OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-75) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (66-68)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (9-8, 4.55) VS. RHP MIKE LEAKE (0-0, —) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) to start the week after sweeping a three-game series from Texas last weekend...are a season-low 17 games under .500 for the fourth time this year (last: 55-72 on Aug. 23)...are 58-75 (.436), which is the second worst record in the American League...it is tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 133 games...were 57-76 last year and 58-75 in 2015... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 98 days in fifth overall...Saturday will be the A's 100th day in sole possession of fifth place, which will mark the seventh time in Oakland history the A's spent at least 100 days alone in last place (last: 142 days in 2015).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley and Jake Smolinski from the disabled list and recalled Franklin Barreto and Sam Moll from Triple-A Nashville today to bring their active roster to 29...Moll will be making his Major League debut and will become the 28th player to pitch for the A's this year...that will be second highest in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...he will be the 51st player they A's have employed, which matches the season total from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 21-44 (.323) on the road compared to 37-31 (.544) at home...have the worst road record in the American League and second worst in the majors (SF, .319)...the home winning percentage is .221 better than the road, which is currently the second biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)... this three-game series with Seattle marks the fifth series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas and are 0-3 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (three games)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-16-2 in road series.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-3 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10... are 21-35 (.375) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-36/.357)...are batting .228 (420-for-1846) and are averaging 3.96 runs per game against the AL West (222 runs in 56 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (105) and unearned runs (77)...are tied for the American League lead in passed balls (16), rank second in fewest outfield assists (18), third in most stolen bases allowed (93) and fourth in most double plays (136).

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs in the fourth inning on Wednesday at Los Angeles (AL) but lost...it marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's scored eight runs in an inning and lost (Aug. 2, 1983 at SEA; April 10, 1998 at NYY)...rank third in the American League in doubles (247) and extra base hits (445)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.243) and most strikeouts (1234) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.316)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012...home runs accounted for 8 of the A's 11 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) and 284 of 587 runs for the season (48.4%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have 187 home runs for the season, which is the 10th highest single season total in Athletics history (9th is 189 in 2004, 8th is 195 in 2012).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with an Athletics franchise record 73 wild pitches (previous: 72 in 1979)...have the fourth highest ERA in the American League (4.73)...A's starting pitchers are 8-12 with a 6.15 ERA (107 er in 156.2 ip) and .316 (205-for-648) opponents batting average over the last 31 games dating back to July 28...starters rank second in the AL in most losses (53), third in fewest strikeouts (564) and tied for third in fewest home runs (103)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 173 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 17 rookies (8 batters, 9 pitchers) and Sam Moll will become the 18th...employed 19 rookies last year...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup four times this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in August...it was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record, which is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one four teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's struck out 244 times in August to set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of August (previous: 235 in 2012)...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August...the record for September is 276...tied for the American League lead in doubles in August (56), ranked third in extra base hits (99), fourth in slugging (.456) and tied for fourth in batting (.260)...the slugging percentage was second best in a full month by an A's team over the last 12 years (.487 in Sept. 2013)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (173) and highest opponents batting average (.285), third in highest slugging percentage (.487) and fourth in highest ERA (5.26)...the ERA was the third highest August ERA in Oakland history and the highest since 2000 (5.54)...allowed 43 home runs, which fell one short of the franchise record for August (44 in 1969).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-51 (.386) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games), .224 (609-for-2722) and 3.93 runs per games at night (326 runs in 83 games)... the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .240).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Phegley and Smolinski from the disabled list today, the A's have four players remaining on the DL (Blackburn, Fowler, Triggs, Wahl)...the last time the A's had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 943 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have two players on the 60-day DL (Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 6-7 against the Mariners...are 3-4 in Seattle and 3-3 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 36-53 (.404) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-277 against the Mariners...that includes 183-124 in Oakland, 156-152 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-88 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (25) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs since the break (10)...*Khris Davis* is tied for second in the AL in home runs (36), ranks fourth in RBI (91) and tied for fifth in extra base hits (60...*Jed Lowrie* ranks second in the majors in doubles (40).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1906** Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...Coombs strikes out 18 and allows 14 hits...in **1974** Sal Bando hits a two-run homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit...it is his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (9-8, 4.55 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Snapped his career-high tying three-game losing streak in his last start and is now 1-3 with a 7.42 ERA (25 er in 30.1 ip) and .362 (51-for-141) opponents batting average over his last seven starts... went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch.

