OAKLAND ATHLETICS (56-72) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (64-64)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last five games but have lost 10 of the last 16...are 16 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 17...are 56-72 (.438), which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the seventh worst record in Oakland history after 128 games and is one game better than both 2015 and 2016...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 91 days in fifth overall.

AGAINST THE WEST: This series with Texas begins a 15-game stretch against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10...are 19-32 (.373) against the AL West compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...are tied with San Francisco for the worst intradivision record in the majors...are batting .223 (375-for-1680) and are averaging 3.82 runs per game against the AL West (195 runs in 51 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

LOSING MONTHS: Oakland is 9-13 (.409) in August, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the 10th consecutive month...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 24-24 (.500) record during day games compared to 32-48 (.400) at night...are batting .269 (453-for-1685) and are averaging 5.10 runs per game during the day (245 runs in 48 games), .224 (587-for-2622) and 3.94 runs per games at night (315 runs in 80 games)...the day batting average is third best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .243).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 101 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 74 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (93), tied for third in most passed balls (13) and fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (133).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .266 (243-for-913) with 127 runs scored (4.88 per game) and 102 extra base hits (3.92 per game...63 doubles, 2 triples, 37 home runs) over the last 26 games...have doubled in each of those 26 games, which is their longest streak of consecutive games with a double since a 37-game streak from June 10-July 22, 2005...have 239 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in extra base hits (428)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.241) and third lowest on-base percentage (.314).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 178 home runs, which is 11th most in Athletics history (10th is 186 in 2013)...have hit 101 of those home runs at home, which ranks third in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 2002 (116)...home runs have accounted for 271 of the A's 560 runs (48.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 51-45 when homering, 5-27 when going homerless...the wins when going homerless are third fewest in the majors (NYY 3, DET 4).

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 1190 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1252) and third most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008)...have 62 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-10 with a 6.28 ERA (91 er in 130.1 ip) and .323 (174-for-539) opponents batting average over the last 26 games and 38-51 with a 4.75 ERA (371 er in 701.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 58) and the third fewest strikeouts (540)...have allowed 97 home runs, which is third fewest...are one of four AL teams without a complete game and have gone an Athletics record 168 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with 69 wild pitches, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history and three short of the record of 72 set in 1979 (had 71 in 1989 and 70 last year)...rank second in the AL in most doubles (236) and have the fourth highest ERA (4.71).

HOME AND AWAY: This three-game series with Texas marks the third series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), are 1-0 on this homestand and begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Monday...the A's are 35-31 (.530) at home compared to 21-41 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 13-18 over the last 31 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-15-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Baltimore and Boston for the American League lead in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in walk-off losses (7)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...are tied for second in the AL in last at bat losses (14)...rank second in the majors with nine wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 10) but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the AL lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are 4-7 (.364) in extra inning games...the seven losses are second most in the AL and the winning percentage is fourth lowest.

IN AUGUST: The A's have a 5.28 ERA (115 er in 196.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the American League...the pitching staff has the fewest strikeouts in the majors (136) and the offense has the fourth most in the AL (200)...the Athletics record for most strikeouts by hitters in the month of August is 235 in 2012...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the offense ranks second in AL in doubles this month (48) and tied for second in extra base hits (82).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 914 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 4-6 against the Rangers...are 3-1 in Oakland and 1-5 in Texas...played 9 of their first 40 games against Texas, none of the next 87 and, beginning last night, will meet 10 times over the final 35 games...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 42-44 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 345-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 181-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 442-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (24) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and ranks second in RBI (23) since the break...**Khrris Davis** ranks second in the American League in home runs (36) and fourth in RBI (89) and extra base hits (60)...has tied the Oakland record for home runs by a left fielder with 28 (Ben Grieve, 1999)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1916** Joe Bush no-hits Cleveland 5-0 in Philadelphia after lasting just three innings against Cleveland a day earlier...in **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a four-hit shutout to improve to 19-11 in the A's 1-0 win over New York...Vic Davalillo's pinch hit RBI single in the eighth inning drives in the only run of the game...in **2011** the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in a 15-5 win at Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-8, 4.58 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with an 8.17 ERA (23 er in 25.1 ip) and .370 (44-for-119) opponents batting average over his last six starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (July 5-Aug. 7, 2016)...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch.

