OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-66) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (59-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games but have lost six of the last 10...are 52-66 (.441), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 118 games...were also 52-66 after 118 games last year...are 14 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 15 (three times, last: 51-66 on Aug. 12)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 80 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone errorless in their last three games but have a Major League leading 96 errors for the season...that is one short of the season total of 97 from last year...the A's last 12 errors have led to 16 unearned runs and Oakland has a ML leading 72 unearned runs for the season...that is the most by an A's team since 2011 (82)...have allowed 84 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 88)...have 17 outfield assists, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (153-for-565) with 86 runs scored (5.4 per game) and 69 extra base hits (4.3 per game...46 doubles, 1 triple, 22 home runs) over the last 16 games...are hitting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .234)...however, rank second in the American League in extra base hits (395), third in doubles (222) and fourth in walks (415)...home runs have accounted for 250 of the A's 519 runs (48.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 1102 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1159) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1178)...it is the 14th time in Athletics history they have fanned 1100 or more times in a season...are on pace for 1512, which would break the franchise record of 1387 set in 2012...have 59 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which ties the Athletics record set in 2012.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in 13 of the last 16 games and have tossed fewer than four innings six times over that stretch...are 4-6 with a 7.34 ERA (62 er in 76.0 ip) and .343 (113-for-329) opponents batting average over that span and 36-47 with a 4.76 ERA (342 er in 647.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 54)...have allowed 10 home runs in the last six games but just 89 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.72 ERA (68 er in 107.0 ip) in August, which is second highest in the American League (KC, 5.95)...now have a 4.71 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...allowed 24 extra base hits in the four games against Baltimore, which set an Oakland record for extra base hits allowed in a four-game series...have yielded 394 extra base hits for the season, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the AL...surrendered an Oakland record eight doubles on Saturday and have allowed 228 doubles for the season, which is second most in the AL (TOR, 231)...have 63 wild pitches, which is tied for the AL lead and is sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (three games)...are 11-16 over the last 27 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 33-29 (.532) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League...have hit 94 home runs at home, which is second most in the AL (NYY, 96) and the most by an A's team since 2004 (100)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's play every game in California...leave on Thursday for a six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Baltimore (three games)...that begins a stretch where the A's will play 12 of 15 games on the road...are 10-6-4 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 23-22 (.511) record during day games compared to 29-44 (.397) at night...are batting .267 (417-for-1563) and are averaging 5.09 runs per game during the day (229 runs in 45 games), .222 (533-for-2396) and 3.97 runs per games at night (290 runs in 73 games)...

the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PIT, .242) while the day batting average is fifth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings (KC) but are tied for fourth in losses when leading (7) after seven innings...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (5)...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...over the last 22 games, the A's have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4) but have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win three times (3,5,5)...have 31 losses in games in which they have led, which is fourth most in the AL.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 157 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 247 and ATL, 207).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 16-9 (.640) against American League Central teams, which is the best record by any AL team against the Central...have a run differential of -99, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 22 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-14 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...Smolinski is currently on a rehab assignment...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's won two of three at Kansas City in April to open the season series...won the first two games to extend their winning streak against the Royals to eight games...that was the second longest winning streak in Oakland history against the Royals...won the season series last year, 6-1...it was their first season series win since 2013...went 4-0 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...are 16-13 against Kansas City over the last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 316-261 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 145-146 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads American League rookies in doubles (10), home runs (8) and RBI (19) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the AL in home runs (32), RBI (83) and extra base hits (55), tied for eighth in games played (115) and tied for ninth in total bases (223)...**Rajai Davis** is batting .333 (21-for-63) with 10 stolen bases in 23 games since the All-Star Break after hitting .210 with 15 steals in 70 games before the break...leads the AL and ranks second in the majors in stolen bases since the break...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in doubles (37)...is batting .300 (18-for-60) with nine walks and just two strikeouts in 70 plate appearances over his last 16 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (5-9, 5.72 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) and .328 (20-for-61) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...has allowed five home runs in 14.2 innings...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (78) and innings pitched (91.1), third in games started (17) and tied for fourth in wins (5)...has a 5.72 ERA, which is third highest among all AL pitchers with a minimum of 90 innings pitched...is tied for second among all AL pitchers in balks (2), tied for sixth in unearned runs (9) and tied for 10th in losses (9)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-2 with a 3.34 ERA (12 er in 32.1 ip) in six starts against American League Central teams compared to 2-7 with a 7.02 ERA (46 er in 59.0 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else...is 3-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 er in 38.0 ip) in seven career starts against AL Central competition.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-5 with a 7.74 ERA (41 er in 47.2 ip) and 13 home runs allowed in nine starts in Oakland compared to 3-4 with a 3.50 ERA (17 er in 43.2 ip) and five home runs allowed in seven starts on the road...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at home (Teheran, ATL 7.07)...the highest home ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 40 or more innings at home is 7.46 by Mark Redman in 2004.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-6 with a 7.38 ERA (32 er in 39.0 ip) and .341 (56-for-164) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 4-3 with a 4.47 ERA (26 er in 52.1 ip) and .213 (40-for-188) opponents batting average in nine starts during the day...has the third highest night ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at night...is tied for ninth in the AL in day wins...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-6 with a 6.05 ERA (37 er in 55.0 ip) in 11 career starts at night, 6-3 with a 3.84 ERA (28 er in 65.2 ip) in 11 starts during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-3 with a 4.30 ERA (22 er in 46.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA (36 er in 45.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .315 (28-for-89) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...11 of the 18 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 14 of his 22 career home runs...10 of his 18 home runs have been allowed the first time through the lineup...seven have come in the second inning, which is tied for second most in the AL (Nolasco, LAA 8).

THIS AND THAT: Has walked 39 batters in 91.1 innings this year (3.841 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has allowed 17 home runs in his last 12 starts (64.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has received 13 runs of support in his nine losses (46.1 ip, 2.53 RSA) and 19 runs of support in his five wins (30.1 ip, 5.64 RSA).

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (9.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) and .188 (6-for-32) opponents batting average...originally developed a blister during his start on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and missed a turn in the rotation before making his next start July 3, also against the White Sox.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9...that began a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister

after tossing 66 pitches...walked a career-high five batters in a career-low 3.2 innings in a no decision on July 30 against Minnesota.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs and all six Mariners runs came on home runs...yielded a three-run home run to Segura in the first inning, a two-run home run to Cruz in the third and a solo home run to Cruz in the fifth.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Smith (0-2, 5.29 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and sixth start of the season...the starts are the first of his career...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-1 with a 7.80 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in three games (two starts) since then...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss to Baltimore last Thursday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a career-high four home runs and has surrendered at least one home run in each of his six games (9 hr in 34.0 ip)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 1 bb, 4 so) in two career appearances against the Royals, both in relief at Kansas City...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion.

- Has the second highest ERA in the AL (DET, 5.14).
