OAKLAND ATHLETICS (59-80) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (86-53)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high eight-game losing streak with a 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Wednesday...it was their longest losing streak since a nine-game skid from May 22-June 1, 2012...are 21 games under .500, which is one short of the season-low of 22 under (58-80 on Sept. 5)...are 59-80 (.424), which is tied for the second worst record in the American League and tied for fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 139 games and is the worst since 1997 (54-85)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 105 days in fifth overall...trail the Astros by a season-high 27 games for the third consecutive day...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 27 or more games at any point in the season (1977, 1979, 2016).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (four games)...are 38-33 (.535) at home compared to 21-47 (.309) on the road...the home winning percentage is .226 better than the road, which is currently the biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003)...the road record is the worst in the majors...have hit 111 home runs at home, which is fourth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history (126 in 2000, 116 in 2002, 113 in 1996, 112 in 1999)...went 0-6 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...now have a season-high seven-game road losing streak...begin a nine-game road trip to Boston (three games), Philadelphia (three games) and Detroit (three games) on Tuesday

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 4-8 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sunday... are 22-40 (.355) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 21-38/.356).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (109) and unearned runs (79)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (101), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20) and fourth in most double plays (141).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .270 (143-for-529) with 29 doubles, 1 triple, 28 home runs and 75 runs scored over the last 15 games (5.0 runs per game)...however, have lost 10 of 15 games over that stretch...rank third in the AL in doubles (260) and extra base hits (469)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.244) and most strikeouts (1294) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.317)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have 197 home runs, which is tied for the seventh highest single season total in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999, 205 in 2002, 199 in 2001, 199 in 1987, 197 in 1997)... need three more home runs to reach 200 for the fifth time in Athletics history...home runs have accounted for 298 of the A's 616 runs (48.4%)... the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 19 home runs in the last eight games and have a 7.00 ERA (55 er in 70.2 ip) and .298 (84-for-285) opponents batting average over that span...have surrendered 183 home runs for the season, which is fourth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 185 in 2016)...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (76) and fourth in highest ERA (4.80)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in six of the last eight games and are 1-3 with a 7.71 ERA (32 er in 37.1 ip) and 13 home runs allowed over that span...both of the outings longer than five innings are by Sean Manaea...starters are now 9-14 with a 6.19 ERA (128 er in 186.0 ip) and .319 (243-for-764) opponents batting average over the last 37 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (585), third in most losses (55) and fourth in fewest home runs (111) and highest ERA (4.86)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 179 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...on Wednesday, Renato Nuñez became the 52nd player to appear in a game for Oakland this year, which is tied for third most in Athletics history...Joey Wendle would become number 53, which would be second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)... have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

ROOKIES: The A's have used 19 rookies (9 batters, 10 pitchers), including eight players who have made their ML debut...the 19 rookies are tied for second most in Oakland history...Wendle would bring the rookie total to 20, which would be one short of the Oakland record of 21 set in 2008.

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Monday...that is the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977)...have a tragic number of 10 to be eliminated from the playoffs.

DOUBLEHEADERS: The A's will play their first ever doubleheader against Houston tomorrow as a result of an April 16 rain out...it is their second doubleheader of the season as they split a June 10 twin-bill at Tampa Bay... it is the A's first doubleheader at home since May 7, 2014, a split with Seattle...have not swept a doubleheader since Aug. 22, 1998 against Detroit in Oakland...have played nine single-admission doubleheaders since then...have been swept four times and split five.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a 27-26 (.509) record during day games compared to 32-54 (.372) at night...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...have a run differential of -118, which is second lowest in the American League...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours and 48 minutes per game over the last five games and 3 hours, 9 minutes and 46 seconds for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 3-12 with four games remaining...Oakland's most losses ever against Houston came last year when they went 6-13...are 0-6 in Oakland and 3-6 in Houston...the Oakland record for most losses at

home against one team is 8 (CWS, 1971; LAA, 2009; SEA, 2007 and 2016)...have lost 10 in a row in the Colise-um and have dropped 16 of the last 21 games at Minute Maid Park... have lost 19 of their last 22 games to Houston overall and are batting .200 (144-for-721) with 62 runs scored (2.8 per game) over that stretch, which dates back to July 20, 2016...are 18-35 (.340) against the Astros over the last three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...the A's lead the all-time series 49-48...are 25-22 in Oakland and 24-26 in Houston.

