-1 with an 11.37 ERA (6.1 ip, 16 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against San Francisco...is 1-2 with a 4.07 ERA (24.1 ip, 33 h, 11 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 19 so, 3 hr) in five career interleague appearances, all starts

- The A's bullpen has five blown saves in the last 14 games but has a 3.80 ERA (20 er in 47.1 ip) over that span...has issued 24 walks in 47.1 innings and surrendered eight home runs.
- Has converted 21-of-38 (55.3%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage in the American League...the saves are also third fewest.
- Has the third highest ERA in the AL (4.70).
- Has allowed 34-of-127 (26.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...has the fewest inherited runners
- Rank second among AL bullpens in stolen bases allowed (38), tied for third in fewest wins (14) and fourth in most home runs (53).
- Has allowed just eight first batter home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 3)...has the second lowest first batter slugging percentage (.360).

- Is 1-2 with two saves and three blown saves over his last 10 games... has a 6.48 ERA (6 er in 8.1 ip) and .342 (13-for-38) opponents batting average over that span.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in blown saves (6), ranks third in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fourth in stolen bases allowed (8) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 6.60 ERA (11 er in 15.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 17 games on the road...has a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in 24 games in Oakland.
- Has faced the Giants seven times in his career (9.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 1 hr, 1.93 ERA).
