OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-65) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (57-59)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak last night but have lost five of the last eight games...are 51-65 (.440), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 116 games and is the worst since the 2015 club was also 51-65...the 14 games under .500 are one short of the season low of 15 (twice, last: 50-65 on Aug. 10)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 78 days in fifth place for the season.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 12 errors in the last 17 games and those 12 errors have led to 16 unearned runs...have a Major League leading 96 errors for the season, which is one short of the season total of 97 from last year...also have a ML leading 72 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 84 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 87)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is second fewest in the AL (NYY, 13).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .272 (135-for-497) with 72 runs scored (5.1 per game) and 60 extra base hits (4.3 per game...42 doubles, a triple, 17 home runs) over the last 14 games...are hitting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...however, rank second in the American League in extra base hits (386), third in doubles (218) and fourth in walks (409)...home runs have accounted for 241 of the A's 505 runs (47.7%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out 12 times last night, which marks the 58th time this year they have fanned at least 10 times in a game...the Oakland record is 59 in 2012...have 1084 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1134) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1156)...the strikeout total is already the 15th highest single season total in Athletics history (14th is 1094 in 2011, record is 1387 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in 12 of the last 14 games and have tossed fewer than four innings five times over that stretch...are 3-5 with a 7.08 ERA (54 er in 68.2 ip) and .334 (99-for-296) opponents batting average over that span and 35-46 with a 4.70 ERA (334 er in 639.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 53)...have allowed 10 home runs in the last five games but just 89 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six or more runs in seven of the 10 games in August for a 5.36 ERA (53 er in 89.0 ip)...the ERA is second highest in the American League (KC, 6.41)...have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (62) and doubles allowed (218).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their four-game home losing streak last night and are now 10-15 over the last 25 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 1-3 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (1-1) and Kansas City (three games)...are 32-28 (.533) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...have hit 89 home runs at home, which is second most by an A's team over the last 13 years (92 in 2012)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 10-6-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 22-22 (.500) record during day games compared to 29-43 (.402) at night...are batting .267 (409-for-1531) and are averaging 5.00 runs per game during the day (220 runs in 44 games), .222 (523-for-2360) and 3.96 runs per games at night (285 runs in 72 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PIT, .242) while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's were trailing 4-3 entering the bottom of the eighth last night before scoring twice for a 5-4 win...it marked the ninth time this

year the A's won a game when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in losses when leading (7) after seven innings...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (5)...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...over the last 20 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is tied for third most in the AL.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 156 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 245 and ATL, 205).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 13-6 record on Saturday, which is second best in the majors (LAD, 15-3)...it is the only day of the week that the A's have a winning record...are 17-30 (.362) against American League West competition compared to 34-35 (.493) against everyone else...have a run differential of -98, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 35 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2017 after winning the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 10-12 (.455) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 94-56 (.627) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 261-262 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 132-134 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 997-942 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks third in the American League in RBI (81), tied for third in extra base hits (54) and tied for fourth in home runs (31)...**Rajai Davis** is batting .333 (21-for-63) with 10 stolen bases in 22 games since the All-Star Break after hitting .210 with 15 steals in 70 games before the break...is tied for the Major League lead in stolen bases since the break (Hamilton, CIN)...**Jed Lowrie** has back-to-back two double games for the second time this year (May 23-24 at Miami) and has five doubles in his last three games...leads the majors with 37 doubles for the season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Geronimo Berroa has his second three-homer game of the season in the A's 11-1 win over Minnesota...the two three-homer games tie a Major League record...Mark McGwire adds two home runs, giving him 40 for the season in just 294 at bats, the fewest at bats ever to 40 home runs...in **2001** Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his 1000th career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their 11th consecutive win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-6, 4.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start stretch from May 20 to July 16 and is 0-1 with a 6.63 ERA (14 er in 19.0 ip) and .360 (32-for-89) opponents batting average over his last four starts.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 4-0 with a 3.32 ERA (14 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts against American League East teams compared to 4-6 with a 4.54 ERA (41 er in 81.1 ip) in 15 starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.77 ERA (24 er in 57.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 4.50 ERA (31 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 starts on the road...is now 9-5 with a 3.33 ERA (52 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.74 ERA (65 er in 123.1 ip) in 22 starts on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 3.71 ERA (22 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.50 ERA (33 er in 66.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest...has allowed 10 of his 14 home runs on four days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Left-handed hitters are 19-for-56 (.339) against him over his last 11 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...opponents are 20-for-63 (.317) with runners in scoring position over his last eight starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...has a .145 (35-for-241) opponents batting average with two strikes, which is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has the fourth lowest batting average against the opponents number three hitter (.170) and the seventh lowest against the seven hitter (.178)...the two hitter is batting .392, which is second highest in the majors (Freeland, COL .393).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 16 runs in the second inning for a 6.86 ERA (16 er in 21.0 ip) and 15 in the sixth inning for an 8.56 ERA (13 er in 13.2 ip)...has a 2.76 ERA (26 er in 84.2 ip) in all other innings...the 15 runs in the sixth inning are tied for second most in the majors (Dickey, ATL 19).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fourth in the American League in pickoffs (3)...has eight wins, which surpasses his season total of seven from his rookie campaign last year...has walked 41, which is four more than last year...has allowed 63 runs, which is two fewer than last year (65).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-10 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...tossed just 3.1 innings, his second consecutive start of

fewer than four innings...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the first and a solo home run to Trout in the third...Oakland scored four times in the fourth inning to take a 4-2 lead, but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a two-run double by Graterol, a RBI single by Pennington and an error.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.
