OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-72) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (64-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost 10 of the last 15 games and are a season-low 17 games under .500 for the third time in the last five games...are 55-72 (.433), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the 2015 and 2016 A's for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 127 games (lost game 128 in 2015 and 2016)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 90 days in fifth overall.

AGAINST THE WEST: This series with Texas begins a 15-game stretch against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10...are 18-32 (.360) against the AL West compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .225 (371-for-1652) and are averaging 3.84 runs per game against the AL West (192 runs in 50 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

LOSING MONTHS: Oakland is 8-13 (.381) in August, which is the third worst record in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the 10th consecutive month...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 101 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 74 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (93), tied for third in most passed balls (13) and fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (130).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .269 (239-for-885) with 124 runs scored (4.96 per game) and 99 extra base hits (3.96 per game...62 doubles, 2 triples, 35 home runs) over the last 25 games...have doubled in each of those 25 games, which matches their longest streak of consecutive games with a double over the last 12 years (June 4-July 2, 2008)...the last longer streak was a 37-game streak from June 10-July 22, 2005...have 238 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in extra base hits (425)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.242).

THE LONG BALL....: The A's have hit 176 home runs, which is tied for 11th in Athletics history (10th is 186 in 2013)...have hit 99 of those home runs at home, which is the most by an A's team since 2004 (100)...home runs have accounted for 269 of the A's 557 runs (48.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 50-45 when homering, 5-27 when going homerless...the wins when going homerless are third fewest wins in the majors (NYY 3, DET 4).

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out 15 times in the 12-inning game at Baltimore on Wednesday and now have 1183 strikeouts for the season...that is second most in the American League (TB, 1238) and third most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008)...have 62 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-10 with a 6.57 ERA (90 er in 123.1 ip) and .322 (165-for-512) opponents batting average over the last 25 games and 37-51 with a 4.80 ERA (370 er in 694.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 58) and are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (534)...have allowed 96 home runs, which is tied for second fewest...are one of four AL teams without a complete game and have gone an Athletics record 167 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with 69 wild pitches, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history and three short of the record of 72 set in 1979 (had 71 in 1989 and 70 last year)...rank second in the American League in most doubles (235) and have the fourth highest ERA (4.74)...the pitching staff has allowed at least one home run in each of the last 10 games (19 home runs total).

HOME AND AWAY: This three-game series with Texas marks the third series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2) and begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Monday...the A's are 34-31 (.523) at home compared to 21-41 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-15-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 24-24 (.500) record during day games compared to 31-48 (.393) at night...are batting .269 (453-for-1685) and are averaging 5.10 runs per game during the day (245 runs in 48 games), .225 (583-for-2594) and 3.95 runs per games at night (312 runs in 79 games)...the day batting average is third best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .242).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 4-7 (.364) in extra inning games with the loss on Wednesday, including 0-4 on the road...the seven losses are second most in the American League and the winning percentage is fourth lowest...lost in their final at bat for the 14th time Wednesday, which is tied for second most in the AL...it was their seventh walk-off loss, which is tied for third most in the AL...are tied with Baltimore and Boston for the most walk-off wins in the AL (9)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...rank second in the majors with nine wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 10) but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the AL lead with five losses when leading after eight innings.

IN AUGUST: The A's have a 5.49 ERA (114 er in 187.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the American League...the pitching staff has the fewest strikeouts in the majors (127) and the offense has the fourth most in the AL (193)...the Athletics record for most strikeouts by hitters in the month of August is 235 in 2012...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the offense is tied for the AL lead in doubles this month (47) and ranks second in extra base hits (79).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 913 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's and Rangers meet for the first time since May 14...played 9 of their first 40 games against Texas, none of the next 87 and will meet 10 times over the final 35 games...are 3-6 against the Rangers...are 2-1 in Oakland and 1-5 in Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 41-44 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 344-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 180-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 441-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (24) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (22) since the break...**Khris Davis** ranks fourth in the AL in RBI (87) and tied for fourth in home runs (34) and extra base hits (58)...**Ryon Healy** has an 11-game hitting streak (17-for-44, .386), which is the longest active hitting streak in the AL and fourth longest in the majors...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Mark McGwire hits his first major league home run, a two-run shot in the fifth inning off Walt Terrell, in the A's 8-4 win at Detroit...in **2006** Barry Zito takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning and wins the 100th game of his career in the A's 9-3 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-4, 4.54 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 1-2 with a 6.20 ERA (14 er in 20.1 ip) and .337 (29-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA (22 er in 31.0 ip) in six starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 9-10 with a 3.55 ERA (73 er in 185.0 ip) in 30 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.79 ERA (98 er in 184.0 ip) in 33 starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-2 with a 3.12 ERA (17 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 35 runs in the first inning for a 9.75 ERA (13 er in 12.0 ip)...has a 3.42 ERA (21 er in 55.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .365 (19-for-52) in the first inning, .264 (56-for-212) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (10 er in 32.1 ip) and .244 (30-for-123) opponents batting average in five starts on four days rest compared to 1-4 with a 6.17 ERA (24 er in 35.0 ip) and .319 (45-for-141) opponents average in seven starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 12 starts...has surrendered five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .273 (18-for-66) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .179 (5-for-28) with RISP and two outs...has a .318 (21-for-66) opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning but has just three walks in that situation...has allowed a .467 (14-for-30) opponents batting average to the opponents number three hitter.

THIS AND THAT: Has made 10 of his 12 starts at night...went 0-1 with a 5.48 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...his April ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Made his first rehab start July 19 at Iowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day **April 3** in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **April 8**...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on **April 14** in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 27**...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota **May 3**...issued a career-high tying four walks...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **May 8** in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning but shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas **May 14**...had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save...had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Boston **May 19** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the fourth inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco **Aug. 3**...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 2.0 in-

nings...had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 10-inning loss to Seattle **Aug. 8** in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters and had a 3-0 lead when he was charged with an unearned run in the third inning...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Dyson RBI single in the fourth and a 6-2 lead when he allowed a two-run double to Gamel in the sixth...left after 5.2 innings with a 6-4 lead but the pen allowed single runs in the seventh and eighth innings for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 victory over Baltimore **Aug. 13** in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in 7.0 innings...allowed RBI singles to Schoop in the first and Davis in the second...then blanked the Orioles on three hits and a walk over his final five innings...the A's scored five times in the fourth inning to take the lead.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Houston last Saturday...blanked the Astros on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before yielding a two-run single to Gonzalez in the fourth...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings but McHugh and the Houston bullpen combined to shutout the A's on six hits.

GRAVEMAN vs. TEXAS: Is 2-2 with a 5.20 ERA (36.1 ip, 37 h, 22 r, 21 er, 6 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in six career starts...is 0-2 with an 8.71 ERA (10 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 3.81 ERA (11 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts in Texas...is 1-0 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 6-1 decision at Texas on April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work...then had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas May 14...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 4.58 ERA): Is 0-3 with an 8.17 ERA and .370 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (July 5-Aug. 7, 2016)...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch...is 0-3 with an 11.37 ERA and .415 opponents batting average in four starts in August...left-handed hitters are 22-for-60 (.367) against him over his last 13 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 loss at Houston on Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.97 ERA (29.0 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 16 er, 4 bb, 32 so, 4 hr) in five career starts against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-1 A's loss at Texas April 9 (5.1 ip, 3 h, 6 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 10 so)

- Has a 3.97 ERA (59 er in 133.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.28).
- Ranks first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (161) and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.435).
- Ranks second in the AL in fewest inherited runners (160).
- Has allowed 45 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors.