2017 vs. 2016: Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season today, which matches his total from his rookie season last year (also had one relief appearance in 2016)...has surpassed his totals from last year in wins (8), runs (72), earned runs (64), walks (43), hit batters (6) and wild pitches (4)...has a 4.58 ERA vs. 3.86 last year and a .766 OPS vs. .713 last year.

IN AUGUST: Is 0-3 with an 11.37 ERA (16 er in 12.2 ip) and .415 (27-for-65) opponents batting average in four starts in August...is tied for second in the American League in losses in August...his ERA is the highest in the AL and third highest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more innings this month...the only time in his career he lost more than three games in a month was last August when he had four...is now 2-7 with a 5.98 ERA (31 er in 46.2 ip) in 10 career starts in August compared to 13-10 with a 3.82 ERA in all other months.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 1-3 with a 6.96 ERA (25 er in 32.1 ip) and .340 (49-for-144) opponents batting average in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the break...has allowed eight home runs in 32.1 innings since the break after yielding just eight in 93.1 innings before the break...his post-break ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more post-break innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Left-handed hitters are 22-for-60 (.367) against him over his last 13 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...has yielded 14 of his 16 home runs to right-handers...opponents are 25-for-69 (.362) with runners in scoring position over his last 12 starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...has a .156 (40-for-257) opponents batting average with two strikes...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .193 (11-for-57) batting average but the two hitter has a .400 (22-for-55) average.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-6 with a 5.18 ERA (33 er in 57.1 ip) in 11 starts against American League West teams compared to 6-2 with a 4.08 ERA (31 er in 68.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: Has allowed 34 of his 72 runs this year over the first two innings of his starts...has a 6.09 ERA (30 er in 44.1 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 3.19 (21 er in 59.1 ip) over innings three through five and an 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) in the sixth inning...has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (7.1 ip)...last year, he allowed just nine runs in the first inning and second inning (1.29 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for third in the American League in pickoffs (4)...tossed fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts from Aug. 1 to 12...is the first A's starting pitcher to toss fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts over the course of one season since Miguel Jimenez did it from April 30-May 12, 1994.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and was reinstated from the DL May 15...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of

May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit or walk (8, Blake Stein on Aug. 31, 1998; 7, Craig Minetto on July 4, 1979; 7, Ken Holtzman on June 30, 1972).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Houston on Aug. 25...allowed two runs in the third inning on back-to-back home runs by Bregman and Altuve, and another in the sixth on a Reddick RBI single...Keuchel shutout the A's on three hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored a run in the eighth off the Astros bullpen.

MANAEA vs. TEXAS: Is 1-2 with a 4.97 ERA (29.0 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 16 er, 4 bb, 32 so, 4 hr) in five career starts...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-2 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-1 A's loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1

RHP Jharel Cotton (6-10, 5.63 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 1-2 with an 6.91 ERA (21 er in 27.1 ip) and .296 (32-for-108) opponents batting average in five starts since his return...has allowed seven home runs in 27.1 innings (2.30 per nine innings)...is 3-7 with a 6.08 ERA and 17 home runs allowed (2.15 per nine innings) over his last 13 starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA and three home runs allowed (0.82 per nine innings) over his first six starts through May 4...has a 5.63 ERA, which is sixth highest among American League pitchers with a minimum of 100 innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Houston last Sunday (6.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.38 ERA (12.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Texas, both in Oakland...took the loss in his only start this year, a 7-0 decision on April 17 (5.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen has converted just 6-of-14 (42.9%) save opportunities over the last 35 games...is 26-for-46 (56.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the fourth fewest saves and has the fourth most blown saves (20).
