OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-77) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (68-68)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 3, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 1:10 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (3-7, 5.21) VS. LHP ANDREW ALBERS (2-1, 4.20) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost all five games of this road trip and six road games in a row overall, which is now their longest road losing streak of the season...are a season-low 19 games under .500...are 58-77 (.430), which is tied for the second worst record in the American League with Detroit...were 57-78 last year and 58-77 in 2015 after 135 games... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 100 days in fifth overall...today will be the A's 101st day in sole possession of fifth place, which will mark the seventh time in Oakland history the A's spent at least 100 days alone in last place (last: 142 days in 2015).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley and Jake Smolinski from the disabled list and recalled Franklin Barreto and Sam Moll from Triple-A Nashville Friday to bring their active roster to 29...Moll made his Major League debut that night, becoming the 28th player to pitch for the A's this year...that is the second highest in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...he is the 51st player the A's have employed, which matches the season total from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 21-46 (.313) on the road compared to 37-31 (.544) at home...have the worst road record in the majors (SF, .319)... the home winning percentage is .231 better than the road, which is currently the biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)... have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...today's series finale wraps up the fifth series in a stretch where the A's played five consecutive series in five different cities... have gone 5-9 over the first 14 games (2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2); 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas; 0-5 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-2))... including this series loss, they are are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-17-2 in road series.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-5 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10. are 21-37 (.362) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-36/.357)...are batting .229 (439-for-1915) and are averaging 3.97 runs per game against the AL West (230 runs in 58 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (107) and unearned runs (79)...are tied for the American League lead in passed balls (16), are tied for second in fewest outfield assists (19), third in most stolen bases allowed (95) and tied for third in most double plays (138).

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs in the fourth inning on Wednesday at Los Angeles (AL) but lost...it marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's scored eight runs in an inning and lost (Aug. 2, 1983 at SEA; April 10, 1998 at NYY)...rank third in the American League in doubles (252) and extra base hits (453)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.243) and most strikeouts (1251) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.316)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012...home runs have accounted for 13 of the A's 19 runs during this road trip and 289 of 595 runs for the season (48.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have 190 home runs for the season, which is the ninth highest single season total in Athletics history (8th is 195 in 2012; 7th is 197 in 1997).

PITCHING: The A's are second in the majors with an Athletics franchise record 74 wild pitches (previous: 72 in 1979)...have the fourth highest ERA in the American League (4.72)...A's starting pitchers are 8-13 with a 6.13 ERA (114 er in 167.1 ip) and .317 (219-for-690) opponents batting average over the last 33 games dating back to July 28...starters rank second in the AL in most losses (54), second in fewest strikeouts (568) and fourth in fewest home runs (107)...are one of three AL teams without a CG (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 175 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone a full season without a complete game.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies (8 batters, 10 pitchers) after Sam Moll's debut Friday...employed 19 rookies last year...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup four times this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in August...it was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record, which is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude March and October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one of four teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's struck out 244 times in August to set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of August (previous: 235 in 2012)...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August...the record for September is 276...tied for the American League lead in doubles in August (56), ranked third in extra base hits (99), fourth in slugging (.456) and tied for fourth in batting (.260)...the slugging percentage was second best in a full month by an A's team over the last 12 years (.487 in Sept. 2013)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (173) and highest opponents batting average (.285), third in highest slugging percentage (.487) and fourth in highest ERA (5.26)...the ERA was the third highest August ERA in Oakland history and the highest since 2000 (5.54)...allowed 43 home runs, which fell one short of the franchise record for August (44 in 1969).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-53 (.376) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games), .225 (628-for-2791) and 3.93 runs per games at night (334 runs in 85 games)... the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .241).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Phegley and Smolinski from the disabled list Friday, the A's have four players remaining on the DL (Blackburn, Fowler, Triggs, Wahl)...before Friday, the last time the A's had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 951 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have two players on the 60-day DL (Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 6-9 against the Mariners...are 3-6 in Seattle and 3-3 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 36-55 (.396) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-279 against the Mariners...that includes 183-124 in Oakland, 156-154 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-90 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs since the break (10)... Khris Davis is tied for first in the AL in home runs (37) and ranks fourth in RBI (92) and extra base hits (61)... Jed Lowrie ranks second in the majors in doubles (41).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1932 Jimmie Foxx hits his 50th and 51st home runs of the season to become the third player to reach 50 in one season, joining Babe Ruth and Hack Wilson...in 1947 Bill McCahan no hits the Washington Senators, 3-0...in 1988 Dennis Eckersley sets an Oakland record with his 37th save of the season...he would go on to save 45, becoming the first Athletic to reach the 40 plateau...in **1997** Ben Grieve makes his major league debut and ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 12-3 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (3-7, 5.21 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3.

LOSSES: Was charged with his seventh loss of the season in his last start, which was the 12th start of his career...is one of five pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least seven games over his first 12 career appearances (Morgan 9, Mazzaro 8, Mengden 7, Anderson 7).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-3 with a 4.33 ERA (17 er in 35.1 ip) and four home runs allowed in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA and eight home runs allowed in six starts before the break...however, has 11 walks in 35.1 innings since the break (2.80 per nine innings) after issuing just five free passes in 30.1 innings before the break (1.48 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-4 with a 4.76 ERA (12 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts against American League West teams compared to 3-3 with a 5.44 ERA (26 er in 43.0 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season today, his eighth in a day game...is 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (26 er in 34.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in seven starts during the day, 1-4 with a 3.48 ERA (12 er in 31.0 ip) and three home runs allowed in five starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .186 (19-for-102) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .359 (60-for-167) after that...has surrendered 10 of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters...has allowed one home run over his last four starts after yielding 11 over his first eight... has held the opposition to a .160 (21-for-131) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 25-for-65 (.385) with six walks (.437 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the opponents number nine hitter is batting .435 (10-for-23) and the eight hitter has a .385 (10-for-26) average.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed his first run in the first inning in his last start and now has a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) and .182 (8-for-44) opponents batting average in the first inning...has received one run of support or fewer in seven of his 12 starts and is 0-6 in those starts...is 3-1 in five starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second start, a 4-1 decision against Houston on June 19, to become the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...allowed two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in his third start on June 24 at Chicago (AL) for his first Major League win...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

LAST START: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Los Angeles last Monday...allowed a run in the first inning on a Calhoun RBI single, but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...then yielded a RBI double to Cowart in the fourth inning to give the Angels the lead for good...also allowed an unearned run in the seventh when Maldonado scored on a Joyce error following a Revere RBI double.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Smith (0-4, 6.27 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and ninth start of the season...the starts are the first of his career...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-3 with an 8.26 ERA and .284 opponents batting average in six games (five starts) since then...has allowed at least one home run in eight of his nine games, including a career-high four on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...has allowed 13 home runs in 47.1 innings, an average of 2.47 per nine innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday (3.2 ip, 5 h, 7 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 1 so, 2 hr)...is 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA (7.0 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against the Angeles, all at Anaheim...the start came in his only outing this year.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-17 (41.1%) save opportunities over the last 42 games...is 27-for-49 (55.1%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 53.7%)...Tied for third fewest saves and is tied for the third most blown saves (22) in the AL.
- Has a 3.89 ERA (68 er in 157.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.59 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.17).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (1668 and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.431).
- Ranks second in the AL in fewest inherited runners (172).
- Has allowed 45 stolen bases, tied for second most in the majors.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on Aug. 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year.
- Tossed 5.1 innings Aug. 12 after pitching 6.0 innings of relief on Aug. 1... is the second Oakland reliever over the last 30 years with two outings greater than 5.0 innings in the same season (Brad Rigby, 1999).
