### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-78) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (70-67)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have been swept in back-to-back series and now have a season-high tying six-game losing streak (also June 28-July 3)...the losing streak has dropped the A's to a season-low 20 games under .500 at 58-78 (.426)...that is tied for the second worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 136 games and matches the A's 136-game record from each of the previous two seasons (lost game 137 in 2015 and 2016)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 101 days in fifth overall...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days alone in last place (last: 142 days in 2015).

**TRAGIC NUMBER:** The A's tragic number for elimination in the American League West is two...have been eliminated from the West before game 140 twice in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977)...currently trail first place Houston by a season-high 25 games with 26 games remaining...this marks the eighth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 25 or more games at any point in the season (1977, 1979, 1982, 1983, 1993, 1997, 2016).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their penultimate homestand of the season today, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Houston (four games)...went 0-6 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...now have a season-high seven-game road losing streak...are 37-31 (.544) at home compared to 21-47 (.309) on the road...the road record is the worst in the majors...the home winning percentage is .235 better than the road, which is currently the biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003)...are 15-18 over the last 33 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...have hit 105 home runs at home, which is tied for fourth in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 2002 (116)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-17-2 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 26-25 (.510) record during day games compared to 32-53 (.376) at night...are batting .270 (481-for-1783) and are averaging 5.16 runs per game during the day (263 runs in 51 games), .225 (628-for-2791) and 3.93 runs per games at night (334 runs in 85 games)...the day batting average is fifth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .241).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-6 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sunday...are 21-38 (.356) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-36/.357)...are batting .228 (444-for-1946) and are averaging 3.93 runs per game against the AL West (232 runs in 59 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors in errors (108) and unearned runs (79)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), tied for second in fewest outfield assists (19) and third in most stolen bases allowed (96) and most double plays (140).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank third in the American League in doubles (253) and extra base hits (455)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.242) and most strikeouts (1259) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.316)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012...the A's have hit 191 home runs, which is the ninth highest single season total in Athletics history (8th is 195 in 2012, 7th is 197 in 1997)...home runs have accounted for 290 of the A's 597 runs (48.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 7.75 ERA (35 er in 40.2 ip), .321 (54-for-168) opponents batting average and 15 home runs allowed in the last five games...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (74) and fourth in highest ERA (4.77), highest opponents batting average (.263), most extra base hits (455) and fewest strikeouts (1016)...the 74 wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers went 0-4 with a 6.98 ERA on the road trip and are now 8-14 with a 6.16 ERA (117 er in 171.2 ip) and .320 (226-for-707) opponents batting average over the last 34 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in most losses (55)

and fewest strikeouts (573) and fourth in fewest home runs (108)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 176 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have used 18 rookies (8 batters, 10 pitchers)...employed 19 rookies last year...had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup four times this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's currently have 29 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which matches the season total from last year...28 of those have pitched, which is the second most pitchers in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years and 107 over the last three

**IN AUGUST:** The A's went 11-16 (.407) in August...it was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record, which is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966...struck out 244 times to set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of August (previous: 235 in 2012)...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August...tied for the American League lead in doubles in August (56), ranked third in extra base hits (99), fourth in slugging (.456) and tied for fourth in batting (.260)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (173) and highest opponents batting average (.285), third in highest slugging percentage (.487) and fourth in highest ERA (5.26).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 955 games (41.5 games per stint)...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games (67.0 games per stint)...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...currently have a season-low four players on the DL (Blackburn, Fowler, Triggs, Wahl), which is the first time the A's had fewer than five players on the DL since Aug. 31, 2015 when they also had four.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive year as they trail 6-10 entering this final three-game series...it marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...are 30-43 against the Angels over the last four years...are 4-3 in Oakland this year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses match Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 10 of the last 12 games at Angel Stadium and 26 of the last 37...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-364 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-441 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 21-24 on Labor Day since moving to Oakland...are 13-17 in the Coliseum and 8-7 on the road...are 4-7 against the Angels, including 2-4 in Oakland...the two clubs also met on Labor Day last year, a 10-7 A's loss in Oakland, and the A's have lost each of their last four Labor Day meetings with the Angels...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs since the break (10)...**Khris Davis** is tied for second in the AL in home runs (37), ranks fourth in RBI (92) and tied for fifth in extra base hits (62)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the majors in doubles (41).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...in **2000** Mike Stanley is a perfect 5-for-5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...in **2002** the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-4, 6.27 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and ninth start of the season... today will mark his first appearance in a day game... the starts are the first of his career...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-3 with an 8.26 ERA (26 er in 28.1 ip) and .284 (33-for-116) opponents batting average in six games (five starts) since then...his only career win came in his second career outing over nine years ago on June 24, 2008 with Boston against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed at least one home run in eight of his nine games, including a career-high four on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...has allowed 13 home runs in 47.1 innings, an average of 2.47 per nine innings... that is the third highest mark in Athletics history among pitcher with 40 or more innings pitched (2.93, Curt Young in 1985; 2.79, Vida Blue in 1969)... has allowed 32 home runs in 139.2 career innings (2.06 per nine innings).

