## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-79) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (71-67)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (4-4, 4.54) VS. RHP GARRETT RICHARDS (0-0, 0.00) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost a season-high seven consecutive games to fall to a season-low 21 games under .500 at 58-79 (.423)...that is tied for the second worst record in the American League and tied for fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 137 games and matches the A's 137-game record from each of the previous two seasons...with a loss tonight, the A's will have their worst record after 138 games since 1997 (53-85)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 102 days in fifth overall.

**SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK:** The A's have a seven-game losing streak, which matches their longest losing streak over last five years (Aug. 11-17, 2015; June 3-11, 2016)...have not lost more than seven straight since May 22-June 1, 2012 when they had a nine-game losing streak... have been out-scored 52-30 during the streak...the pitching staff has a 7.24 ERA (48 er in 59.2 ip) and has surrendered 18 home runs...starters are 0-4 with an 8.18 ERA (30 er in 33.0 ip) and have tossed four innings or fewer in four of the seven games...the offense is hitting .253 (62-for-245) with 10 doubles and 11 home runs.

**ELIMINATED:** The A's loss yesterday coupled with a Houston win officially eliminated Oakland from the American League West in game 137...that is the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977)...trail the Astros by a season-high 26 games...this marks the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 26 or more games at any point in the season (1977, 1979, 1993, 1997, 2016)...have a tragic number of 13 to be eliminated from the playoffs.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Houston (four games)...went 0-6 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...now have a season-high seven-game road losing streak...are 37-32 (.536) at home compared to 21-47 (.309) on the road...the home winning percentage is .227 better than the road, which is currently the biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003)...the road record is the worst in the majors...have hit 107 home runs at home, which is fourth in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 2002 (116)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-17-2 in road series.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-7 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sunday... are 21-39 (.350) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-37/.351).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors in errors (109) and unearned runs (79)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), tied for second in fewest outfield assists (19) and third in most stolen bases allowed (98) and most double plays (141).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank third in the American League in doubles (254) and extra base hits (458)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.244) and most strikeouts (1270) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.317)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012...the A's have hit 193 home runs, which is the ninth highest single season total in Athletics history (8th is 195 in 2012, 7th is 197 in 1997)...home runs have accounted for 293 of the A's 606 runs (48.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 18 home runs in the last six games and have an 8.01 ERA (46 er in 51.2 ip) and .318 (68-for-214) opponents batting average over that span...have surrendered 182 home runs for the season, which is fourth most in Oakland history...yielded 185 home runs last year...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (75) and fourth in highest ERA (4.80), highest opponents batting average (.264) and most extra base hits (461)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 8-14 with a 6.38 ERA (124 er in 175.0 ip) and .322 (233-for-723) opponents batting average over

the last 35 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (576), tied for second in most losses (55) and fourth in fewest home runs (111)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 177 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

**ROSTER NOTES:** With the additions of Alcantara, Mengden, Nuñez and Wendle today, the A's now have 33 players on the active roster...currently have used 51 players this year, but Nuñez and Wendle will bring the total to 53, which would be second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have already used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have used 18 rookies (8 batters, 10 pitchers), including eight players who have made their Major League debut...Nuñez and Wendle would bring the rookie total to 20, which would be the second most rookies in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 26-26 (.500) record during day games compared to 32-53 (.376) at night...went 11-16 (.407) in August, which was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966...struck out 244 times in August to set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of August (previous: 235 in 2012)...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 959 games (41.7 games per stint)...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games (67.0 games per stint)...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...currently have a season-low four players on the DL (Blackburn, Fowler, Triggs, Wahl), which is the first time the A's had fewer than five players on the DL since Aug. 31, 2015 when they also had four.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive year as they trail 6-11 with two games remaining...Oakland's most losses to the Angels in a season is 12 (2009 and 2016)...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...are 30-44 against the Angels over the last four years...are 4-4 in Oakland this year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses match Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-365 against the Angels...that includes 222-171 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-442 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Matt Chapman* leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break...is tied for the American League lead among rookies in home runs since the break (10) and ranks second in RBI (24)...*Khris Davis* is tied for second in the AL in home runs (37), ranks third in RBI (95) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (63)...*Jed Lowrie* ranks second in the majors in doubles (41)...*Matt Olson* has 10 home runs dating back to Aug. 11, which are tied for the most in the AL over that span.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw tosses a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win the first game of a doubleheader at Boston...in **1951** Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...in **1973** Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13th consecutive win... he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (4-4, 4.54 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 2-2 with a 5.57 ERA (20 er in 32.1 ip) and .331 (44-for-133) opponents batting average in six starts since his return...was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA (13 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA (27 er in 36.0 ip) in seven starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 10-10 with a 3.47 ERA (74 er in 192.0 ip) in 31 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.90 ERA (103 er in 189.0 ip) in 34 starts on the road.

**PRE AND POST:** Is 2-2 with a 5.57 ERA (20 er in 32.1 ip) in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 2-2 with a 3.83 ERA in eight starts before the break...is now 7-11 with a 4.57 ERA (82 er in 161.1 ip) in 32 career games after the break compared to 13-13 with a 3.89 ERA in 39 starts before the break.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 3-2 with a 3.39 ERA (23 er in 61.0 ip) in 10 starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA (17 er in 18.1 ip) in four starts against everyone else.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed 15 of his 41 runs in the first inning for a 9.64 ERA (15 er in 14.0 ip)...has a 3.44 ERA (25 er in 65.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .377 (23-for-61) in the first inning, .268 (67-for-250) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .254 (35-for-138) average against left-handed hitters compared to .318 (55-for-173) against right-handers... entered the season with a .273 average against lefties, .272 against right-ies...seven of the 10 home runs he has allowed this year have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .270 (20-for-74) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .161 (5-for-31) with RISP and two outs...the opponents number four hitter is batting .500 (18-for-36) with four doubles and four home runs (.944 slugging percentage).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-4 with a 5.36 ERA (25 er in 42.0 ip) and .321 (54-for-168) opponents average in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-0 with a 3.62 ERA (15 er in 37.1 ip) and .252 (36-for-143) opponents batting average in six starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Has made 12 of his 14 starts at night...allowed three home runs in his last start after surrendering just seven home runs over his first 13 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 double-header.

**REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made his first rehab start July 19 at Iowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starter on April 3 against Los Angeles (AL) and picked up the win in a 4-2 decision...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)... won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings on April 14 against Houston, his first career start without a strikeout...issued a career-high tying four walks May 3 at Minnesota...left his start on May 14 at Texas with a 4-3 lead but Madson blew the save...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (Aug. 8 vs. Seattle, Aug. 30 at Los Angeles-AL)...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in a 9-3 victory over Baltimore Aug. 13.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday...allowed a solo home run to Trout in the first and a two-run home run to Pujols in the third...Oakland then scored eight times

**GRAVEMAN vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA (58.2 ip, 61 h, 25 r, 24 er, 13 bb, 42 so, 9 hr) in 10 career starts...is 1-2 with a 4.96 ERA (18 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts in Anaheim and 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland... is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (24.0 ip, 25 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) in four starts this year...the win came in the A's 4-2 victory in Oakland on Opening Day, April 3...became the A's 11th dif-

ferent Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...then took the loss in a 2-1 decision at Los Angeles April 27...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters... shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) May 8 in Oakland... surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th...also had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss at Anaheim last Wednesday (see last start above).