2017 vs. 2016: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season today... made 25 appearances, including 24 starts, in his rookie season last year... has surpassed his totals from last year in wins (9), runs (74), earned runs (66), walks (44), hit batters (7) and wild pitches (6)...has a 4.55 ERA vs. 3.86 last year and a .767 OPS vs. .713 last year.

IN AUGUST: Went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...tied for fifth in the American League in losses in August...the opponents batting average was the highest in the AL among pitchers with 15 or more innings in August and the ERA was third highest...struck out just seven batters in 17.2 innings, an average of 3.57 per nine innings...averaged 8.76 strikeouts per nine innings over the first four months of the season...is now 3-7 with a 5.75 ERA in 11 career starts in August compared to 13-10 with a 3.82 ERA (95 er in 223.2) in all other months.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-3 with a 6.51 ERA (27 er in 37.1 ip) and .337 (56-for-166) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the break...has allowed eight home runs in 37.1 innings since the break after yielding just eight in 93.1 innings before the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Left-handed hitters are 23-for-65 (.354) against him over his last 14 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...has yielded 14 of his 16 home runs and issued 39 of his 44 walks to right-handed hitters...11 of his home runs have come on the road and 11 have been solo shots...opponents are 26-for-77 (.338) with runners in scoring position over his last 13 starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...has a .152 (41-for-269) opponents batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .397 (23-for-58) batting average to the opponents two hitter.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-6 with a 5.05 ERA (35 er in 62.1 ip) in 12 starts against American League West teams compared to 6-2 with a 4.08 ERA (31 er in 68.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: Has allowed 36 of his 74 runs this year over the first two innings of his starts...has a 6.22 ERA (32 er in 46.1 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 3.03 (21 er in 62.1 ip) over innings three through five and an 8.59 ERA (14 er in 14.2 ip) in the sixth inning... has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (7.1 ip)...last year, he allowed just nine runs in the first inning and second inning (1.29 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for third in the American League with four pickoffs and opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for eighth most in the AL...has a 4-1 record in day games, 5-7 at night...tossed fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts from Aug. 1 to 12...is the first A's starting pitcher to toss fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts over the course of one season since Miguel Jimenez did it from April 30-May 12, 1994.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one rehab start before he was reinstated from the DL May 15...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the

second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit or walk.

LAST START: He snapped his three-game losing streak in the A's 8-3 win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a two-run double to Beltre in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...left after five innings with a 6-2 lead.

the win came in the A's 3-1 victory in Oakland on April 21...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...then took the loss in a 6-5 decision at Seattle May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...also lost in a 7-2 decision at Seattle July 7...allowed a RBI single to Cruz in the first inning two runs in the bottom of the third on a RBI single by Cruz and a sacrifice fly by Seager for the loss...the A's were shutout on one hit and two walks over the final six innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (7-10, 5.40 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 2-2 with a 5.94 ERA in six starts since his return... has allowed eight home runs in 33.1 innings (2.16 per nine innings)...has picked up the win in each of his last two starts, which marks the third time in his career he has won back-to-back decisions...has never won three straight...has a 2.13 ERA and .174 opponents batting average over his last two starts...is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (7) and ranks second in strikeouts (91), innings pitched (110.0) and games started (20)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 9 so)...is 1-1 with a 6.06 ERA (16.1 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in three career starts against Seattle...including 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-16 (43.8%) save opportunities over the last 40 games...is 27-for-48 (56.3%) for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...has the fourth fewest saves and is tied for the fourth most blown saves (21) in the AL.
- Has a 3.98 ERA (67 er in 151.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.20).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (165) and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.431).
