### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-71) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (61-65)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two of the last three games but have lost nine of the last 14 contests...are 16 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 17 (53-70 on Aug. 19 and 54-71 on Aug. 21)...are 55-71 (.437), which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in Oakland history after 126 games (were 54-72 last year and 55-71 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 88 days in fifth overall.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 21-40 (.345) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this trip begins a stretch where the A's will play five series in five different cities...are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-1), return home following the game today for a brief three-game homestand against Texas beginning Friday and then have a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2) and are 34-31 (.523) at home...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-14-2 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 24-23 (.511) record during day games compared to 31-48 (.393) at night...are batting .268 (439-for-1637) and are averaging 5.06 runs per game during the day (238 runs in 47 games), .225 (583-for-2594) and 3.95 runs per game at night (312 runs in 79 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PHI, .243) while the day batting average is fourth best.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 101 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 74 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (92), tied for third in most passed balls (13) and fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (129).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .269 (225-for-837) with 117 runs scored (4.9 per game) and 94 extra base hits (3.9 per game)...58 doubles, 2 triples, 34 home runs) over the last 24 games...are hitting .242 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.315)...however, rank third in extra base hits (420) and doubles (234)...have grounded into 10 double plays in five games on the road trip.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's hit four home runs last night and now have 175 for the season, which surpasses their season total from each of the previous three seasons (169 in 2016, 146 in 2015 and 2014)...home runs accounted for all six of the A's runs last night and 267 of their 550 runs (48.5%) for the season...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have the third fewest wins in the majors when going homerless (5).

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's have struck out 1168 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1217), tied for third most in the majors (MIL, 1239) and fifth most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008, 1181 in 1997, 1178 in 2013)...have 61 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-10 with a 6.46 ERA (85 er in 118.1 ip) and .316 (157-for-491) opponents batting average over the last 24 games and 37-51 with a 4.77 ERA (365 er in 689.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 58) and fourth fewest strikeouts (528), but have allowed 96 home runs, which is third fewest.

**PITCHING:** The A's lead the majors with 67 wild pitches, which is tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...rank second in the AL in most doubles (234) and have the fourth highest ERA (4.73)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas

and Toronto for the AL lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 8-12 (.400) in August, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...went 12-14 in July, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...that is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 18-32 (.360) against the American League West compared to 37-39 (.487) against everyone else...have gone an Athletics record 166 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...have a run differential of -108, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 15 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 12-16 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 20-15.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...the players on the DL have combined to miss 902 games after missing 1810 games last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. ORIOLES:** The win last night improved the Athletics all-time record against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers to 999-944...the only franchise the A's have defeated 1000 times in the Twins/Senators (1004)...of the other seven original American League franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against...the 2017 season series is even at three games each entering the final meeting today...have split the first two games in Baltimore after splitting a four-game series in Oakland earlier this month...have lost seven of the last nine games at Camden Yards...the A's won the season series last year 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have won two of the previous three season series and 15 of the previous 18...are 12-14 (.462) against the Orioles over the last four years...however, are 96-58 (.623) over the last 19 seasons, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any AL team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 263-264 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 133-135 in Oakland and 130-129 in Baltimore...are 63-55 at Camden Yards.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (24) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (22) since the break and ranks second in runs (19)...**Khris Davis** ranks fourth in the AL in home runs (34) and RBI (87), tied for fourth in extra base hits (57) and tied for 10th in games played (122)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and tied for the AL lead in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...**Ryon Healy** has a 10-game hitting streak (16-for-38, .421)...had an 11-game hitting streak earlier this year, which is the A's season high...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1946** Jesse Flores tosses a three-hit shutout and Gene Desautels has a RBI single in the bottom of the ninth in a 1-0 win over Cleveland...in **1975** Billy Williams homers twice in the second game of a doubleheader at Milwaukee and combines for six hits in the A's sweep of the Brewers...in **1983** Rickey Henderson has three hits and steals four bases in the A's 9-3 win at New York.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (3-6, 5.17 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds was he was selected by Oakland June 14...went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts with the Sounds following his option.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season today, his seventh in a day game...is 2-3 with a 6.37 ERA (21 er in 29.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 3.70 ERA (10 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at night.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 2-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) and three home runs allowed in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA and eight home runs allowed in six starts before the break.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has surrendered at least one home run in seven of his first 10 starts and has allowed 11 home runs in 54.0 innings (1.83 per nine innings...the home runs are tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 10 career games (Dan Straily 13, Blake Stein 13, Raul Alcantara 12, Vida Blue 12, Dillon Overton 12, Willie Adams 11)...the most by a pitcher over his first 11 games is 14 by Dan Straily...nine of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .153 (13-for-85) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .360 (49-for-136) after that...has held the opposition to a .148 (16-for-108) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 20-for-54 (.370) with four walks when leading off an inning.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 4-for-34 (.118) with no walks...is 3-6 over his first 10 starts and is the seventh pitcher in Oakland history with six or more losses over his first 10 career games...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 10 starts and is 0-5 in those five games...is 3-1 in five starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

**2017 START-BY-START:** He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami **June 14**...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on **June 19** in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on **June 24**...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed unearned runs in the third and fourth innings...left after six innings with a 10-2 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **June 29**...retired each of the first 10 batters before allowing a two-run home run to Correa in the fourth and a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on **July 4**...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on **July 9**...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay **July 17** in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Souza in the second and another run in the third when Smith scored on a fielders choice...the A's scored once in the fourth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed a solo home run to Longoria in the fifth and left after seven innings trailing 3-1...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at New York (NL) **July 23**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Conforto in the third inning...the A's added a run in the fourth to re-take the lead but he allowed the tying run to score in the sixth inning on a Reyes RBI ground out...Oakland then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Minnesota **July 28** in Oakland...allowed four hits and walked two over the first three innings but surrendered just one run on an Adrianza RBI single in the second...then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a Castro RBI double, a Dozier RBI single, a wild pitch and a Lavarnway error...left after 3.2 innings with the A's trailing 5-0.

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at San Francisco on Aug. 2...shutout the Giants on one walk over the first four innings and had a 4-0 lead when he walked Crawford to start

the fifth...Pence followed with a RBI double for the first of three hits off Gossett...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings.

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14.

**HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE:** Walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...allowed four runs in 3.2 innings in his first start following his option, a no decision in a 8-7, 12-inning loss at Tacoma Aug. 7...then struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE START:** He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 11-8 win at Memphis last Thursday...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Tyler O'Neill in the fourth...Nashville built a 6-1 lead before he allowed his final run in the sixth on a fielders choice...was relieved by Kyle Finnegan to start the seventh with the Sounds leading 9-2.

**RHP Kendall Graveman (3-4, 4.54 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 1-2 with a 6.20 ERA and .337 opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder twice (April 15-26 and May 26-Aug. 2)...is 2-0 with a 2.97 ERA in six starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA in six starts on the road...is 2-2 with a 3.12 ERA in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA in four starts against everyone else...has allowed 13 of his 35 runs in the first inning for a 9.75 ERA...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss at Houston last Saturday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 2-2 with a 5.20 ERA (36.1 ip, 37 h, 22 r, 21 er, 6 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in six career starts against Texas...including 1-0 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.
