OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-64) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (56-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a two-game series by Seattle to start the homestand and have now lost four of the last six games...are 50-64 (.439), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 114 games and is the worst since the 1997 club was 43-71...are 14 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 15 (44-59 on July 28)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 76 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in their last five games and have a Major League leading 95 errors for the season...that is two short of their season total of 97 from last year...the errors have led to a ML leading 70 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 84 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 86)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is second fewest in the AL (NYY, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .275 (110-for-400) with 62 runs scored over the last 11 games (5.6 runs per game)...are hitting .239 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...are tied for second in the American League in extra base hits (378), rank third in doubles (211) and fourth in walks (403)...however, have the second most strikeouts (1062)...home runs have accounted for 239 of the A's 498 runs (48.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.216), two hitters (.203) and outfielders (.232)...have the second lowest average with runners in scoring position (.230).

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Smith is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season tonight, giving the A's nine pitchers with five or more starts...that is the most in the American League and tied with Cincinnati for second most in the majors (Miami, 10)...A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in 10 of the last 12 games and have tossed fewer than four innings five times over that stretch...are 3-4 with a 7.11 ERA (45 er in 57.0 ip) and .332 (82-for-247) opponents batting average over that span and 35-45 with a 4.66 ERA (325 er in 628.0 ip) for the season...are tied with the Orioles for the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 53) but have surrendered the fewest home runs (84).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six or more runs in six of the eight games in August...have a 5.58 ERA (44 er in 71.0 ip) this month, which is third highest in the American League...have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the AL...lead the AL in wild pitches (62) and have allowed the second most doubles (212).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games)...are 31-27 (.534) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...have hit 88 home runs at home, which is second most by an A's team over the last 13 years (92 in 2012)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 10-6-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 22-22 (.500) record during day games compared to 28-42 (.400) at night...are batting .267 (409-for-1531) and are averaging 5.00 runs per game during the day (220 runs in 44 games), .220 (506-for-2296) and 3.97 runs per games at night (278 runs in 70 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (TEX, .243) while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

CLOSE CALLS: Over the last 18 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is tied for second most in the

American League (TB, 33)...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (5)...are tied for the AL lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and tied for third in losses when leading (7) after seven innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...are 4-6 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for second in the AL...are 14-16 in one-run games and are tied for third in the AL in one-run losses.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 154 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 243 and ATL, 204).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-30 (.362) against American League West competition compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have a run differential of -94, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 45 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...have a 4-9 record following a day off, which is the second worst record in the majors (STL, 4-13)...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's and Orioles meet for the first time in 2017 tonight...Oakland has already finished the season series with six American League teams...the A's won the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 9-11 (.450) against the Orioles over the previous three years...however, are 93-55 (.628) over the previous 18 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 260-261 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 131-133 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 996-941 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has homered in three straight games for the third time in his career (May 26-28, 2014 and Aug. 12-14, 2016)...has never homered in four straight...ranks third in the American League in RBI (80) and tied for fourth in home runs (31) and extra base hits (53)...**Ryon Healy** is batting .371 (33-for-89) with seven home runs against left-handed pitchers compared to .224 (73-for-326) with 14 home runs against right-handers...leads the AL in slugging against left-handed pitchers (.685) and ranks fourth in batting and OPS (1.077)...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .318 (14-for-44) with nine walks (.434 on-base percentage) and just one strikeout in 53 plate appearances over his last 12 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972**, in a game completed the next day, the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in 19 innings...the game was suspended after 17 innings and ended the next day when Joe Rudi hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the 19th...in **1976** Joe Rudi singles for his 1000th career hit in the A's 2-1 victory over Milwaukee...in **1985** Dave Kingman hits his 400th career home run in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle...in **2009** Mark Ellis is a perfect 5 for 5 and drives in four runs in the A's 9-1 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-1, 4.82 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and fifth start of the season... started in each of his first four outings before pitching in relief in his last outing...the starts are the first of his career...his only career win came in his second career outing over nine years ago on June 24, 2008 with Boston against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered four of his five home runs to right-handed hitters...has not allowed a hit to the clean-up hitter (0-for-11)...has held the opposition to a .122 (6-for-49) batting average with two strikes...has a .300 (12-for-40) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (10-for-40) the second time and .167 (5-for-30) after that...opponents are 9-for-26 (.346) with two walks, three doubles and two home runs when leading off an inning (.393 on-base percentage, .692 slugging percentage).

