OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-72) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (64-65)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 27, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the first time since Aug. 5-6...will be attempting to sweep just their fourth series of the season (June 16-18 vs. NYY, June 23-25 at CWS, July 14-16 vs. CLE)...have won four of the last six games but are 7-10 over the last 17...are 57-72 (.442), which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the seventh worst record in Oakland history after 128 games...it is one game better than last year (56-73) and two games better than 2015 (55-74)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 92 days in fifth overall.

AGAINST THE WEST: This series with Texas begins a 15-game stretch against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10...are 20-32 (.385) against the AL West compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-33/.365)...are batting .225 (386-for-1711) and are averaging 3.90 runs per game against the AL West (203 runs in 52 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 25-24 (.510) record during day games compared to 32-48 (.400) at night...are batting .270 (464-for-1716) and are averaging 5.16 runs per game during the day (253 runs in 49 games), .224 (587-for-2622) and 3.94 runs per games at night (315 runs in 80 games)...the day batting average is third best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .242).

LOSING MONTHS: Oakland is 10-13 (.435) in August...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the 10th consecutive month...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 101 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 74 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (93), tied for second in most passed balls (14), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (133).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .269 (254-for-944) with 135 runs scored (5.00 per game) and 108 extra base hits (4.00 per game...67 doubles, 2 triples, 39 home runs) over the last 27 games...have doubled in each of those 27 games, which is their longest streak of consecutive games with a double since a 37-game streak from June 10-July 22, 2005...have 243 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...are tied for second in extra base hits (434)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.242) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.315).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 180 home runs, which is 11th most in Athletics history (10th is 186 in 2013)...have hit 103 of those home runs at home, which ranks third in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 2002 (116)...home runs have accounted for 273 of the A's 568 runs (48.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...are 52-45 when homering, 5-27 when going homerless...the wins when going homerless are third fewest in the majors (NYY 3, DET 4).

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 1194 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1257) and third most in Athletics history (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008)...have 62 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 3.43 ERA (8 er in 21.0 ip) over the last four games...however, are 7-10 with a 6.18 ERA (93 er in 135.1 ip) and .323 (181-for-561) opponents batting average over the last 27 contests...rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (97) and most losses (51) and tied for second in fewest strikeouts (543)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game and have gone an Athletics record 169 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

PITCHING: The A's had two wild pitches last night and now have a Major League leading 71 for the season...that is one short of the Athletics record of 72 set in 1979...have compiled a 3.80 ERA (30 er in 71.0 ip) over the last eight games but have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have the fourth fewest strikeouts (970) and fourth highest opponents batting average (.261).

HOME AND AWAY: This three-game series with Texas marks the third series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), are 2-0 on this homestand and begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Monday...the A's are 36-31 (.537) at home compared to 21-41 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...are 14-18 over the last 32 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-15-2 in road series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are tied with Baltimore and Boston for the AL lead in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in walk-off losses (7)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...are tied for third in the AL in last at bat losses (14)...rank second in the majors with nine wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 10) but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the AL lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are 4-7 (.364) in extra inning games...the losses are second most in the AL and the winning percentage is fourth lowest.

