OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-65) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (57-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and five of the last seven games to fall a season-low tying 15 games under .500 for the second time this year (44-59 on July 28)...are 50-65 (.435), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 115 games and is the worst since the 1997 club was 44-71... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 77 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 12 errors in the last 16 games and those 12 errors have led to 16 unearned runs...have a Major League leading 96 errors for the season, which is one short of the season total of 97 from last year...also have a ML leading 72 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 84 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 87)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is second fewest in the AL (NYY, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .270 (117-for-433) with 64 runs scored over the last 12 games (5.3 runs per game)...are hitting .239 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...are tied for second in the American League in extra base hits (381), rank third in doubles (214) and fourth in walks (408)...home runs have accounted for 239 of the A's 500 runs (47.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.215), two hitters (.204) and outfielders (.233)...have the second lowest average with runners in scoring position (.228).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out 10 times last night, which marks the 57th time this year they have fanned at least 10 times in a game...the Oakland record is 59 in 2012...have 1072 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1122) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1145)...the strikeout total is already the 15th highest single season total in Athletics history (14th is 1094 in 2011, record is 1387 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Smith allowed four home runs last night after Jharel Cotton surrendered three the day before...started have allowed nine home runs in the last four games but just 88 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...starters have allowed four runs or more in 11 of the last 13 games and have tossed fewer than four innings five times over that stretch...are 3-5 with a 7.14 ERA (50 er in 63.0 ip) and .327 (89-for-272) opponents batting average over that span and 35-46 with a 4.68 ERA (330 er in 634.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 53).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six or more runs in seven of the nine games in August for a 5.51 ERA (49 er in 80.0 ip)...the ERA is second highest in the American League (KC, 6.38)...have a 4.67 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (62) and doubles allowed (216).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a four-game home losing streak and are now 9-15 over the last 24 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35... are 0-3 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (0-1) and Kansas City (three games)...are 31-28 (.525) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...have hit 88 home runs at home, which is second most by an A's team over the last 13 years (92 in 2012)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 10-6-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 22-22 (.500) record during day games compared to 28-43 (.394) at night...are batting .267 (409-for-1531) and are averaging 5.00 runs per game during the day (220 runs in 44 games), .220 (513-for-2329) and 3.94 runs per games at night (280 runs in 71 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PHI, .242) while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

CLOSE CALLS: Over the last 19 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is tied for second most in the American League (TB, 33)...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (5)...are tied for the AL lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and tied for third in losses when leading (7) after seven innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...are 4-6 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for second in the AL...are 14-16 in one-run games and are tied for third in the AL in one-run losses.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 155 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 244 and ATL, 204).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-30 (.362) against American League West competition compared to 33-35 (.485) against everyone else...have a run differential of -99, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 46 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...have a 4-9 record following a day off, which is the second worst record in the majors (STL, 4-13)...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 with the Orioles last night...Oakland has already finished the season series with six American League teams...the A's won the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 9-12 (.429) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 93-56 (.624) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 260-262 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 131-134 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 996-942 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks third in the American League in RBI (80), tied for fourth in home runs (31) and extra base hits (53), tied for ninth in games played (112) and 10th in total bases (216)...**Rajai Davis** leads the majors with nine stolen bases since the All-Star Break...**Jed Lowrie** had his sixth two-double game of the season last night and the 19th of his career...now has 35 doubles for the season, which is the most in the AL and tied for the most in the majors (Murphy, WAS)... is batting .333 (16-for-48) with nine walks (1 sf, .431 on-base percentage) and just one strikeout in 57 plate appearances over his last 13 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1920** the A's score 10 times in the seventh inning to defeat Detroit 13-4...In **1978** Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...In **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (3-1, 2.60 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...has tossed more than five innings in each of his seven career starts...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss more than five innings in each of his first seven career games...joins Willie Adams, A.J. Griffin and Bill Krueger...only Adams did it in more than seven games and he had 10...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his seven starts and walked one batter or fewer five times.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-11 (.091) with RISP and two outs...is 3-0 with a 1.95 ERA (6 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 0-1 with a 3.63 ERA (7 er in 17.1 ip) in his other three starts...has a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 14.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 3.48 (12 er in 31.0 ip) from the third inning on...has issued 8 of his 11 walks to lefties...allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it.

2017 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 4-3 A's loss to Atlanta **July 1** in Oakland...became the 51st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and it came in the second inning...retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...earned his first Major League win in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle on **July 6**...tossed 7.2 innings, which are the most by an A's pitcher in one of his first two games since Brad Rigby tossed 8.0 innings in his first start on June 28, 1997 against Texas...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger...had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Cleveland **July 15** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 3-2...was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 7-5 loss at New York (NL) **July 21**...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed two of the Mets three runs in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Toronto **July 26**...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer while tossing seven or more scoreless innings in one of the first five games of his career (Doug Johns, Aug. 25, 1995)...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 victory over San Francisco **July 31** in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Posey in the first inning, two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Hwang and Moncrief, and two in the seventh inning when he left with runners on first and third and one out and the bullpen allowed both runs to score.

LAST START: He combined with Dull, Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...has won back-to-back games for the first time in his career...tossed 6.2 innings and yielded five of the hits...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the Pacific Coast League Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents

average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs (also May 14 against Albuquerque) on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado Springs...finished May 2-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...walked a season-high four batters June 15 against Iowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.
