OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-81) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (82-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: After last night's win, have won six of their last seven games after a season-high eight-game losing streak...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the third consecutive season...it would mark the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have a .441 winning percentage, which is third lowest in the American League and seventh lowest in the majors...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 111 days in fifth overall...should the A's remain in last the rest of the way, they will spend 129 days in sole possession of last, which would be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high eight-game losing streak last night, which matched their second longest road losing streak over the last 12 years (had a nine-game road losing streak last year from May 24-June 11)...are now 22-48 (.314) on the road compared to 42-33 (.560) at home...the home winning percentage is .246 better than the road, which is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)...have the worst road record in the majors and have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 48 road losses are the most by a A's team since 2011 when they went 31-50...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...are 1-1 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-1), Philadelphia (three games) and Detroit (three games)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)...went 0-6 on the last trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (4-0) and have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 3-17-2 in road series.

MORE HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .228 (71-for-312) with 16 doubles, 11 home runs and 36 runs scored (4.0 runs per game) over their last nine road games (1-8 record)...have a 6.93 ERA (59 er in 76.2 ip) and .321 (101-for-315) opponents batting average...are hitting .335 with 23 doubles, 3 triples, 21 home runs and 76 runs scored over the last nine home games (8.4 runs per game) and are 7-2 in those games...have a 4.18 ERA and .244 opponents batting average.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (113) and unearned runs (80)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (103) and double plays (148) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .280 (198-for-708) with 42 doubles, 4 triples, 38 home runs and 121 runs scored over the last 20 games (6.05 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in doubles (274) and extra base hits (498)...however, have the second most strikeouts (1350) and fourth lowest batting average (.246)...the strikeouts are second most in Athletics history to the record of 1387 set in 2012.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 40 home runs in the last 21 games and have 209 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it is the fourth highest total in Athletics history and is the most since 2000 (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...A's players have 18 individual multi-homer games, which is second most in Oakland history (20 in 1996)...home runs have accounted for 321 of the A's 665 runs (48.3%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed 27 home runs in the last 14 games and has a 6.04 ERA (83 er in 123.2 ip) over that span...have surrendered 191 home runs for the season, which is third most in Oakland history and the most since 1997 (197)...the record is 205 in 1996...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (78), third in highest ERA (4.79), and fourth in fewest strikeouts (1080)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed seven or more earned runs in three of its last nine games...starters have allowed one run or fewer three times over that span...starters are now 12-15 with a 6.18 ERA (149 er in 217.0 ip) and .316 (282-for-891) opponents batting average

over the last 43 contests dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (610) and fourth in highest ERA (4.90), most losses (56) and fewest home runs (117)...are one of four teams without a complete game (ATL, CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 185 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...entering this season, 13 teams in Major League history have gone an entire season without a complete game...the Athletics have never done it.

ROOKIES: A's rookies drove in four of their seven runs last night and are batting a combined .307 (46-for-150) with 36 runs scored, eight doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 37 RBI and 19 walks over the last nine games...the A's have used 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...had seven rookies in the starting lineup in the second game of the doubleheader Saturday...have had exactly six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup five times and at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 30-26 (.536) during day games compared to 34-55 (.382) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 38-41 (.481) against everyone else...have a run differential of -98, which is third lowest in the AL...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 2 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have won the season series, as they have won four of six games with one remaining...have split two games in Boston after winning three of four in Oakland in May...last night's win snapped a seven-game losing streak at Fenway Park, which was their longest since an eight-game losing streak from May 19, 1996-July 22, 1997...had allowed 51 runs in the last four games at Fenway before surrendering just three last night...lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 6-12 against Boston over the last three years...that includes 5-5 in the Coliseum and 1-7 at Fenway...are 240-293 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 145-121 in Oakland, 94-171 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 882-1074 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (16) and extra base hits (30) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** needs one more home run to join Jimmie Foxx (1932-34) as the only players in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...**Jed Lowrie** ranks tied for second in Oakland history and tied for seventh in Athletics history with 45 doubles...the Oakland record for doubles in a season is 47 by Jason Giambi in 2001...**Matt Olson** has seven home runs in his last 10 games and 10 in his last 15...has 14 home runs since the break, which is second most among Major League rookies (Hoskins, PHI 17)...his 10 home runs since Aug. 27 are second most in the majors (J.D. Martinez, 11).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (4-8, 5.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 4.64 ERA (11 er in 21.1 ip) and .333 (29-for-87) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season today, his 10th in a day game...is 3-4 with a 6.09 ERA (30 er in 44.1 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in eight starts during the day, 1-4 with a 3.48 ERA (12 er in 31.0 ip) and three home runs allowed in five starts at night.