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break... Khris Davis needs one more home run to become the third player in Oakland history with 40 home runs (McGwire 3, Canseco 2)...needs one more RBI to become the first Athletic with back-to-back 100 RBI seasons since Tejada (2000-03) and Chavez (2001-03)... Jed Lowrie is tied for second in the majors and tied for fourth in Oakland history with 42 doubles

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1916 switch hitter Wally Schang becomes the first American Leaguer to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game...in 1965 Bert Campaneris plays all nine positions in a game against the Angels...in 1978 Mike Edwards sets an Oakland record by scoring five runs in the A's 11-4 win at Texas...in 1984 Carney Lansford collects four hits in the A's 9-5 win at Cleveland, including the 1000th hit of his career off Steve Farr...in **1992** Carney Lansford is 5 for 6 with five RBI in the A's 14-2 win at California...in **2002** Barry Zito wins his 20th game as he combines with Jim Mecir and Ricardo Rincon on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Minnesota...Zito would go on to win 23 games and the AL Cv Young.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (7-10, 5.53 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 2-2 with a 6.27 ERA (26 er in 37.1 ip) and .285 (43-for-151) opponents batting average in seven starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his last five starts and has surrendered nine home runs in 28.2 innings total over that stretch (2.83 per nine innings)...has allowed 24 home runs for the season, which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last four years...the 24 home runs are tied for second most in Oakland history by a rookie and are three short of the Oakland record of 27 set by Trevor Cahill in 2009...13 of his home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for second most in the American League...12 have come over the first two innings, including seven in the second inning, which is tied for third most in the AL.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among AL rookies in wins (7) and ranks second in strikeouts (92), innings pitched (114.0) and games started (21)...this marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the AL in balks (2), tied for fourth in unearned runs (11), tied for seventh in wild pitches (9) and tied for eighth in losses (10)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fifth most in the AL.

TWO STRAIGHT: Has two wins and a no decision over his last three starts, which marks the third time in his career he has won back-to-back decisions...has never won three straight...has a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) and .231 (15-for-65) opponents batting average over his last three starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-6 with a 7.09 ERA (47 er in 59.2 ip) and 15 home runs allowed in 11 starts in Oakland compared to 4-4 with a 3.81 ERA (23 er in 54.1 ip) and nine home runs allowed in 10 starts on the road compared to...has the second highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at home (Jimenez, BAL 7.34)...the highest home ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more innings at home is 7.46 by Mark Redman in 2004

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-7 with a 7.53 ERA (41 er in 49.0 ip) and .341 (71for-208) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 6-3 with a 4.02 ERA (29 er in 65.0 ip) and .205 (48-for-234) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...has the fourth highest night ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at night but is tied for second in day wins...leads the majors in home runs allowed during the day (15)...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-7 with a 6.37 ERA (46 er in 65.0 ip) in 13 career starts at night, 8-3 with a 3.56 ERA (31 er in 78.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-5 with a 6.49 ERA (38 er in 52.2 ip) in 10 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 2-2 with a 5.63 ERA (20 er in 32.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest and 1-4 with a 6.90 ERA

first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5... yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...had a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from May 9 to June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville before he was reinstated July 30...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings in an 8-3 win over Texas on Aug. 27.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Seattle last Saturday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Cano in the bottom of the third...Oakland then scored four times in the fourth to take a

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs. went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)... then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

GAME 1 RHP Daniel Gossett (3-7, 5.21 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 5.87 ERA and .369 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-2 A's loss at Seattle last Sunday (3.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (11.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two career starts against Houston, both this year...
