OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-68) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (74-47)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-3 over the last six games and 9-9 over the last 18 contests...are a season-low tying 15 games under .500 for the fourth time in the last eight games and the fifth time this year...are 53-68 (.438), which is the second worst record in the American League and tied for seventh worst in Oakland history after 121 games...however, it is one game better than each of the previous two seasons...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 83 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 17-30 (.362) against the American League West compared to 36-38 (.486) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .225 (350-for-1558) and are averaging 4.00 runs per game against the AL West (188 runs in 47 games) compared to .251 and 4.72 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 98 errors, which marks the 10th consecutive season they have made 97 or more errors...have made at least 100 errors in five of the previous eight seasons...also led the majors with 73 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (89), tied for second in most passed balls (13), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (17) and tied for fourth in most double plays turned (121).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .273 (184-for-674) with 104 runs scored (5.5 per game) and 81 extra base hits (4.3 per game)...52 doubles, 2 triples, 27 home runs) over the last 19 games...are hitting .241 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...however, are tied for second in extra base hits (407) and rank third in doubles (228)...home runs have accounted for 258 of the A's 537 runs (48.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out 14 times on Wednesday, which was their Athletics record 60th game with 10 or more strikeouts (previous: 59 in 2012)...now have 1131 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1184) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1198)...it is seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1145 in 2016).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in 15 of the last 19 games and have tossed four innings or fewer seven times over that stretch...are 4-7 with a 7.29 ERA (74 er in 91.1 ip) and .338 (132-for-391) opponents batting average over that span and 36-48 with a 4.81 ERA (354 er in 662.1 ip) for the season...are tied with Baltimore for the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 55), but have allowed 91 home runs, which is tied with Houston and Toronto for the fewest.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.91 ERA (88 er in 134.0 ip) in August, which is third highest in the American League...now have a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in most doubles (231) and tied for third in extra base hits (402)...have 65 wild pitches, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...it is sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied with Baltimore for the most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: After playing 19 consecutive games in California (including 14 in Oakland), the A's begin a stretch tonight where they will play 12 of their next 15 games on the road...that starts with this six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Baltimore (three games)...are 19-37 (.339) on the road compared to 34-31 (.523) in Oakland...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 20-42/.323)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...went 3-2 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: Over the last 25 games, the A's have come back from deficits of three or more runs to win four times (3,5,5,4) but have blown leads of three or more runs in a loss four times (5,3,4,4)...have 32 losses in games in which they have led, which is tied for fourth most in the Ameri-

can League...are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (9) but are tied for fourth in losses when leading after seven innings (7)...are tied for the AL lead in losses when leading after eight innings (5) but are tied for third in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's have gone an Athletics record 161 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...broke the previous mark of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 251 and ATL, 211).

ROSTER NOTES: On Wednesday, Chris Hatcher became the 27th player to pitch for the A's this year, which is tied for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set in 2015...Hatcher is the 50th player to wear an Oakland uniform, which marks the third straight season the A's have used 50 or more players...the 50 players used are tied with the Yankees for third most in the American League (SEA 55, TOR 52)...have employed 74 different players over the last two years and 106 over the last three.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 23-23 (.500) record during day games compared to 30-45 (.400) at night...have a run differential of -102, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 26 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-15 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-14...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 2-10 with seven games remaining...are 0-6 in Oakland and 2-4 in Houston...have lost 17 of their last 19 games to the Astros, including each of the last 10 in the Coliseum...the Coliseum losing streak is the A's second longest against any team (13, Baltimore, July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...are 17-33 (.340) against the Astros over the last three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have 15 blown saves in their last 55 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 48-46...are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-24 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads American League rookies in runs (19), doubles (11), home runs (9), RBI (21) and extra base hits (21) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** is tied for second in the AL in RBI (86), tied for third in extra base hits (56), tied for fourth in home runs (33) and tied for ninth in games played (118)...**Rajai Davis** leads the majors in stolen bases in August (7) and leads the AL in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead with 38 doubles (Ramirez, CLE)...**Marcus Semien** has an eight-game hitting streak (11-for-31, .355), which is one short of his career high.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson hits a two-run homer to break a 1-1 tie in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore...it is Henderson 744th run as an Athletic, most ever by an Oakland player...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 145th career home run in the Coliseum, breaking Reggie Jackson's Coliseum Career Home Run record...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo hits three home runs to account for all of the A's scoring in a 5-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-7, 4.59 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with a 9.31 ERA (20 er in 19.1 ip) and .400 (38-for-95) opponents batting average over his last five starts...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch.

