OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-60) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (41-68)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games after losing five in a row...are 48-60 (.444) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...this is the third consecutive season the A's have been 48-60 after 108 games...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 21-22 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 21½ games...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 69 days in fifth place this year.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in interleague play for the second consecutive year and seventh time in 21 seasons as they are 5-11 (.313) with four games remaining (tonight at San Francisco, three at Philadelphia Sept. 15-17)...the winning percentage is sixth worst in the majors and is currently second worst in Oakland history (5-13, .278 in 2009)...have the second highest interleague ERA in the majors (5.80) and the third highest opponents batting average (.285)...the ERA is currently the highest in Oakland history (5.77 in 1998)...have allowed 101 runs, which is nine short of the A's interleague record (110 in 2000)...have surrendered 24 home runs, which are two short of the record of 26 (2000 and 2003)...the offense has drawn 71 walks, which is tied with the Cubs for second most in the majors (NYY 73) ...have hit 24 home runs, which ranks sixth in the majors and third in Oakland history (29 in 1999 and 2000)...are 203-177 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-11 (.091) with a run, walk, eight strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year...pitchers are 2-for-72 (.028) over the last four seasons and are batting .079 (30-for-381) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 183 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made four errors over the last nine games, which have led to nine unearned runs...for the season, Oakland leads the majors in errors (88) and unearned runs (65)...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 79 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 80)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .302 (55-for-182) with 29 runs scored over the last five games (5.8 runs per game) but are hitting .238 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .234)...the only time in Oakland history the A's hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (1005) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have the third most extra base hits (352) and are tied for the third most doubles (195).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-2 with a 6.59 ERA (21 er in 28.2 ip) and .336 (41-for-122) opponents batting average over the last six games and are 34-43 with a 4.52 ERA (301 er in 599.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 50) but are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (78)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.65 ERA (69 er in 170.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the third lowest post-break ERA in the AL...for the season, are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (59).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game matches the second longest such streak in Athletics history (Aug. 8, 2015 to July 22, 2016)...the record is 151 games from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the 148 game streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 237 and ATL, 198).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 17-35 (.327) on the road compared to 31-25 (.554) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-38/.296)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip marks the A's only five road

games over a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16...all 19 games are in California...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have lost seven of their last nine road games...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (6) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (7)...are tied for second in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8) and tied for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most...are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a run differential of -85, which is the lowest in the American League and tied for fifth lowest in the majors...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-12...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win last Saturday to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...he is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins

A'S IN JULY: The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Kendall Graveman from the disabled list today, the A's now have just five players on the DL (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...that matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...Wahl is currently on a rehab assignment...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lead the season series 2-1...won the first game in San Francisco last night after splitting the first two games in Oakland...have a three-game winning streak at AT&T Park, which matches their second longest road winning streak against the Giants...the record is seven from June 25, 2006-June 15, 2008...the A's have won 14 of the last 20 games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 22 in San Francisco...in the previous 20 years of interleague play, the A's have won seven season series, split nine and lost four...are 59-54 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-23 in Oakland and 25-31 in San Francisco...are 21-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryon Healy hit his 20th home run of the season last night, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs for just the third time over the last 11 years (4 in 2013, 3 in 2012)...**Jed Lowrie** had his 10th and 11th interleague doubles of the season last night and has tied the Major League record for interleague doubles (eighth time).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Lefty Grove became the first pitcher since August 2, 1931, a span of 308 games, to shutout the New York Yankees, winning 7-0...in **1991** Dave Henderson hits three home runs and the A's blast a total of six, but all are solo shots as the A's lose 8-6 to Minnesota...in **1998** Matt Stairs homers in his fifth consecutive game to tie what was then the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a home run...in **2002** Mark Ellis ties an Oakland record with two triples and the A's tie an Oakland record with three as a team in an 8-4 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.83 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his first start since May 19...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts (10.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 4 hr).

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Made his first rehab start July 19 at Iowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr)...allowed his only run on a Ramon Flores solo home run in the second inning and was relieved by Doubront after throwing 81 pitches in 4.2 innings.

INTERLEAGUE: Has not pitched in an interleague game this year...went 0-0 with a 5.00 ERA in two starts last year and is 1-2 with a 4.07 ERA (24.1 ip, 33 h, 11 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 19 so, 3 hr) in five career interleague appearances, all starts.

WITH THE BAT: Is 0-for-4 with three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in five career plate appearances, all in 2016...that included a strikeout in his first at bat, which came in a non-interleague game on April 20, 2016 at New York (AL)...batted in the fifth inning after the A's designated hitter (Lowrie) entered the game following an injury to Valencia...hit in the four spot in the order to become just the second A's pitcher with a plate appearance in the clean-up spot in the designated hitter era (Ron Flores, June 29, 2006 vs. San Diego).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .308 (33-for-107) batting average with the bases empty compared to .183 (13-for-71) with runners on base...opponents are 6-for-37 (.162) with runners in scoring position...has a .348 opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning...has walked two batters or fewer in six of his eight starts...has issued 9 of his 14 walks this year and 68 of his 99 walks in his career to left-handed hitters...has surrendered four of his six home runs to left-handed hitters...the opponents number six hitter is 1-for-20 (.050).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 8-10 with a 3.54 ERA (68 er in 172.2 ip) in 28 starts in Oakland compared to 10-12 with a 4.55 ERA (89 er in 176.0 ip) in 32 starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed eight of his 20 runs in the first inning (8.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)...has a 2.77 ERA (12 er in 39.0 ip) from the second inning on...went 0-1 with a 5.48 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (15 er in 27.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day **April 3** in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **April 8**...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on **April 14** in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 27**...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each

of the next eight batters...shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota **May 3**...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a two-run single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5-3 but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **May 8** in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas **May 14**...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Boston May 19 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the fourth inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired the side in order in the first inning but that was his only 1-2-3 inning.

is the shortest outing of his career as a starter...faced nine batters in the first inning and allowed three runs on a two-run home run by Duffy and a RBI single by Belt...allowed a RBI single to Duffy in the second and was relieved by Otero with one out in the second inning and runners on first and second...then had a no decision in the A's 13-11 win at San Francisco on June 28, 2016...allowed a two-run double to Crawford in the third inning and a two-run single to Pagan in the fourth...was pinch hit for in the sixth inning when the A's scored four times to take a 5-4 lead...Axford came on to pitch the bottom of the sixth and allowed three runs for the blown save.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

RHP Jharel Cotton (5-8, 5.49 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Sunday and had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 12-inning win that day against Minnesota (3.2 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 2 hr)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a blister...is 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA, .229 opponents batting average and five home runs allowed in seven starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 7.56 ERA, .297 opponents average and 10 home runs in eight starts in Oakland...is 1-2 with a 7.47 ERA (15.2 ip, 18 h, 13 r, 13 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in three career starts against Los Angeles, all in Oakland...is 0-2 with an 11.57 ERA in two starts this year.

- Has the third highest ERA in the AL.
