OAKLAND ATHLETICS (54-70) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (60-64)

MONDAY, AUGUST 21, 2017 — ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday but have lost four of the last six games and eight of the last 12...are 16 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 17 (53-70 on Aug. 19)...are 54-70 (.435), which is the second worst record in the American League and tied for seventh worst in Oakland history after 124 games...it is one game better than the A's 124-game record from each of the previous two seasons...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 86 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 99 errors, which marks the 10th consecutive season with 97 or more errors...have made at least 100 errors in five of the previous eight seasons...also lead the majors with 73 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (92), tied for second in most passed balls (13), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (125).

OFFENSE: The A's scored three runs without an RBI yesterday at Houston...it was the first time in Oakland history the A's scored three or more runs without collecting an RBI...it was the 12th time in Oakland history the A's won a game without an RBI...hit .226 (21-for-93) with four runs scored in the three-game series at Houston...however, are batting .268 (205-for-767) with 108 runs scored (4.9 per game) and 85 extra base hits (3.9 per game...55 doubles, 2 triples, 28 home runs) over the last 22 games...are hitting .241 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.314)...however, rank third in extra base hits (411) and doubles (231).

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not homer yesterday but won, which marks just the fifth time this year they have won a game when going homerless...the wins are third fewest in the majors...Matt Joyce hit the A's 169th home run of the season Friday night, which matches the A's season total from last year...home runs have accounted for 259 of the A's 541 runs (47.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 1154 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1214) and sixth most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008, 1181 in 1997, 1178 in 2013, 1159 in 2000)...have 61 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers tossed at least six innings in all three games at Houston after pitching six innings or fewer in 15 of the previous 19 games...went 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) against the Astros but are 5-9 with a 6.63 ERA (81 er in 110.0 ip) and .322 (148-for-459) opponents batting average over the last 22 games...are 37-50 with a 4.77 ERA (361 er in 681.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 56) and fourth fewest strikeouts (525), but have allowed 94 home runs, which is tied for third fewest.

PITCHING: The A's are tied for the Major League lead in wild pitches (66)...rank second in the American League in most doubles (234)...the 66 wild pitches are sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (three games)...are 20-39 (.339) on the road compared to 34-31 (.523) in Oakland...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's play 12 of 15 games on the road after playing 19 consecutive games in California (including 14 in Oakland)...return home following the game Wednesday for a brief three-game homestand with Texas...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-14-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the American League lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have

set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 7-11 (.389) in August...went 12-14 in July, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 5.43 ERA (96 er in 159.0 ip) this August, which is fourth highest in the American League...the pitching staff has the fewest strikeouts in the majors (99) and the offense has the third most strikeouts in the AL (164)...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (40) and extra base hits (65).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 24-23 (.511) record during day games compared to 30-47 (.390) at night...are 18-32 (.360) against the American League West compared to 36-38 (.486) against everyone else...have gone an Athletics record 164 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...have a run differential of -106, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 10 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 12-15 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 20-15.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The season series is even at two games each as the two teams split a four-game series in Oakland earlier this month...the A's won the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have lost six of the last seven games at Camden Yards...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 11-13 (.458) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 95-57 (.625) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 262-263 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 133-135 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 998-943 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in extra base hits since the All-Star Break (22) and is tied for the lead in doubles (12)...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (21) and is tied for the lead in runs (19)...**Khris Davis** ranks fourth in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for fifth in extra base hits (56) and tied for 10th in games played (120)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and tied for the AL lead in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in **1997** Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in **2006** the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-2, 5.26 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and seventh start of the season...all of his appearances have come at night...the starts are the first of his career...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-1 with a 7.08 ERA (16 er in 20.1 ip) and .268 (22-for-82) opponents batting average in four games (three starts) since then...his only career win came in his second career outing over nine years ago on June 24, 2008 with Boston against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in his last start after allowing at least one in each of his first six games...including a career-high four on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...has allowed nine home runs in 39.1 innings, an average of 2.06 per nine innings...eight of the nine home runs have been hit by right-handers...seven have been solo shots...has allowed 37 hits, 21 of which are for extra bases (11 doubles, one triple).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the three and four hitters in the batting order to a combined .147 (5-for-34) batting average...has issued 10 of his 13 walks to left-handed hitters...the opposition is batting .167 (12-for-67) with two strikes but they are hitting .458 (11-for-24) with four doubles and three home runs (1.000 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play...has a .291 (16-for-55) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .241 (14-for-58) the second time and .175 (7-for-40) the third time...opponents are 12-for-37 (.324) with three walks, four doubles, a triple and three home runs when leading off an inning (.375 on-base percentage, .730 slugging percentage).

SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in five of his six starts (15 rs in 35.1 ip, 3.82 RSA)...his overall run support average is 3.66 (16 rs in 39.1 ip)...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his six starts (July 18, Aug. 15).

AGE AT FIRST START: His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

2017 APPEARANCES: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle **July 8**...left after six innings with the score tied 3-3...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay **July 18** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...left with a 3-2 lead but Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto **July 24**...allowed a solo home run to Martin in the first and two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Carrera and Goins...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Minnesota on **July 29** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven hits...pitched in relief in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco **Aug. 3**...tossed the final four innings and allowed four runs, all in the fifth...blanked the Giants on two hits and a walk over the final three innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Baltimore in Oakland on **Aug. 10**...allowed a career-high five runs on a career-high tying seven hits, including a career-high four home runs.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8 win over Kansas City last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run double by Hosmer and a RBI single by Cabrera...then retired 15 of the final 16 batters he faced, allowing just a one-out single to Cain in the third...left after 5.1 innings with a 4-3 lead but the bullpen allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save (Casilla).

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers...issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha...moved back into the starting rotation May 28...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts.

2016 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)...with Nashville, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average (.239), sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA (3.93)...tied for third in the A's farm system in strikeouts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (130.2).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Paul Blackburn (3-1, 3.46 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...is 2-0 despite a 5.16 ERA and .330 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .212 opponents average over his first five starts...is 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA in four starts on the road, 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA in five starts at home...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss to Kansas City last Wednesday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Baltimore, a 5-4 A's win earlier this month on Aug. 11 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 5-of-13 (38.5%) save opportunities over the last 31 games...is 24-for-44 (54.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the third fewest saves and the fourth most blown saves (20).
- Has a 3.78 ERA (50 er in 119.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.26).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (154), has the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.430) and the fourth most home runs (60).
