OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-74) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (68-65)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 30, 2017 - ANGEL STADIUM -- 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (4-4, 4.24) VS. RHP PARKER BRIDWELL (7-2, 2.89) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the first two games of this series after sweeping a three-game series from Texas over the weekend...are 16 games under .500, which is one short of the season low of 17 (last: 55-72 on Aug. 23)...are 58-74 (.439), which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 132 games...were 57-75 last year and 58-74 in 2015...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 95 days in fifth overall

ROOKIES: Matt Olson hit his 10th home run of the season last night, giving the A's three rookies with at least 10 home runs (Pinder 12, Chapman 10) for just the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13)...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup Sunday for the fourth time this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have employed 17 rookies for the season (8 batters, 9 pitchers).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's are 11-15 (.423) in the month of August and have clinched a losing record for the 10th consecutive month...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's are tied for the American League lead in doubles (54), are tied for second in extra base hits (95) and rank fourth in slugging percentage (.454) in August...have struck out 234 times, which is one short of the Athletics franchise record for the month of August (235 in 2012)...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the pitching staff ranks second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (166) and highest opponents batting average (.283), third in highest slugging percentage (.477) and fourth in highest ERA (5.05)...the last time the A's had an ERA of 5.00 or greater in August was in 2000 (5.54)...have allowed 39 home runs, which are the A's most in the month of August since 1998 (40).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 21-43 (.328) on the road compared to 37-31 (.544) at home...have the worst road record in the American League and third worst in the majors...the home winning percentage is .216 better than the road, which is currently the second biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this three-game series with Los Angeles marks the fourth series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas and are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and Seattle (three games)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-16-2 in road series.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10.. however, are 21-34 (.382) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-35/.364)...are batting .226 (409-for-1809) and are averaging 3.89 runs per game against the AL West (214 runs in 55 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games and lead the majors with 105 for the season...also lead the majors with 77 unearned runs and top the American League with 16 passed balls...rank third in the AL in most stolen bases allowed (93) and fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (135).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .266 (277-for-1043) with 146 runs scored (4.87 per game) and 115 extra base hits (3.83 per game...69 doubles, 2 triples, 44 home runs) over the last 30 games...had their streak of 29 consecutive games with a double end last night, which was their longest such streak in 12 years (37, June 10-July 22, 2005)...have 245 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in extra base hits (441)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.242)...are 1-for-13 with runners in scoring position this series and are hitting .174 (15-for-86) with RISP over the last 12 games...home runs have accounted for all three of the A's runs this series and 278 of the A's 578 runs for the season (48.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have 1224 strikeouts, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1283) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1299). it is two short of the season total of 1226 in 2008, which is second most in Athletics history...the record is 1387 in 2012.

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Smith allowed seven runs (six earned) and walked two in 3.2 innings last night after A's starters combined to allowed just eight runs (six earned) and walk two in 24.2 innings over the previous four games...starters are now 8-12 with a 6.05 ERA (102 er in 151.2 ip) and .317 (199-for-628) opponents batting average over the last 30 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in most losses (53), tied for second in fewest home runs (100) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (559)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 172 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with an Athletics franchise record 73 wild pitches (previous: 72 in 1979)...have a 3.84 ERA (41 er in 96.0 ip) over the last 11 games but have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have allowed the second most doubles (245) and the fourth most triples (22).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-50 (.390) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games), .223 (598-for-2685) and 3.88 runs per games at night (318 runs in 82 games)... the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .241).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 938 games. set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 6-9 against the Angels and with one more loss, will lose the season series for the fourth consecutive season...have never lost four consecutive season series to the Angels in either Oakland or Kansas City...are 30-42 against the Angels over the last four years... are 4-3 in Oakland this year and 2-6 in Anaheim...Oakland's most losses in a season at Anaheim is seven (2010 and 2014)...have lost nine of the last 11 games at Angel Stadium and 25 of the last 36...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-363 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 205-193 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-440 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (25) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (10) since the break, is tied for the lead in runs (23) and ranks second in RBI (24)... *Khris Davis* tied for second in the AL in home runs (36), ranks fourth in RBI (91) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (60)...has a career-high 173 strikeouts, which ranks second in the majors and fourth in Athletics history... Jed Lowrie ranks second in the majors in doubles (40).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1974 Claudell Washington has five hits in five at bats, collecting three singles, a double and a triple in the A's 10-5 win at Detroit...in 1995 the A's tie a club record with three triples in a 7-2 win at Baltimore...Brent Gates has one of those triples, and adds a single and a double to fall a home run short of the cycle...in 2001 Eric Chavez homers twice and has eight RBI in the A's 15-0 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (4-4, 4.24 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA (15 er in 27.1 ip) and .336 (38-for-113) opponents batting average in five starts since his return...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts.

LAST THREE STARTS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts and is 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) over that span despite a .303 (23-for-76) opponents batting average...has walked just four batters (1.80 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-2 with a 2.89 ERA (18 er in 56.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (10 er in 32.1 ip) and .244 (30-for-123) opponents batting average in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.36 ERA (25 er in 42.0 ip) and .321 (54-for-168) opponents average in eight starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA (13 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA (22 er in 31.0 ip) in six starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 10-10 with a 3.47 ERA (74 er in 192.0 ip) in 31 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.79 ERA (98 er in 184.0 ip) in 33 starts on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 14 of his 36 runs in the first inning for a 9.69 ERA (14 er in 13.0 ip)...has a 3.08 ERA (21 er in 61.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .386 (22-for-57) in the first inning, .265 (62-for-234) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked two batters or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts...has surrendered five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .271 (19-for-70) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .172 (5-for-29) with RISP and two outs...has a .301 (22-for-73) opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning but has just three walks in that situation...has allowed a .485 (16-for-33) opponents batting average to the opponents number three hitter.

THIS AND THAT: Has made 11 of his 13 starts at night...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Made his first rehab start July 19 at lowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 3 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)... won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 27...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota May 3...issued a career-high tying four walks...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) May 8 in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning but shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas May 14...had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save...had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-in-

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (9-8, 4.55 ERA): Snapped his career-high tying threegame losing streak in his last start and is now 1-3 with a 7.42 ERA and .362 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch...went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...struck out just seven batters in 17.2 innings, an average of 3.57 per nine innings...left-handed hitters are 23-for-65 (.354) against him over his last 14 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 3-2 with a 4.37 ERA (35.0 ip, 30 h, 17 r, 17 er, 14 bb, 31 so, 3 hr) in six career starts against Seattle...is 1-2 with a 4.09 ERA in three starts this year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

18-21, 4.56 ERA (225 er in 443.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 27-for-47 (57.4%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-15 (46.7%) save opportunities over the last 39 games...is 27-for-47 (57.4%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the fourth fewest saves and the fifth most blown saves (20) in the AL.
- Has a 3.76 ERA (62 er in 148.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.56 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.21).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (164) and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.430).