LAST THREE STARTS: Has tossed fewer than four innings in each of his last three starts and has allowed 18 runs (13 er in 6.2 ip, 17.55 ERA) on 21 hits (45 ab, .512 opponents batting average) over that span...is the first A's starting pitcher to toss fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts over the course of one season since Miguel Jimenez did it from April 30-May 12, 1994...no pitcher in Oakland history has four straight starts of fewer than four innings without missing a turn in the rotation.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Left-handed hitters are 20-for-57 (.351) against him over his last 12 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...opponents are 24-for-67 (.358) with runners in scoring position over his last nine starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...has a .156 (38-for-244) opponents batting average with two strikes...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .185 (10-for-54) batting average but the two hitter has a .404 (21-for-52) average.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-5 with a 5.26 ERA (30 er in 51.1 ip) in 10 starts against American League West teams compared to 6-2 with a 4.08 ERA (31 er in 68.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-2 with a 7.52 ERA (22 er in 26.1 ip) and .358 (43-for-120) opponents batting average in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the break...has allowed six home runs in 26.1 innings since the break after yielding just eight in 93.1 innings before the break.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: Has allowed 34 of his 69 runs this year over the first two innings of his starts...has a 6.38 ERA (30 er in 42.1 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 2.88 (18 er in 56.1 ip) over innings three through five and an 8.56 ERA (13 er in 13.2 ip) in the sixth inning...has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (7.1 ip)...last year, he allowed just nine runs in the first inning and second inning (1.29 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fifth in the American League in pickoffs (3)...has eight wins, which surpasses his season total of seven from his rookie campaign last year...has also surpassed his totals from his rookie campaign of 2016 in runs (69) and walks (42).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-5 loss to Baltimore last Saturday in Oakland...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings...six of the runners scored and he recorded his only out when Schoop was thrown out at the plate trying to score from first on a Jones double...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit or walk (8, Blake Stein on Aug. 31, 1998; 7, Craig Minetto on July 4, 1979; 7, Ken Holtzman on June 30, 1972).

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-2 with a 2.13 ERA (38.0 ip, 29 h, 12 r, 9 er, 18 bb, 37 so, 1 hr) and .207 (29-for-140) opponents batting average in seven career starts...is 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland, 1-1 with a 0.00 ERA (1 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts in Houston...is 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA (16.2 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 5 er, 10 bb, 17 so, 0 hr) in three starts

this year...the no decision came in a 0-6 A's loss in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss...the loss come in a 5-1 decision in Oakland on June 21...blanked the Astros on two hits and two walks over the first five innings before allowing three runs in the sixth on a two-run single by Gattis and a RBI single by Marisnick...left after six innings trailing 3-0...then picked up the win in the A's 6-4 victory at Houston June 27...allowed nine hits and walked three batters in 5.2 innings but allowed just one run...had a 1-0 lead when Springer scored on a Gattis grounded into double play in the fifth inning...Ryon Healy hit a grand slam in the sixth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (3-3, 4.70 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 1-1 with a 7.53 ERA and .359 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder twice (April 15-26 and May 26-Aug. 2)...is 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA in four starts against everyone else...is 1-3 with a 7.20 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 2.97 ERA in six starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-3 A's win over Baltimore last Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 3-2 with a 4.14 ERA (41.1 ip, 41 h, 20 r, 19 er, 10 bb, 14 so, 6 hr) in seven career starts against Houston...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-2 A's loss in Oakland on April 14 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so).

- The A's bullpen has converted just 4-of-12 (33.3%) save opportunities over the last 28 games...is 23-for-43 (53.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the third fewest saves and is tied for third in blown saves (20).
- Has a 3.91 ERA (49 er in 112.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.28).
