### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-70) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (76-47)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 20, 2017 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP JHAREL COTTON (5-10, 5.92) VS. RHP BRAD PEACOCK (10-1, 3.30) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and four of the last five games to fall to a season-low 17 games under .500...are 53-70 (.431) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 123 games and matches their record from each of the previous two seasons...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 85 days in fifth.

DOUBLE PLAYS: The A's grounded into an Oakland record-tying five double plays last night...it was the ninth time and the first time since May 12, 2006 at New York (AL)...Houston turned a total of six double plays, tying the Oakland record for most double plays by an opponent (May 14, 1971 at Kansas City)...the A's turned three double plays and now have 124 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...the nine double plays turned by both clubs ties the Oakland record set in the May 14, 1971 game against the Royals.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 99 errors, which marks the 10th consecutive season they have made 97 or more errors...have made at least 100 errors in five of the previous eight seasons...also lead the majors with 73 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (91), tied for second in most passed balls (13) and tied for fourth in fewest outfield assists (18).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored one run on 11 hits over the first two games of this series but are batting .266 (195-for-732) with 105 runs scored (5.0 per game) and 84 extra base hits (4.0 per game...54 doubles, 2 triples, 28 home runs) over the last 210 games...are hitting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .234)...have the fifth lowest onbase percentage (.313)...however, rank third in the American League in extra base hits (410) and doubles (230).

HOME RUNS: Matt Joyce hit the A's 169th home run of the season Friday night, which ranks sixth in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...it is tied for the 16th highest single season total in Athletics history...home runs have accounted for 259 of the A's 538 runs (48.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3)

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's have 1142 strikeouts, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1207) and seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1145 in 2016, 5th is 1159 in 2000)...have 60 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 6.88 ERA (79 er in 103.1 ip) and .330 (144-for-437) opponents batting average over the last 22 games and 36-50 with a 4.79 ERA (359 er in 674.1 ip) for the season... have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 56), but have allowed 93 home runs, which is tied for third fewest.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.64 ERA (94 er in 150.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the American League...now have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is also fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in most doubles (233) and fourth in extra base hits (407)...have 66 wild pitches, which is the most in the majors and sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 17-32 (.347) against the American League West compared to 36-38 (.486) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .223 (361-for-1616) and are averaging 3.86 runs per game against the AL West (189 runs in 49 games) compared to .251 and 4.72 runs against all other

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 23-23 (.500) record during day games compared to 30-47 (.390) at night...are batting .268 (429-for-1602) and are averaging 5.11 runs per game during the day (235 runs in 46 games), .223 (563-for-2524) and 3.94 runs per games at night (303 runs in 77 games)... the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PHI, .243) while the day batting average is sixth best.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Houston (0-2) and Baltimore (three games)...are 19-39 (.328) on the road com-

pared to 34-31 (.523) in Oakland...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 20-46/.303)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's play 12 of 15 games on the road after playing 19 consecutive games in California (including 14 in Oakland)...went 3-2 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-14-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the American League lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off

THIS AND THAT: Oakland has gone an Athletics record 163 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the A's have a run differential of -107, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)... are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 5 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 12-15 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-15...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...are currently 6-11 in August.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 2-12 with five games remaining...the A's most losses ever against Houston came last year when they went 6-13...are 0-6 in Oakland this year and 2-6 in Houston...have lost 19 of their last 21 games to the Astros...have dropped 16 of the last 20 games at Minute Maid Park and have lost 10 in a row in the Coliseum...the Coliseum losing streak is the A's second longest against any team (13, Baltimore, July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...are 17-35 (.327) against the Astros over the last three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have 15 blown saves in their last 57 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...the all-time series is now even at 48-48...the A's are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-26 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in extra base hits since the All-Star Break (22) and is tied for the lead in doubles (12)...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (21) and is tied for the lead in runs (19)... Khris Davis is tied for third in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for fifth in extra base hits (56) and tied for ninth in games played (120)... *Rajai Davis* is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and leads the AL in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)... Jed Lowrie ranks second in the AL in doubles (38)

