OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-62) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (55-55)

SATURDAY, AUGUST 5, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a pair of two-game series with San Francisco to start the week...have won four of the last seven games after losing five in a row...are 48-62 (.436) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 21-24 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 22½ games...have been in sole possession of last place in the West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 71 days in fifth place this year.

AGAINST THE WEST: This three-game series with the Angels marks the A's first games against American League West competition since splitting a four-game series at Seattle in the final series before the All-Star Break...are 15-28 (.349) against the AL West compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 17-31/.354)...are batting .219 (308-for-1407) and are averaging 3.79 runs per game against the AL West (163 runs in 43 games) compared to .249 and 4.63 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's tallied two errors that lead to one unearned run on Friday...for the season, Oakland leads the majors in errors (90) and unearned runs (66)...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 80 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 82)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .273 (68-for-249) with 37 runs scored over the last seven games (5.2 runs per game) but are hitting .237 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .234)...the only time in Oakland history the A's hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (1020) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have the third most extra base hits (359).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in seven of the last eight games and have tossed fewer than four innings four times over that stretch...are 2-3 with an 7.82 ERA (31 er in 35.2 ip) and .357 (56-for-157) opponents batting average over the last eight games and 34-44 with a 4.61 ERA (311 er in 605.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 51) but are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (79).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 150 consecutive games without a complete game is one short of the Athletics record of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 238 and ATL, 199).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.20 ERA (87 er in 186.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have a 4.67 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...lead the league in wild pitches (61) and have allowed the second most doubles (206).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...are 17-37 (.315) on the road compared to 31-25 (.554) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-40/.286)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...the home winning percentage is .239 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...this road trip marks the A's only five road games over a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16...all 19 games are in California...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have lost nine of their last 11 road games...return home following the game Sunday for a season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (two games), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 2-13-2 in road series.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record with seven walk-off home runs...are tied for second in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8) and tied

for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most...are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a run differential of -96, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors (SD -137, SF -110)...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...home runs have accounted for 227 of the A's 473 runs this year (47.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win July 29th to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins.

LOSING MONTHS: The A's finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

A'S IN JULY: The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...Wahl is currently on a rehab assignment...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 4-7...this is their first meeting with the Angels since May 10 as Oakland played 10 of its 34 games against Los Angeles...are 4-3 in Oakland and 0-4 in Anaheim...have a seven-game losing streak at Angel Stadium, which is tied for the A's second longest losing streak in this ballpark in Oakland history...dropped eight straight from May 14, 2010 to April 26, 2011...the Kansas City A's had a nine-game losing streak here from May 22 to Sept. 17, 1967...have also lost 10 of the last 11 games and 23 of the last 32 at Angel Stadium...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 28-40 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 425-361 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 203-191 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 474-438 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman clubbed his seventh homer of the season last night, he is tied for third in the American League with seven homers post all-star break...**Ryon Healy** hit his 20th home run of the season Wednesday night, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs for just the third time over the last 11 years (4 in 2013, 3 in 2012)...**Simon Castro** has not allowed a run in five straight outings (8.1 ip), which is the longest scoreless streak of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in 1992 Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in 2008 Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings, breaking the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (2-1, 3.05 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...has tossed more than five innings in each of his six career starts...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss more than five innings in each of his first six career games...joins Willie Adams, A.J. Griffin and Bill Krueger...Griffin and Krueger extended their streaks to seven games and Adams did it in his first 10 games...has allowed one run or fewer in three of his six starts and walked one batter four times.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .189 (14-for-74) average against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (18-for-65) against right-handers...however, has issued 8 of his 11 walks to lefties...has a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 4.10 (12 er in 26.1 ip) from the third inning on...allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 4-3 A's loss to Atlanta July 1 in Oakland...became the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and it came in the second inning...Flowers reached base on a Barreto error and scored two batters later on a Santana RBI double...retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh inning with the score tied 1-1.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle on July 6...tossed 7.2 innings, which are the most by an A's pitcher in one of his first two games since Brad Rigby tossed 8.0 innings in his first start on June 28, 1997 against Texas...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Cleveland July 15 in Oakland...blanked the Indians on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fourth...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth but he allowed another run to score on a ground out in the sixth...was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 3-2.

FOURTH START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 7-5 loss at New York (NL) July 21...retired each of the first eight batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a single to the pitcher (Matz) followed by a home run by Conforto...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed two of the Mets three runs in the sixth inning...left with runners on first and second and one out but the bullpen allowed both of those runners to score.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Toronto July 26...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer while tossing seven or more scoreless innings in one of the first five games of his career (Doug Johns, Aug. 25, 1995)...just two base runners advanced into scoring position...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 victory over San Francisco last Monday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Posey in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...allowed two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Hwang and Moncrief but Oakland scored four times in the sixth to take the lead for good...was charged with two more runs in the seventh inning when he left with runners on first and third and one out and the bullpen allowed both runs to score.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the Pacific Coast League Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs (also May 14 against Albuquerque) on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado Springs...finished May 2-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...walked a season-high four batters June 15 against Iowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...tied for the lead among SL pitchers with 40 total chances...was named to the SL Mid-season All-Star Game after going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...went 5-3 with a 4.18 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) after the break...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (69-for-274) against right-handed pitchers compared to .259 (69-for-266) against left-handers...opponents hit .217 with runners in scoring position...combined for a 3-2 record and a 4.50 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks...was 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts on the road...went 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts as a hitter with Jackson.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.90 ERA):	Went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start stretch from May 20 to July 16 and is 0-1 with a 5.17 ERA and .356 opponents batting average over his last three starts...is 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 6-1 with a 3.31 ERA in 11 starts against everyone else...is 4-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.99 ERA in 10 starts on the road...is now 9-5 with a 3.33 ERA in 24 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.50 ERA in 21 starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-4 A's loss to San Francisco last Tuesday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2 ip, 19 h, 13 r, 12 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in four career starts against Los Angeles, including 0-1 with a 7.88 ERA (8.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has six blown saves in the last 17 games but has a 3.80 ERA (28 er in 58.1 ip) over that span...has issued 31 walks in 58.1 innings and surrendered nine home runs.
- Has converted 21-of-39 (53.8%) save opportunities, which is the third-lowest percentage in the American League...the saves are third fewest.
- Has the fifth highest ERA in the AL.
- Has allowed 39-of-136 (28.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...has the fewest inherited runners.
- Tied for first in the American League in stolen bases allowed (39), tied for third in fewest wins (14) and fifth in most home runs (54).
- Has allowed just eight first batter home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 3)...has the second lowest first batter slugging percentage (.350).

- Is 1-2 with two saves and three blown saves over his last 11 games... has a 5.79 ERA (6 er in 9.1 ip) over that span...his last three outings came in non-save situations.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in blown saves (6), ranks second in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fifth in stolen bases allowed (8) and tied for 10th in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 18 games on the road...has a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in 24 games in Oakland.
