OAKLAND ATHLETICS (54-71) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (61-64)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 22, 2017 — ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (3-1, 3.46) VS. RHP UBALDO JIMÉNEZ (5-8, 6.47) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and nine of the last 13 to fall a season-low 17 games under .500 for the second time in the last three days...are 54-71 (.432), which is the second worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in Oakland history after 125 games (were 53-72 last year and 54-71 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 87 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's fell to 20-40 (.333) on the road with the loss last night, which is tied with San Francisco for the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 21-46/.313)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this trips begins a stretch where the A's will play five series in five different cities...are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (0-1), return home following the game tomorrow for a brief three-game homestand with Texas and then have a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2) and are 34-31 (.523) at home...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-14-2 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Matt Chapman committed the A's Major League leading 100th error of the season last night, marking the sixth time in the last nine seasons the A's have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 74 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (92), tied for second in most passed balls (13), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (126).

OFFENSE: The A's grounded into three double plays last night and now have 10 in four games on the road trip...are hitting .228 (28-for-123) with seven runs scored on the trip...however, are batting .266 (212-for-797) with 111 runs scored (4.8 per game) and 88 extra base hits (3.8 per game...56 doubles, 2 triples, 30 home runs) over the last 23 games...are hitting .241 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...however, rank third in extra base hits (414) and doubles (232).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs last night and now have 171 for the season, which surpasses their season total from each of the previous three seasons (169 in 2016, 146 in 2015 and 2014)...home runs have accounted for 261 of the A's 544 runs (48.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have the third fewest wins in the majors when going homerless (5).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have struck out 1162 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1214), third most in the majors (MIL, 1231) and fifth most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008, 1181 in 1997, 1178 in 2013)...have 61 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-10 with a 6.69 ERA (85 er in 114.1 ip) and .323 (154-for-477) opponents batting average over the last 23 games and 37-51 with a 4.79 ERA (365 er in 685.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 57) and fourth fewest strikeouts (528), but have allowed 96 home runs, which is tied for third fewest.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with 67 wild pitches, which is tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...rank second in the American League in most doubles (234) and have the fourth highest ERA (4.73)... have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 24-23 (.511) record during day games compared to 30-48 (.385) at night...are batting .268 (439-for-1637) and are averaging 5.06 runs per game during the day (238 runs in 47 games), .223 (570-for-2554) and 3.92 runs per games at night (306 runs in 78 games)... the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PHI, .243) while the day batting average is fourth best.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas

and Toronto for the American League lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 7-12 (.368) in August, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League (CWS, 7-13)...went 12-14 in July, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...that is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 5.50 ERA (102 er in 167.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the AL...the pitching staff has the fewest strikeouts in the AL (106) and the offense has the second most strikeouts (172)...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (41) and third in extra base hits (68).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 18-32 (.360) against the American League West compared to 36-39 (.480) against everyone else...have gone an Athletics record 165 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...have a run differential of -110, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 11 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 12-16 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 20-15.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...the players on the DL have combined to miss 897 games after missing 1810 games last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The are 2-3 against the Orioles...lost the first meeting in Baltimore last night after splitting a four-game series in Oakland earlier this month...have lost seven of the last eight games at Camden Yards... the A's won the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 11-14 (.440) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 95-58 (.621) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 262-264 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 133-135 in Oakland and 129-129 in Baltimore...are 62-55 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 998-944 against the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (13) and extra base hits (23) since the All-Star Break (23)...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (22) since the break and ranks second in runs (19)...*Khris Davis* ranks fourth in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for sixth in extra base hits (56) and tied for 10th in games played (121)...*Rajai Davis* is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and tied for the AL lead in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...*Jed Lowrie* ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in **1990** Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (3-1, 3.46 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...will become the third Oakland rookie to start 10 games this year (Cotton 18, Gossett 10)...this marks the fifth time in the last six years the A's had two or more rookies with 10 or more starts.

LAST FOUR/FIRST FIVE: Is 2-0 despite a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.2 ip) and .330 (31-for-94) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .212 opponents average over his first five starts

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA (5 er in 26.2 ip) and .223 (21for-94) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA (16 er in 28.0 ip) and .301 (34-for-113) opponents average in five starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 2-for-15 (.133) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has held left-handed hitters to a .220 (22for-100) batting average compared to .308 (33-for-107) by right-handers... however, has issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...has surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...has a .211 (17-for-76) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .298 (39-for-131) after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (10 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 0-1 with a 4.30 ERA (11 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed 4.0 innings in his last start to snap a careeropening streak of eight consecutive games of more than five innings pitched...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history to Willie Adams, who had a 10-game streak in 1996...has just 22 strikeouts in 54.2 innings and his average of 3.62 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors among pitcher with at least 50 innings pitched (Blach, SF 4.33)...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his nine starts and four runs or more four times...has a 1.67 ERA (5 er in 27.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game and a 5.20 ERA (16 er in 27.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...allowed one run and walked one batter in each of his first two starts...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS WITH OAKLAND: Made his Major League debut July 1 against Atlanta and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...tossed 7.2 innings and allowed one run in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle July 6 to earn his first Major League win...was charged with his first loss in a 7-5 decision at New York (NL) July 21...tossed seven scoreless and allowed just two hits July 26 at Toronto but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss...combined with Dull. Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 5...tossed 6.2 innings and yielded five of the hits...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Kansas City last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Moustakas in the first but the A's scored twice in the third...he then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Butera RBI single and a two-run home run by Cain...left after four innings trailing 4-2.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville ... ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the Pacific Coast League Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a 321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.

2016 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization and was 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 18 starts when he was traded to the Seattle Mariners organization July 20...was assigned to Double-A Jackson and went 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA in eight games (seven starts) with the Generals...combined for a 9-5 record and a 3.28 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) overall...surrendered just eight home runs in 143.0 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...ranked fourth in the Southern League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.12), tied for fourth in games started, sixth in ERA and innings pitched and tied for eighth in wins...was named to the SL Midseason All-Star Game.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 4.58 ERA): Is 0-3 with an 8.17 ERA and .370 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (July 5-Aug. 7, 2016)...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch...is 0-3 with an 11.37 ERA and .415 opponents batting average in four starts in August...left-handed hitters are 22-for-60 (.367) against him over his last 13 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...opponents are 25-for-69 (.362) with runners in scoring position over his last 12 starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 loss at Houston on Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 12-5 A's loss in Oakland earlier this month on Aug. 12 (0.1 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 0 so).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 11 for his third stint with the A's this year and has pitched twice since his return.
- Both of his outings since his return (Aug. 12 and 21) have been against Baltimore (6.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 so, 5.68 ERA).
- Tossed 5.1 innings Aug. 12 after pitching 6.0 innings of relief in his previous outing with the A's on Aug. 1...is the second Oakland reliever over the last 30 years with two outings greater than 5.0 innings in the same season (Brad Rigby, 1999).