IN AUGUST: The A's have a 5.18 ERA (118 er in 205.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the American League...the pitching staff has the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (144) and the offense has the fourth most (204)...the Athletics record for most strikeouts by hitters in the month of August is 235 in 2012...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the offense is tied for the Major League lead in doubles this month (52) and ranks third in extra base hits (88).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 920 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 5-6 against the Rangers...are 4-1 in Oakland and 1-5 in Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 43-44 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 346-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 182-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 443-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (24) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and ranks second in RBI (23) since the break...**Khrris Davis** ranks second in the AL in home runs (36) and fourth in RBI (90) and extra base hits (60)...drove in his 90th run of the season yesterday and is the second A's player over the last 14 years with back-to-back 90-RBI seasons (Josh Donaldson, 2013-14)...**Jed Lowrie** is the fourth player in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with two 40-double seasons.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1948** Hank Majeski has six doubles in a doubleheader against St. Louis as the A's win 6-0 and 9-1...in **1982** Rickey Henderson steals four bases against the Milwaukee Brewers, breaking Lou Brock's major league single season record of 118...he would finish the season with 130 steals...in **2010** Brett Anderson allowed four runs in 2.0 innings, ending an Athletics record tying streak of 18 games with six or more innings and three earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (6-10, 5.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 1-2 with a 6.91 ERA (21 er in 27.1 ip) and .296 (32-for-108) opponents batting average in five starts since his return...has allowed seven home runs in 27.1 innings (2.30 per nine innings)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season, which marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (82), innings pitched (104.0) and games started (19) and tied for third in wins (6).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 5.63 ERA, which is sixth highest among American League pitchers with a minimum of 100 innings pitched...is tied for second in balks (2), tied for fifth in unearned runs (10), tied for sixth in losses (10) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (8)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

LAST 13 STARTS: Is 3-7 with a 6.08 ERA (48 er in 71.0 ip) and 17 home runs allowed (2.15 per nine innings) over his last 13 starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA and three home runs allowed (0.82 per nine innings) over his first six starts through May 4.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-3 with a 4.27 ERA (28 er in 59.0 ip) and .210 (44-for-210) opponents batting average in 10 starts during the day compared to 1-7 with a 7.40 ERA (37 er in 45.0 ip) and .339 (64-for-189) opponents batting average in nine starts at night...is tied for third in the American League in day wins but has the fourth highest night ERA among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at night...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 12 career starts at night, 7-3 with a 3.73 ERA (30 er in 72.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-6 with a 7.71 ERA (46 er in 53.2 ip) and 14 home runs allowed in 10 starts in Oakland compared to 4-4 with a 3.40 ERA (19 er in 50.1 ip) and six home runs allowed in nine starts on the road...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at home (Chatwood, COL 6.88)...the highest home ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more innings at home is 7.46 by Mark Redman in 2004.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-5 with a 6.96 ERA (33 er in 42.2 ip) and .320 (56-for-175) opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 4-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) and .232 (52-for-224) opponents average in 11 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-6 with a 6.58 ERA (38 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .313 (31-for-99) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...12 of the 20 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 15 of his 24 career home runs...10 of his 20 home runs have been allowed the first time through the lineup...seven have come in the second inning, which is tied for second most in the AL (Nolasco, LAA 8).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9...that began a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA and .188 opponents batting average before he

was reinstated July 30...walked a career-high five batters in a career-low 3.2 innings in a no decision on July 30 against Minnesota...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 6-3 loss to Seattle in Oakland on Aug. 9.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Houston a week ago today...had a 2-0 lead when Marisnick doubled to start the third, moved to third on a ground out and scored on a Bregman sacrifice fly...retired 10 in a row following the double and had a 3-1 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Gonzalez in the seventh...left after 6.2 innings with a 3-2 lead.

COTTON vs. TEXAS: Is 1-1 with a 4.38 ERA (12.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both in Oakland...took the loss in his only start this year, a 7-0 decision on April 17...allowed a RBI double to Mazara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0...the win came last year in a 7-1 victory on Sept. 25...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored seven times in the second inning and he shutout the Rangers on two hits over the first six innings...allowed his only run in the seventh inning on a two-out solo home run by Beltre.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Gossett (3-6, 5.49 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday for his second stint with the A's this year and had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 12-inning loss that day at Baltimore (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds was he was selected by Oakland June 14...went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts with the Sounds following his option and was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts overall...is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season but just his fifth in a night game...is 1-3 with a 3.70 ERA and three home runs allowed in four starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA and nine home runs allowed in seven starts during the day...has never faced the Angels in his career.

- Has a 3.87 ERA (60 er in 139.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.25).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (161) and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.431).
- Ranks second in the AL in fewest inherited runners (160).
- Has allowed 45 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors.
