OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-72) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (66-65)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Texas over the weekend for just their fourth series sweep of the season (last: July 14-16 vs. CLE)...have now won four of the last five games and are 23-24 over the last 27 games...are 58-72 (.446) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the eight worst record in Oakland history after 130 games...it is one game better than last year (57-73) and two games better than 2015 (56-74)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 93 days in fifth overall.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-0 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10... however, are 21-32 (.396) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-34/.358)...are batting .228 (398-for-1746) and are averaging 3.98 runs per game against the AL West (211 runs in 53 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

LOSING MONTHS: Oakland is 11-13 (.458) in August with three games remaining...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the 10th consecutive month...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

ROOKIES: Matt Chapman hit his 10th home run of the season yesterday, giving the A's two rookies with 10 or more home runs (Pinder, 12) for the eighth time in Oakland history and the first time since 2012 (Carter and Cespedes)...Matt Olson has nine home runs and the only time in Oakland history the A's had three players with 10 or more home runs was 1977 (Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13)...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup yesterday for the fourth time this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have employed 17 rookies for the season (8 batters, 9 pitchers).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 103 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 75 unearned runs...are tied for the American League lead in passed balls (15), rank second in most stolen bases allowed (93), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (134).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (266-for-980) with 143 runs scored (5.11 per game) and 111 extra base hits (3.96 per game)...68 doubles, 2 triples, 41 home runs) over the last 28 games...have doubled in each of those games, which is their longest streak of consecutive games with a double since a 37-game streak from June 10-July 22, 2005...have 244 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in extra base hits (437)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.243)...home runs have accounted for 276 of the A's 576 runs (47.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out eight times yesterday and now have 1202 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1269)...it marks the third time in Athletics history the A's have struck out at least 1200 times in a season (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers picked up the win in all three games of the Texas series and are now 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) over the last five games after going 5-10 with a 6.69 ERA over their previous 23 contests...have walked just three batters over the last five games (1.00 per nine innings)...rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (98) and most losses (51) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (552)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game and have gone an Athletics record 170 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

PITCHING: Jharel Cotton's second inning wild pitch yesterday was Oakland's 72nd of the season, which ties the Athletics franchise record set in

1979...it is also the most in the majors...have compiled a 3.60 ERA (32 er in 80.0 ip) over the last nine games but have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have the fourth fewest strikeouts (979).

IN AUGUST: The A's are tied with St. Louis for the Major League lead in doubles this month (53)...rank third in the American League in extra base hits (91) and are fourth in slugging (.463)...over the last 12 years, the only time the A's have slugged over .455 in a month was Sept. 2013 (.487)... have struck out 212 times, which is 23 short of the Athletics franchise record for the month of August (235 in 2012)...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the pitching staff ranks second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (153) and highest opponents batting average (.284), third in highest slugging percentage (.475) and fourth in highest ERA (5.05).

HOME AND AWAY: This three-game series with Los Angeles marks the fourth series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas and begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) tonight...are 37-31 (.544) at home compared to 21-41 (.339) on the road... have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 22-43/.338)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...are 15-18 over the last 33 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-15-2 in road series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-48 (.400) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games), .224 (587-for-2622) and 3.94 runs per games at night (315 runs in 80 games)... the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .242).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 926 games... set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series as they are 6-7... are 4-3 in Oakland and 2-4 in Anaheim...have lost seven of the last nine games at Angel Stadium and 23 of the last 34...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 30-40 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-361 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 205-191 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-438 against the Angels.

Matt Chapman Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (25) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (10) and runs (23) since the break...**Khris Davis** ranks second in the AL in home runs (36), fourth in RBI (91) and tied for fourth extra base hits (60)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the majors in doubles (40).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1938** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Chicago on Connie Mack Day at Shibe Park, their seventh consecutive twin bill in eight days...in **1974** the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (3-6, 5.49 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday for his second stint with the A's this year and had a no decision that day at Baltimore (5 er in 5.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)...was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds when he was selected by Oakland June 14...went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts with the Sounds following his option.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season today but just his fifth in a night game...is 1-3 with a 3.70 ERA (10 er in 24.1 ip) and three home runs allowed in four starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (26 er in 34.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in seven starts during the day.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-2 with a 4.71 ERA (15 er in 28.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA and eight home runs allowed in six starts before the break...however, has 10 walks in 28.2 innings since the break (3.14 per nine innings) after issuing just five free passes in 3.1 innings before the break (1.48 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-3 with a 5.63 ERA (10 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts against American League West teams compared to 3-3 with a 5.44 ERA (26 er in 43.0 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

THE LONG BALL: Has surrendered at least one home run in eight of his first 11 starts and has allowed 12 home runs in 59.0 innings (1.83 per nine innings)...the home runs are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 11 career games (Dan Straily 14, Blake Stein 13, Vida Blue 13)...the most by a pitcher over his first 12 games is 14 by Dan Straily...10 of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .149 (14-for-94) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .378 (56-for-148) after that...opponents are batting .316 (18-for-57) with runners in scoring position...has held the opposition to a .160 (19-for-119) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 22-for-59 (.373) with five walks when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 5-for-38 (.131) with no walks...has received one run of support or fewer in six of his 11 starts and is 0-5 in those five games...is 3-1 in five starts more than one run of support...is 3-6 over his first 11 starts and is the eighth pitcher in Oakland history with six or more losses over his first 11 career games...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami **June 14**...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on **June 19** in Oakland...is the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 10-2 victory at Chicago (AL) on **June 24**...retired the first eight batters and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed unearned runs in the third and fourth innings...left after six innings with a 10-2 lead...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **June 29**...retired each of the first 10 batters before allowing a two-run home run to Correa in the fourth and a three-run home run to Correa in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on **July 4**...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle in the final game before the All-Star Break on **July 9**...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay **July 17** in Oakland...allowed a pair of home runs and left after seven innings trailing 3-1...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at New York (NL) **July 23**...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed the tying run to score in the sixth inning, but the A's scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Minnesota **July 28** in Oakland...allowed four runs in the fourth inning and left after 3.2 innings with the A's trailing 5-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at San Francisco on **Aug. 2**...shutout the Giants on one walk over the first four innings and allowed just one run on three hits in seven innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 12-inning loss at Baltimore last Wednesday...allowed a leadoff single to Beckham but then retired 10 straight before the Orioles scored four times in the fourth in-

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14..

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

RHP Chris Smith (0-3, 5.56 ERA):	Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and eighth start of the season...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-2 with a 7.30 ERA and .280 opponents batting average in five games (four starts) since then...has received three runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts and his overall run support average is 3.50...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his seven starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss at Baltimore a week ago today (4.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 bb, 5 so) in two career appearances against Los Angeles, both in relief at Anaheim...was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion.

- Both of his outings during his third stint (Aug. 11 to 22) were against Baltimore (6.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 so, 5.68 ERA).
- Tossed 5.1 innings Aug. 12 after pitching 6.0 innings of relief on Aug. 1... is the second Oakland reliever over the last 30 years with two outings greater than 5.0 innings in the same season (Brad Rigby, 1999).