LOSSES: Has eight losses over the first 14 starts of his career...is one of four pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least eight games over his first 14 career appearances (Morgan 11, Mengden 9, Mazzaro 8).

BASES ON BALLS: Walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts and walked just three batters in 26.0 innings total over that span (1.04 per nine innings)...has walked two batters or more in seven of his nine starts since then and has issued 21 free passes in 49.1 innings over that stretch (3.83 per nine innings).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed three runs in the first inning over his last three starts after allowing no runs in the first over his first 11 starts...has combined for a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) in innings one and two and has a 6.65 ERA (35 in 47.1 ip) from the third inning on...has surrendered 18 of his 47 runs in the fourth inning for an 10.66 ERA (15 er in 12.2 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two home runs over his last six starts (32.0 ip, 0.56 per nine innings) after yielding 11 over his first eight (43.1 ip, 2.28 per nine innings)...has a .292 (38-for-130) opponents batting average with 12 walks against left-handed hitters and .298 (53-for-179) with 12 walks against right-handers...however, has surrendered 10 of his 13 home runs to righties...has a .214 (25-for-117) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .346 (66-for-191) after that...opponents are 30-for-74 (.405) with eight walks (.463 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the opponents number nine hitter is batting .440 (11-for-25) and the eight hitter has a .367 (11-for-30) average.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in eight of his 14 starts and is 0-7 in those starts...is 4-1 in six starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second start, a 4-1 decision against Houston on June 19, to become the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...allowed two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in his third start on June 24 at Chicago (AL) for his first Major League win...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...allowed a career-high nine hits...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...matched his career-high with 7.0 innings pitched in a 6-1 win at San Francisco Aug. 2...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 28...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday in Oakland...struck out a career-high seven batters...shutout the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a Bregman RBI double...walked Fisher to start the seventh and was relieved by Dull with a 6-1 lead.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

2016 RECAP: Pitched at three different levels in the A's farm system and combined for a 10-6 record and a 2.69 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...led the A's farm system in strikeouts (151), ranked second in innings pitched (153.2), tied for second in wins and sixth in ERA...had career highs in wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and wild pitches (18) and matched his high in games and games started...surrendered just eight home runs, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...was 5-4 with a 3.47 ERA over his first 16 starts through July 7...then went 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA over his final 11 starts beginning July 13...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .219 against right-handed hitters and .224 against left-handers.

RHP Daniel Mengden (0-1, 7.07 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and had a no decision in his only start since his return in the second game of the doubleheader last Saturday in Oakland, an 11-4 A's win over Houston (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...has never faced Philadelphia in his career...has made five of his 17 career starts against the National League...is 1-3 with a 4.60 ERA in five career interleague starts compared to 1-7 with a 7.62 ERA in 12 starts against the American League... began the season on the 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with the Sounds.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 8-of-19 (42.1%) save opportunities over the last 52 games...is 28-for-51 (54.9%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 54.5%)...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the third fewest saves.
- Has a 4.12 ERA (91 er in 198.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.24).
- Has allowed 74 home runs, which is second most in the AL and tied with the Oakland record set in 2015...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is tied for first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (187), is second in highest opponents slugging percentage (.433), is tied for third in most losses (25) and is fourth in fewest wins (20).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (187).
- Has allowed 48 stolen bases, which is third in the majors.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year...made his first appearance last Friday.
- Was on the Opening Day roster and made one start before moving to the bullpen...was 0-1 with a 16.71 ERA in three games when he was designated for assignment April 25 and outrighted to Nashville April 29.
