OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-63) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (58-56)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 9, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP JHAREL COTTON (5-8, 5.48) VS. RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (5-7, 5.35) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last five games but have won six of the last 10 contests...are 50-63 (.442) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 23-25 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 21½ games...have been in sole possession of last place in the West every day dating back to May 30...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 75 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had a four run lead last night and lost 7-6 in 10 innings...over the last 17 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is tied for second most in the American League (TB, 33)...lost for the seventh time this year last night when leading after seven innings, which is tied for third most in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5)...however, are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied for third in wins when trailing after seven innings (8)...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...are 14-16 in one-run games and are tied for third in the AL...are tied for the losses are tied for second in the AL...are 14-16 in one-run games and are tied for third in the AL...are tied for the discusses are tied for second in the AL...are 14-16 in one-run games and are tied for third in the AL in one-run losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night and now have seven errors in their last four games...it was their ninth three-error game of the season, which matches their most games with three or more errors over the last 17 years (also 2015)...now have a Major League leading 95 errors for the season, which is two short of their season total of 97 from last year...the errors have led to a ML leading 70 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 82 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 86)... outfielders have 15 assists, which is second fewest in the AL (NYY, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .281 (103-for-366) with 59 runs scored over the last 10 games (5.9 runs per game)...are batting .239 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...rank third in doubles (209) and extra base hits (374) and fourth in walks (400) but have the second most strikeouts (1054).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in nine of the last 11 games and have tossed fewer than four innings five times over that stretch...are 3-3 with a 6.88 ERA (39 er in 51.0 ip) and .335 (74-for-221) opponents batting average over that span and 35-44 with a 4.62 ERA (319 er in 622.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 53) but have surrendered the fewest home runs (81).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 10 or more runs three times over the first seven games of August for a 5.52 ERA (38 er in 62.0 ip)...have a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...lead the AL in wild pitches (62) and have allowed the second most doubles (212).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 22-21 (.512) record during day games compared to 28-42 (.400) at night...are batting .269 (402-for-1497) and are averaging 5.05 runs per game during the day (217 runs in 43 games), .220 (506-for-2296) and 3.97 runs per games at night (278 runs in 70 games)... the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (TEX, .243) while the day batting average is fifth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-1), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games)...are 31-26 (.544) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1)

and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 14 home games... are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

AGAINST THE WEST: This two-game series with Seattle concludes a brief five-game stretch against American League West competition...are 17-29 (.370) against the AL West compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .225 (343-for-1524) and are averaging 4.02 runs per game against the AL West (185 runs in 46 games) compared to .249 and 4.63 runs against all other teams.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 153 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 242 and ATL, 203).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 51 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have a run differential of -91, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...home runs have accounted for 237 of the A's 495 runs this year (47.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at six games each...the A's are 3-4 in Seattle and 3-2 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 36-52 (.409) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 340-276 against the Mariners...that includes 183-124 in Oakland, 156-151 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-87 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for second in the American League in walks (6) and doubles (4) in August...*Khris Davis* hit his 30th home run of the season last night after clubbing a career-high 42 home runs last year...is the first A's player with back-to-back 30-homer seasons since Miguel Tejada (2000-02) and Eric Chavez (2001-02)...*Rajai Davis* is hitting .339 (19-for-56) since the All-Star Break after batting .210 before the break... *Jed Lowrie* is batting .317 (13-for-41) with eight walks (.429 on-base percentage) and just one strikeout in 49 plate appearances over his last 11 games...*Chad Pinder* is 9-for-23 (.391) with six runs scored in seven games since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 31.

In **1930** George Earnshaw tosses a seven-hit shutout and Jimmie Foxx hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning as the A's defeat Chicago 3-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (5-8, 5.48 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-0 with an 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) and .343 (12-for-35) opponents batting average in two starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third among American League rookies in strikeouts (74), innings pitched (85.1) and games started (16) and tied for fourthin wins (5)...is tied for second among all AL pitchers in balks (2), ranks fifth in unearned runs (9) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (7)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.88 ERA (20 er in 46.1 ip) and .198 (32-for-162) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 1-6 with a 7.38 ERA (32 er in 39.0 ip) and .341 (56-for-164) opponents batting average in eight starts at night...is tied for fifth in the American League in day wins...has the fourth highest night ERA in the AL among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at night...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 6-2 with a 3.32 ERA (22 er in 59.2 ip) in 10 career starts during the day, 1-6 with a 6.05 ERA (37 er in 55.0 ip) in 11 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 3.60 ERA (16 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA (36 er in 45.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 7.56 ERA (35 er in 41.2 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in eight starts in Oakland compared to 3-4 with a 3.50 ERA (17 er in 43.2 ip) and five home runs allowed in seven starts on the road. has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at home (Teheran, ATL 7.07).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-4 with a 7.50 ERA (25 er in 30.0 ip) and .346 (44-for-127) opponents batting average in six starts against American League West competition compared to 4-4 with a 4.39 ERA (27 er in 55.1 ip) and .221 (44-for-199) opponents average in 10 starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .310 (26-for-84) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position ... 10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 13 of his 19 career home runs...nine of his 15 home runs have been allowed the first time through the lineup...seven have come in the second inning, which is tied for the most in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked 38 batters in 85.1 innings this year (4.01 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has allowed 14 home runs in his last 11 starts (58.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has received 10 runs of support in his eight losses (40.1 ip, 2.23 RSA) and 19 runs of support in his five wins (30.1 ip, 5.64 RSA).

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (9.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) and .188 (6-for-32) opponents batting average...originally developed a blister during his start on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and missed a turn in the rotation before making his next start July 3, also against the White Sox.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9...that began a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...walked a career-high five batters in a career-low 3.2 innings in a no decision on July 30 against Minnesota.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs... went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman ... entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)... then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

RHP Chris Smith (0-1, 4.82 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fifth start of the season...started in each of his first four outings before pitching in relief in his last outing last Thursday at San Francisco (4.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...the starts are the first of his career...has surrendered four of his five home runs to right-handed hitters...has held the opposition to a .122 batting average with two strikes...has a .300 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 the second time and .167 after that.. is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (4.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances against Baltimore, both in relief...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team
