OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-62) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (55-56)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 6, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (8-6, 3.88) VS. RHP RICKY NOLASCO (4-12, 4.90) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a pair of two-game series with San Francisco to start the week...have won five of the last eight games after losing five in a row...are 49-62 (.441) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 22-24 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 21½ games... have been in sole possession of last place in the West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 72 days in fifth place this year.

AGAINST THE WEST: This three-game series with the Angels marks the A's first games against American League West competition since splitting a four-game series at Seattle in the final series before the All-Star Break... are 16-28 (.364) against the AL West compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 18-31/.367)...are batting .220 (317-for-1443) and are averaging 3.8 runs per game against the AL West (168 runs in 44 games) compared to .249 and 4.63 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's tallied two errors that lead to one unearned run on Friday...for the season, Oakland leads the majors in errors (90) and unearned runs (66)...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 80 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 82)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .270 (77-for-285) with 42 runs scored over the last eight games (5.3 runs per game) but are hitting .238 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .235)...the only time in Oakland history the A's hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (1029) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have the third most extra base hits (360).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in seven of the last nine games and have tossed fewer than four innings four times over that stretch...are 3-3 with an 6.59 ERA (31 er in 42.2 ip) and .335 (61-for-182) opponents batting average over the last nine games and 35-44 with a 4.56 ERA (311 er in 613.1 ip) for the season... have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 52) but have allowed the fewest home runs allowed (79).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 151 consecutive games without a complete game is tied for the Athletics record of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 238 and ATL, 199).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.01 ERA (87 er in 195.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League...lead the league in wild pitches (61) and have allowed the second most doubles (206).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...are 18-37 (.327) on the road compared to 31-25 (.554) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-41/.281)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...the home winning percentage is .227 better than the road... the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...this road trip marks the A's only five road games over a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16...all 19 games are in California... went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have lost nine of their last 12 road games ...return home following the game Sunday for a season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (two games), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 2-13-2 in road series.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record with seven walk-off home runs...are tied for third in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8; SF, 8) and tied for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have

five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most... are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a run differential of -91, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors (SD -134, SF -109, CIN -95)...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...home runs have accounted for 227 of the A's 478 runs this year (47.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win July 29th to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins.

LOSING MONTHS: The A's finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

A's IN JULY: The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...Wahl is currently on a rehab assignment...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 5-7...this is their first meeting with the Angels since May 10 as Oakland played 10 of its 34 games against Los Angeles...are 4-3 in Oakland and 1-4 in Anaheim...snapped a seven-game losing streak at Angels Stadium, which was tied for the A's second longest losing streak in this ballpark in Oakland history...dropped eight straight from May 14, 2010 to April 26, 2011...the Kansas City A's had a nine-game losing streak here from May 22 to Sept. 17, 1967...have also lost 10 of the last 12 games and 23 of the last 33 at Angel Stadium...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum... have lost each of the previous three season series and are 29-40 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 426-361 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 204-191 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 475-438 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Rajai Davis recorded his fourth multi-steal game of the season with three swipes on Saturday. He is fourth in the American League with 23 steals on the season...*Simon Castro* has not allowed a run in five straight outings (8.1 ip), which is the longest scoreless streak of his career...*Mark Canha* stole home on Saturday night, becoming the first Athletic to steal home since Carlos Gonzalez (6/22/08 vs FLA).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1923** Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in **1933** Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in **2001** the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.90 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start stretch from May 20 to July 16 and is 0-1 with a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) and .356 (26-for-73) opponents batting average over his last three starts.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Took the loss against San Francisco in his last start, snapping an eight-game winning streak against non-AL West teams...it was his first loss to an interdivision foe since Aug. 7, 2016 against Chicago (AL)...is 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 6-1 with a 3.31 ERA (25 er in 68.0 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .143 (33-for-231) opponents batting average with two strikes, which is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has the fourth lowest batting average against the opponents number three hitter (.176), the sixth lowest against the six hitter (.184) and the seventh lowest against the seven hitter (.182)...the two hitter is batting .388, which is the highest... opponents are 18-for-59 (.305) with runners in scoring position over his last eight starts after hitting .146 over his first 11.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 16 runs in the second inning for a 7.20 ERA (16 er in 20.0 ip) and 15 in the sixth inning for an 8.56 ERA (13 er in 13.2 ip)...has a 2.30 ERA (21 er in 82.1 ip) in all other innings...the 15 runs in the sixth inning are the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Dickey, ATL 19).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.77 ERA (24 er in 57.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.99 ERA (26 er in 58.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road...is now 9-5 with a 3.33 ERA (52 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.50 ERA (60 er in 120.0 ip) in 21 starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for third in the American League in pickoffs (3) and ranks seventh in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.93)...has eight wins, which surpasses his season total of seven from his rookie campaign last year...has walked 39, which is two more than last year...has a 3.88 ERA this year after posting a mark of 3.86 last year...has a .721 OPS this year compared to .713 last year.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four... that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a careerhigh 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-4 loss to San Francisco last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed six runs on nine hits in 3.0 in-

nings...yielded five runs in the first inning but an Alonso error made four of the runs unearned...Tomlinson and Posey had RBI singles, Belt scored on a fielders choice and Hundley hit a two-run home run as the Giants sent 10 men to the plate...also allowed a RBI double to Posey in the second.

7.88 ERA (8.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year...the no decision came in a 7-6 loss in Oakland on April 4...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook...then took the loss in an 8-5 decision at Los Angeles April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...was relieved by Montas to start the third.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-3, 4.96 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Thursday and started and lost that night in an 11-2 decision at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb)...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 15 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated April 27 and went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain May 26...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts...is 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA \in four starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.20 ERA in five starts on the road... is 1-3 with a 4.82 ERA (37.1 ip, 50 h, 20 r, 20 er, 9 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Seattle...has not faced the Mariners this year...went 0-3 with a 6.26 ERA in five starts last year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

14-18, 4.72 ERA (192 er in 366.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 21-for-39 (53.8%)

- The A's bullpen has six blown saves in the last 19 games but has a 4.02 ERA (28 er in 62.2 ip) over that span...has issued 32 walks in 62.2 innings and surrendered nine home runs.
- Has converted 21-of-39 (53.8%) save opportunities, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...the saves are third fewest. Has the third highest ERA in the AL.
- Has allowed 39-of-137 (28.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...has the fewest inherited runners. Tied for first in the American League in stolen bases allowed (39), tied
- for third in fewest wins (14) and fifth in most home runs (54).
- Has allowed just eight first batter home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 3)...has the second lowest first batter slugging percentage (.347).

- Is 1-2 with two saves and three blown saves over his last 11 games has a 5.19 ERA (6 er in 10.1 ip) over that span...his last four outings came in non-save situations.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in blown saves (6), ranks second in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fifth in stolen bases allowed (8) and tied for 10th in saves (16).
- Opponents are 7-for-40 (.175) with runners in scoring position. Has a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 19 games on the road...has a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in 24 games in Oakland.
- Has faced the Angels 25 times in his career (24.2 ip, 26 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 3 hr, 2.92 ERA).

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 16 and has not allowed a run in last five games after allowing a run in each of his first two outings.
- Has fired a career-best 8.1 innings of scoreless baseball since giving up a walk-off homer on 7/22 at NYM.
- Has faced the Angels one time in his career (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so).