**IN AUGUST:** Went 0-3 with an 8.49 ERA (22 er in 23.1 ip) and nine home runs allowed in five games (four starts) in the month of August...based on a minimum of 20 innings pitched, he had the fourth highest August ERA in the American League...using the same minimum, it was the highest August ERA by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 9.00 ERA in 2000.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 10 of his 36 runs in the first inning for a 11.25 ERA (10 er in 8.0 ip)...has a combined 3.38 ERA (6 er in 16.0 ip) in the second and third innings and a 6.56 ERA (17 er in 23.1 ip) from the fourth inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 12 of his 17 walks to left-handed hitters but has surrendered 12 of his 13 home runs to right-handers... has a .970 OPS against righties, .690 against lefties...has allowed 48 hits, 26 of which are for extra bases (12 doubles, one triple)...has a .540 opponents slugging percentage...almost half of his career hits allowed are extra base hits (62 of 125, 49.6%)...has allowed a .318 (14-for-44) batting average with runners in scoring position but opponents are 4-for-18 (.222) with RISP and two outs...has a .324 (22-for-68) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .240 (18-for-75) the second time and .182 (8-for-44) the third time...has held the two, three and fourth hitter in the batting order to a combined .200 (13-for-65) batting average...opponents are 16-for-45 (.356) with four walks, five doubles, a triple and four home runs when leading off an inning (.408 on-base percentage, .778 slugging percentage).

**SUPPORT:** Has received three runs of support or fewer in seven of his eight starts (18 rs in 43.1 ip, 3.74 RSA)...his overall run support average is 3.61 (19 rs in 47.1 ip)...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his seven starts (July 18, Aug. 15).

**CAREER HIGHS:** Has pitched parts of five seasons in the majors over the last 10 years...his eight starts and four losses are the first of his career and he also has career highs in innings pitched (47.1), hits (48), runs (36), earned runs (33) and home runs (13)...his 17 walks are two short of his high of 19 in 2009 and his 26 strikeouts are nine short of his best of 35 in 2009.

**AGE AT FIRST START:** His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

**2017 APPEARANCES:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle **July 8**...left after six innings with the score tied 3-3...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay **July 18** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...left with a 3-2 lead but Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto **July 24**...allowed a solo home run to Martin in the first and two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Carrera and Goins...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Minnesota on **July 29** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven hits...pitched in relief in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco **Aug. 3**...tossed the final four innings and allowed four runs, all in the fifth...blanked the Giants on two hits and a walk over the final three innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Baltimore in Oakland on **Aug. 10**...allowed a career-high tying seven hits, including a career-high four home runs...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 win over Kansas City **Aug. 15** in Oakland...retired 15 of the final 16 batters he faced and left after 5.1 innings with a 4-3 lead but the bullpen allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save (Casilla)...he was

the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Baltimore **Aug. 21**...allowed five runs in 4.1 innings.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-2 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday...allowed a career-high seven runs in 3.2 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter...yielded five of the runs in the first inning on a Revere RBI single, a Simmons sacrifice fly and a Cron three-run home run...was also charged with one of the Angels two runs in the fourth inning, a Maldonado home run.

**SMITH vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA (7.0 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, all at Anaheim...the start came in his only outing this year (see last start above)...faced the Angels once last year on Sept. 28 in the A's 8-6 loss (2.1 ip, 1 h, 4 bb, 3 so)...his other outing came on June 14, 2010 while pitching for Milwaukee...pitched the ninth inning of the Brewers 12-2 win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so).

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games...his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers... issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha...moved back into the starting rotation May 28...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13...combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**

**RHP Kendall Graveman (4-4, 4.54 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 2-2 with a 5.57 ERA and .331 opponents batting average in six starts since his return...was placed on the DL retroactive to May 26 with a right shoulder strain...is 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA in seven starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA in seven starts on the road... is 2-2 with a 5.57 ERA in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 2-2 with a 3.83 ERA in eight starts before the break...is now 7-11 with a 4.57 ERA in 32 career games after the break compared to 13-13 with a 3.89 ERA in 39 starts before the break...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-8 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA (58.2 ip, 61 h, 25 r, 24 er, 13 bb, 42 so, 9 hr) in 10 career starts against Los Angeles...is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (24.0 ip, 25 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) in four starts this year.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 27-for-49 (55.1%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-17 (41.1%) save opportunities over the last 43 games...is 27-for-49 (55.1%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 54.8%)...Tied for fourth in fewest saves and is tied for the third most blown saves (22) in the AL.
- Has a 4.18 ERA (75 er in 161.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.69 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.24).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (172) and in highest opponents slugging percentage (.436).
- Ranks second in the AL in fewest inherited runners (175).
- Has allowed 45 stolen bases, third most in the majors.