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1959 Bob Cerv hits three home runs in Kansas City's 11-10 loss to Boston...in 1963 the A's sweep a doubleheader from Washington...Moe Drabowsky tosses a one-hit shutout in a 9-0 win in Game 1 and Jerry Lumpe hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14th inning of Game 2, a 7-5 victory...in 1987 Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record with three doubles, but the A's lose 7-6 to Toronto.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (5-10, 5.92 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-2 with an 8.27 ERA (19 er in 20.2 ip) and .326 (28-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...has allowed six home runs in 20.2 innings...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (80) and innings pitched (97.1), tied for second in games started (18) and tied for fifth in wins (5)...has a 5.83 ERA, which is sixth highest among all AL pitchers with a minimum of 90 innings pitched...is tied for second among all AL pitchers in balks (2), tied for fifth in losses (10) and unearned runs (10) and tied for eighth in wild pitches (8)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with an 8.06 ERA (23 er in 25.2 ip) and .327 (35-for-107) opponents batting average over his last five starts dating back to July 3...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four earlier this year from May 9 to June 13...is now 2-7 with a 6.44 ERA (46 er in 64.1 ip) over his last 12 starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-3 with a 4.47 ERA (26 er in 52.1 ip) and .213 (40for-188) opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 1-7 with a 7.40 ERA (37 er in 45.0 ip) and .339 (64-for-189) opponents batting average in nine starts at night...has the fourth highest night ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at night...is tied for ninth in the AL in day wins...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 12 career starts at night, 6-3 with a 3.84 ERA (28 er in 65.2 ip) in 11 starts during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-4 with a 3.50 ERA (17 er in 43.2 ip) and five home runs allowed in seven starts on the road compared to 2-6 with a 7.71 ERA (46 er in 53.2 ip) and 14 home runs allowed in 10 starts in Oakland...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at home (Teheran, ATL 6.98)...the highest home ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more innings at home is 7.46 by Mark Redman in 2004...ranks fifth in the American League in most home runs allowed at home.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-5 with a 7.75 ERA (31 er in 36.0 ip) and .340 (52-for-153) opponents batting average in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 4-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) and .232 (52-for-224) opponents average in 11 starts against everyone

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA (36 er in 45.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .323 (31-for-96) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...11 of the 19 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 14 of his 23 career home runs...10 of his 19 home runs have been allowed the first time through the lineup...seven have come in the second inning, which is tied for second most in the AL (Nolasco, LAA 8).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5... yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9...that began a career-high fourgame losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA and .188 opponents batting average before he was reinstated July 30...walked a career-high five batters in a career-low 3.2 innings in a no decision on July 30 against Minnesota...surrendered a

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss to Kansas City last Monday in Oakland...allowed six runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings for the second consecutive start...yielded a RBI single to Hosmer in the first and, after the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second on a wild pitch...then surrendered a grand slam to Gallagher in the sixth.

4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Gurriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 4-2 A's loss in Oakland on Sept. 19...retired 18 of the 20 batters he faced in his six innings of work...yielded a one-out home run to Gattis in the second inning and a two-out single to Correa in the fourth... left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save and Madson allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs... went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90  $\,$ pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)... then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Smith (0-2, 5.26 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and seventh start of the season...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-1 with a 7.08 ERA and .268 opponents batting average in four games (three starts) since then...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-8 A's win over Kansas City last Tuesday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 5 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against Baltimore...the start came in his only outing this year, a 7-2 A's loss in Oakland on Aug. 10 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 4 hr)...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion.

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

17-20, 4.65 ERA (213 er in 412.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 23-for-43 (53.5%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 4-of-12 (33.3%) save opportunities over the last 30 games...is 23-for-43 (53.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the third fewest saves and is tied for third in blown saves (20).
- Has a 3.86 ERA (50 er in 116.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.27).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (154), has the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.431) and the fourth most home runs (60)
- Ranks fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.364) against first batters faced...is tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (10).

### **64 RHP MICHAEL BRADY**
