### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-66) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (58-59)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost four of the last five games and six of the last nine and are a season-low tying 15 games under .500 for the third time this year (last: 50-65 on Aug. 10)...are 51-66 (.436), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 117 games and is the worst since the 2015 club was also 51-66...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 79 days in fifth place for the season.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 12 errors in the last 18 games and those 12 errors have led to 16 unearned runs...have a Major League leading 96 errors for the season, which is one short of the season total of 97 from last year...also have a ML leading 72 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 84 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 87)...A's outfielders had their first two-assist game of 2017 last night...have 17 assists for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .272 (145-for-533) with 77 runs scored (5.1 per game) and 64 extra base hits (4.3 per game...44 doubles, a triple, 19 home runs) over the last 15 games...are hitting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...however, rank second in the American League in extra base hits (390), third in doubles (220) and fourth in walks (413)...home runs have accounted for 244 of the A's 510 runs (47.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3).

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's struck out 11 times last night, which marks the 59th time this year they have fanned at least 10 times in a game...that matches the Oakland record set in 2012...have 1095 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1147) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1168)...it is also the 14th highest single season total in Athletics history (t-12th is 1104 in 1964 and 2014, record is 1387 in 2012).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in 13 of the last 15 games and have tossed fewer than four innings six times over that stretch...are 3-6 with a 7.83 ERA (60 er in 69.0 ip) and .347 (105-for-303) opponents batting average over that span and 35-47 with a 4.78 ERA (340 er in 640.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 53)...have allowed 10 home runs in the last five games but just 89 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed an Oakland record eight doubles last night, breaking the previous mark of seven (12 times, last: at Baltimore, Aug. 16, 2015)...the doubles were the most yielded by an A's team since the Kansas City A's allowed eight on June 30, 1966, also against the Orioles...have surrendered 226 doubles for the season, which is second most in the American League (TOR, 231)...allowed a season-high tying 20 hits last night (also June 2 vs. Washington)...have allowed six runs or more in eight of the 11 games in August for a 5.97 ERA (65 er in 98.0 ip)...the ERA is second highest in the AL (KC, 6.20)...have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...are tied for the most wild pitches (63).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-4 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (1-2) and Kansas City (three games)...are 10-16 over the last 26 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 32-29 (.525) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...have hit 91 home runs at home, which is second most by an A's team over the last 13 years (92 in 2012)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 10-6-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 22-22 (.500) record during day games compared to 29-44 (.397) at night...are batting .267 (409-for-1531) and are averaging 5.00 runs per game during the day (220 runs in 44 games), .222 (533-for-2396) and 3.97 runs per games at night (290 runs in 73 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PIT, .242) while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time

a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are tied for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings (KC) but are tied for fourth in losses when leading (7) after seven innings...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (5)...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...over the last 21 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is fourth most in the AL.

**(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE:** The A's have gone an Athletics record 156 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 246 and ATL, 206).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 17-30 (.362) against American League West competition compared to 34-36 (.486) against everyone else...have a run differential of -105, which is the lowest in the AL and tied with San Francisco for second lowest in the majors (SD, -153)...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 41 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. ORIOLES:** The A's have lost two of three to start the season series after winning the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 10-13 (.435) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 94-57 (.623) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 261-263 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 132-135 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 997-943 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads American League rookies in doubles (10) and home runs (7) since the All-Star Break and ranks second in RBI (16)...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the AL in home runs (32), RBI (83) and extra base hits (55)...**Rajai Davis** is batting .333 (21-for-63) with 10 stolen bases in 22 games since the All-Star Break after hitting .210 with 15 steals in 70 games before the break...is tied for the Major League lead in stolen bases since the break (Hamilton, CIN)...**Jed Lowrie** has five doubles in his last four games and leads the majors with 37 for the season.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in **1989** Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2005** Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-3, 4.97 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 0-1 with a 12.27 ERA (10 er in 7.1 ip) and .405 (15-for-37) opponents batting average in two starts since his return...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-0 with a 3.07 ERA (10 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.20 ERA (20 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 8-10 with a 3.59 ERA (71 er in 178.0 ip) in 29 starts in Oakland compared to 10-13 with a 4.85 ERA (96 er in 178.0 ip) in 32 starts on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) and .229 (22-for-96) opponents batting average in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-3 with a 6.83 ERA (22 er in 29.0 ip) and .328 (39-for-119) opponents average in six starts on five days rest or more.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed 12 of his 31 runs in the first inning for a 10.80 ERA (12 er in 10.0 ip)...has a 3.65 ERA (18 er in 44.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .364 (16-for-44) in the first inning, .263 (45-for-171) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked two batters or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...has issued 10 of his 16 walks this year and 69 of his 101 walks in his career to left-handed hitters...has surrendered five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have come with runners on base...has a .315 (17-for-54) opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is scheduled to make just his second start in a day game today...has nine starts at night...went 0-1 with a 5.48 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

**REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made his first rehab start July 19 at Iowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

**2017 START-BY-START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day **April 3** in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **April 8**...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on **April 14** in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 27**...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota **May 3**...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a two-run single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5-3 but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **May 8** in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas **May 14**...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save

and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss...had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Boston **May 19** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the fourth inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired the side in order in the first inning but that was his only 1-2-3 inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco Aug. 3...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 2.0 innings...yielded four runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Posey and Crawford and a RBI double by Parker...surrendered three more runs in the second on a Jones RBI single and a Belt two-run home run...was relieved by Castro to start the third with the A's trailing 7-0.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 10-inning loss to Seattle on Tuesday in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters and had a 3-0 lead when he was charged with an unearned run in the third inning...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Dyson RBI single in the fourth and a 6-2 lead when he allowed a two-run double to Gamel in the sixth...left after 5.2 innings with a 6-4 lead but the pen allowed single runs in the seventh and eighth innings for the blown save.

**GRAVEMAN vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 1-2 with a 7.08 ERA (20.1 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 16 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 6 hr) in six career appearances, including four starts...is 0-2 with a 16.20 ERA (12 er in 6.2 ip) in three games, two starts, at Camden Yards and 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA (4 er in 13.2 ip) in three games, two starts, in his home ballparks...

went 1-1 with a 6.52 ERA (9.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two starts last year...the loss came in an 11-3 decision at Baltimore May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the bottom of the first...allowed back-to-back home runs to Alvarez and Schoop in the second and a two-run home run to Trumbo in the third...left after 2.2 innings trailing 6-2...then picked up the victory in a 3-2 A's win on Aug. 8 in Oakland...allowed a single to Jones to start the game but then retired each of the next seven batters before loading the bases on three consecutive one out singles in the third inning...Machado followed with a sacrifice fly but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

**2016 RECAP:** Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader by, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Jharel Cotton (5-9, 5.72 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA and .328 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...has allowed five home runs in 14.2 innings...has a 5.72 ERA overall, which is third highest among all AL pitchers with a minimum of 90 innings pitched...is 3-2 with a 3.34 ERA in six starts against American League Central teams compared to 2-7 with a 7.02 ERA in 11 starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Seattle on Wednesday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 3 hr)...is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 0 hr) in two career starts against the Royals, both at Kansas City...the win came in his only start this year when he combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City on April 10 (7.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 6 so).
