OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-69) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (75-47)

SATURDAY, AUGUST 19, 2017 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 6:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games to fall to a season-low 16 games under .500...are 9-10 over the last 19 contests and 53-69 (.434) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 122 games and matches their record from each of the previous two seasons...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 84 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 99 errors, which marks the 10th consecutive season they have made 97 or more errors...have made at least 100 errors in five of the previous eight seasons...also lead the majors with 73 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (90), tied for second in most passed balls (13) and fewest outfield assists (17) and tied for fourth in most double plays turned (121).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .268 (189-for-704) with 105 runs scored (5.3 per game) and 83 extra base hits (4.2 per game...53 doubles, 2 triples, 28 home runs) over the last 20 games...are hitting .241 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .235)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...however, rank third in the American League in extra base hits (409) and doubles (229).

HOME RUNS: Matt Joyce hit the A's 169th home run of the season last night, which ranks fifth in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...it is tied for the 16th highest single season total in Athletics history...home runs have accounted for 259 of the A's 538 runs (48.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3)

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have 1137 strikeouts, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1195)...it is seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1145 in 2016, 5th is 1159 in 2000)...have 60 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-8 with a 7.12 ERA (77 er in 97.1 ip) and .333 (138-for-415) opponents batting average over the last 21 games and 36-49 with a 4.81 ERA (357 er in 668.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 55), but have allowed 93 home runs, which is tied for third fewest.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.77 ERA (91 er in 142.0 ip) in August, which is third highest in the American League...now have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in most doubles (231) and tied for third in extra base hits (404)...have 66 wild pitches, which is the most in the majors and sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 17-31 (.354) against the American League West compared to 36-38 (.486) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .224 (355-for-1588) and are averaging 3.94 runs per game against the AL West (189 runs in 48 games) compared to .251 and 4.72 runs against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game road trip to Houston (0-1) and Baltimore (three games)...are 19-38 (.333) on the road compared to 34-31 (.523) in Oakland...are tied with the White Sox and Giants for the second worst road record in the majors (PHI .292)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's play 12 of 15 games on the road after playing 19 consecutive games in California (including 14 in Oakland)...went 3-2 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the American League lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in

the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's tossed their last complete game one year ago today at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...have gone an Athletics record 162 consecutive games without a complete game (previous: 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009)...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 252 and ATL, 212).

ROSTER NOTES: On Wednesday, Chris Hatcher became the 27th player to pitch for the A's this year, which is tied for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set in 2015...Hatcher is the 50th player to wear an Oakland uniform, which marks the third straight season the A's have used 50 or more players...the 50 players used are tied with the Yankees for third most in the American League (SEA 55, TOR 52)...have employed 74 different players over the last two years and 106 over the last three.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 13-7 record on Saturday, which is second best in the majors (LAD, 16-3)...it is the only day of the week that the A's have a winning record...have a 23-23 (.500) record during day games compared to 30-46 (.394) at night...have a run differential of -104, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 16 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 11-15 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-14...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...are currently 6-10 in August.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 2-11 with six games remaining...are 0-6 in Oakland and 2-5 in Houston...have lost 18 of their last 20 games to the Astros...have dropped 15 of the last 19 games at Minute Maid Park and have lost 10 in a row in the Coliseum...the Coliseum losing streak is the A's second longest against any team (13, Baltimore, July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...are 17-34 (.333) against the Astros over the last three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have 15 blown saves in their last 56 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...lead the all-time series 48-47...are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-25 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in extra base hits since the All-Star Break (22) and is tied for the lead in doubles (12)...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (21) and is tied for the lead in runs (19)...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for fifth in extra base hits (56) and tied for ninth in games played (119)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and leads the AL in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead with 38 doubles (Ramirez, CLE).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson hits a two-run homer to break a 1-1 tie in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore...it is Henderson 744th run as an Athletic, most ever by an Oakland player...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 145th career home run in the Coliseum, breaking Reggie Jackson's Coliseum Career Home Run record...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo hits three home runs to account for all of the A's scoring in a 5-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-3, 4.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 1-1 with a 7.53 ERA (12 er in 14.1 ip) and .359 (23-for-64) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (15 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 7.20 ERA (20 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts at home...in three seasons with the A's, he is 10-13 with a 4.85 ERA (96 er in 178.0 ip) in 32 starts on the road compared to 9-10 with a 3.55 ERA (73 er in 185.0 ip) in 30 starts in Oakland.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (10 er in 32.1 ip) and .244 (30-for-123) opponents batting average in five starts on four days rest compared to 1-3 with a 6.83 ERA (22 er in 29.0 ip) and .328 (39-for-119) opponents average in six starts on five days rest or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 33 runs in the first inning for a 10.64 ERA (13 er in 11.0 ip)...has a 3.40 ERA (19 er in 50.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .367 (18-for-49) in the first inning, .264 (51-for-193) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...has surrendered five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have come with runners on base...has a .328 (20-for-61) opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning but has just two walks in that situation...has a .330 (30-for-91) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .258 (39-for-151) after that...has allowed a .464 (13-for-28) opponents batting average to the opponents number three hitter.

THIS AND THAT: Has made nine of his 11 starts at night...went 0-1 with a 5.48 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Made his first rehab start July 19 at lowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day **April 3** in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **April 8**...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on **April 14** in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 27**...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota **May 3**...issued a career-high tying four walks...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **May 8** in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas **May 14**...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus

for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss...had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Boston **May 19** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the fourth inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired the side in order in the first inning but that was his only 1-2-3 inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco **Aug. 3**...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 2.0 innings...yielded four runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Posey and Crawford and a RBI double by Parker...surrendered three more runs in the second on a Jones RBI single and a Belt two-run home run...was relieved by Castro to start the third with the A's trailing 7-0...had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 10-inning loss to Seattle **Aug. 8** in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters and had a 3-0 lead when he was charged with an unearned run in the third inning...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Dyson RBI single in the fourth and a 6-2 lead when he allowed a two-run double to Gamel in the sixth...left after 5.2 innings with a 6-4 lead but the pen allowed single runs in the seventh and eighth innings for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 victory over Baltimore last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in 7.0 innings...allowed RBI singles to Schoop in the first and Davis in the second...then blanked the Orioles on three hits and a walk over his final five innings...the A's scored five times in the fourth inning to take the lead.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jharel Cotton (5-10, 5.83 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .326 opponents batting average in four starts since his return...has allowed six home runs in 20.2 innings...is tied for fourth in the American League in losses (10)...has a 5.83 ERA, which is fifth highest among all AL pitchers with a minimum of 90 innings pitched...is 0-3 with an 8.06 ERA and .327 opponents batting average over his last five starts, which is one short of the longest losing streak of his career (4, May 9 to June 13, 2017)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss to Kansas City last Monday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against the Astros...the loss came in his only start this year, a 9-4 decision at Houston April 28 (4.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has converted just 4-of-12 (33.3%) save opportunities over the last 29 games...is 23-for-43 (53.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the third fewest saves and is tied for third in blown saves (20).