AGE AT FIRST START: His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle July 8... the A's scored single runs in the second and third innings but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Segura RBI double and a Gamel RBI single...Oakland scored a run in the top of the fifth but he allowed a leadoff home run to Dyson in the bottom of the fifth...left after six innings with the score tied 3-3.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay July 18 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...the A's scored two runs in the first inning but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second and a Souza lead off home run in the third...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and left with a 3-2 lead...Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto July 24...Oakland scored a run in the first inning but he gave that run back in the bottom of the first on a solo home run by Martin...allowed two more runs in the fourth inning on RBI singles by Carrera and Goins...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-2.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Minnesota on July 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven hits and matched his career high by allowing four runs...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Granite in the second inning...surrendered a two-run home run to Sano in the fifth and left after five innings trailing 4-2.

LAST APPEARANCE: He pitched in relief in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco a week ago today...tossed the final four innings and allowed a career-high tying four runs...started the bottom of the fifth inning with the A's trailing 7-1 and allowed four runs on a Parker RBI double and a Blach three-run home run...blanked the Giants on two hits and a walk over the final three innings.

SMITH vs. BALTIMORE: Is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (4.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief...his last outing was last year in Oakland on Aug. 11 (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...allowed two runs in the seventh inning on a Jones home run and an Alvarez RBI single...his other outing came on Sept. 2, 2008 at Boston when he retired the side in order in the seventh inning in a 14-2 win (1.0 ip).

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers... issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...the Sounds were 6-6 in his starting assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA in five games, including four starts, in April...struck out a season-high eight batters and allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings at Round Rock May 4 but yielded just two runs and was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 5-4 victory...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...tossed the final two innings of the Sounds 13-3 win (2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha (2.0 ip, 2 so)...moved back into the starting rotation May 28...finished May 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA in five games, including three starts...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...matched his season-high with eight strikeouts on the 2nd... then combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts...pitched on June 19 against New Orleans to completed the suspended game of April 30...tossed all six innings on the 19th but allowed one run in the sixth inning in a 1-0 loss...finished June with a 2-0 record and a 2.42 ERA in four starts.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...with Nashville, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average (.239), sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA (3.93)...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2).

RHP Paul Blackburn (3-1, 2.60 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...has tossed more than five innings in each of his seven career starts, walked one batter or fewer five times and allowed one run or fewer four times...opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-11 (.091) with RISP and two outs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, when combined with Dull, Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team.

- Has converted 22-of-41 (53.7%) save opportunities, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...are tied for second in blown saves (19) and have the third fewest saves.
- Has the second highest ERA in the AL (DET, 5.11).
- Is tied for fewest inherited runners (145) in the AL.
- Is tied for first in the AL in stolen bases allowed (41), ranks fourth in fewest wins (15) and most losses (19) and fifth in most home runs allowed (55).
- Has allowed just eight first batter home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (KC, 4)...has the second lowest first batter slugging percentage (.342).

- His last six outings have come in non-save situations and he has not allowed a run over that span (5.1 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...was 1-2 with two saves, three blown saves and an 8.53 ERA over his previous eight outings.
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in blown saves (6), ranks second in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for fifth in stolen bases allowed (8) and tied for 10th in saves (16).
- Opponents are 8-for-44 (.182) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 5.50 ERA (11 er in 18.0 ip) and has surrendered all five of his home runs in 20 games on the road...has a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in 25 games in Oakland.
- Has faced the Orioles seven times in his career (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 2 hr, 6.00 ERA).
