OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-82) VS. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (57-89)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost 6-2 at Boston yesterday to clinch a losing record for the third consecutive season...this marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have won six of the last eight games after losing a season-high eight in a row...are 64-82 (.438) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League and seventh worst in the majors... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 112 days in fifth overall.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's conclude interleague play with this three-game series at Philadelphia...are 5-12 (.294), which is tied with the Reds for the second worst record in the majors to the Phillies (4-13, .235)...have clinched a losing record in interleague play for the second consecutive year and seventh time in 21 seasons...have also clinched at least the third worst interleague record in Oakland history (5-13/.278 in 2009, 7-13/.350 in 2016)...have a 6.17 ERA (104 er in 151.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (5.90)...the highest in Oakland history is 5.77 in 1998...have set Oakland interleague records for runs allowed (112) and extra base hits (74), have matched the record for home runs (26, also 2000 and 2003) and are closing in on the record for hits (179, record is 188 in 2000)...the offense is batting .254 (147-for-579) but has 72 walks, which is seventh most in the majors...have hit 25 home runs, which is four short of the Oakland interleague record of 29 (1999 and 2000)...are 203-178 (.533) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-12 (.083) with a run, walk, eight strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year...pitchers are 4-for-73 (.055) over the last four seasons and are batting .079 (30-for-382) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 11 walks and 183 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .086)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odum on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odum also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (three games) and Detroit (three games)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)...the win on Wednesday snapped an eight-game road losing streak and the A's have now lost nine of their last 10 road games...are 22-49 (.310) on the road and have the worst road record in the majors... have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 49 road losses are second most by an A's team over the last 20 years and are the most since the 2011 club went 31-50...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...have a 42-33 (.560) record in Oakland and the home winning percentage is .250 better than the road...that is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)... have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 3-18-2 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (114) and unearned runs (80)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (104) and double plays (151) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .279 (206-for-739) with 44 doubles, 4 triples, 39 home runs and 123 runs scored over the last 21 games (5.9 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in doubles (276) and extra base hits (501)...however, have the fourth lowest batting average (.246).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 41 home runs in the last 22 games and have 210 for the season...that is the fourth highest total in Athletics history and is the most since 2000 (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...A's players have 18 individual multi-homer games, which is second most in Oakland history (20 in 1996)...home runs have accounted for 322 of the A's 667 runs (48.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 1361 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1407) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1429)...it is 26 short of the Athletics record of 1387 set in 2012.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed 28 home runs in the last 15 games and has a 6.08 ERA (89 er in 131.2 ip) over that span...have surrendered 192 home runs for the season, which is third most in Oakland history and the most since 1997 (197)...the record is 205 in 1996...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (78) and fourth in highest ERA (4.81) and fewest strikeouts (1085)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-16 with a 6.15 ERA (152 er in 222.1 ip) and .315 (287-for-911) opponents batting average over the last 44 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (613) and fourth in highest ERA (4.90), most losses (57) and fewest home runs (118)...are one of four teams in the majors without a complete game (ATL, CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 186 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...entering this season, 13 teams in Major League history have gone an entire season without a complete game...the Athletics have never done it.

ROOKIES: A's rookies are batting a combined .285 (47-for-165) with 12 home runs and 37 RBI over the last 10 games...the A's have used 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts... had seven rookies in the starting lineup in the second game of the double-header last Saturday...have had exactly six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup five times and at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 30-27 (.526) during day games compared to 34-55 (.382) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 38-42 (.475) against everyone else...have a run differential of -102, which is second lowest in the AL...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 5 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's and Phillies are meeting for the sixth time in interleague play...the home team has won two of three games in each of the previous five meetings...the A's lead the all-time series, 8-7...are 6-3 in Oakland and 2-4 in Philadelphia...are 1-2 at Citizens Bank Park...last met in 2014 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...last met in Philadelphia in 2011 when the A's dropped two of three.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (16) and extra base hits (30) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** needs one more home run to join Jimmie Foxx (1932-34) as the only players in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for second in Oakland history and tied for seventh in Athletics history with 45 doubles...the Oakland record for doubles in a season is 47 by Jason Giambi in 2001...**Matt Olson** has homered in each of the A's last six series and is batting .306 (19-for-62) with 10 home runs and 19 RBI in 17 games over that span...has 14 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is second most among Major League rookies (Hoskins, PHI 18).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommel defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in **1971** the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-1, 7.07 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and had a no decision in his only start since his return in the second game of the doubleheader last Saturday in Oakland (2 er in 6.0 ip, 3.00 ERA)...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...began the season on the 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...started a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season today, his second in an interleague game...had a no decision in a 10-4 A's win over Washington on June 3 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...this will be the 18th start of his career and his sixth against the National League...is 1-3 with a 4.60 ERA (15 er in 29.2 ip) in five career interleague starts compared to 1-7 with a 7.62 ERA in 12 starts against the American League.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0-for-2 with a strikeout in his Major League debut on June 11, 2016 at Cincinnati...also went 0-for-4 with two strikeouts on June 27, 2016 at San Francisco...is 0-for-6 with three strikeouts in his career...never batted in the minors.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season today, his first in a night game...is 0-1 in three starts during the day this year and 0-7 in eight starts in his career.

LOSSES: Is 2-10 in 17 career starts...the 10 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 17 career games...Mike Morgan has the most as he was 2-13 in 16 career games with the A's.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland on May 29...allowed three home runs, which marks the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in a start...yielded a leadoff home run to Jackson in the third inning and then surrendered four runs in the fourth inning on back-to-back homers by Santana and Encarnacion, a RBI singles by Gomes and a Jackson sacrifice fly.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-4 win over Washington on June 3...Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the first but he allowed a Drew sacrifice fly in the second...the A's built a 6-1 lead before he allowed a three-run home run to Lind in the third...had a 7-4 lead when he was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-4 win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland in the second game of the doubleheader...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first five innings but Peacock shutout the A's on three hits over the first five innings...Mengden allowed three runs in the sixth on a two-run home run by Altuve and a RBI single by Reddick but Oakland tied the game in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Moll to start the seventh

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in nine starts with Nashville...missed two months of the season while he was on the disabled list from June 9 to Aug. 13 with a strained right oblique...was sent to the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League Aug. 4 for a two-start rehab assignment and did not allow a run in 5.0 innings (1 h, 3 bb, 9 so)...combined with both clubs for a 2-4 record, a 3.69 ERA and .237 opponents batting average...the batting average broke down to .190 (15-for-79) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (26-for-94) against right-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...yielded a .217 average with runners in scoring position...tossed more than five innings in just two of his starts.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: His first three starts with the Sounds were on a rehab assignment from Oakland and he went 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA and

.220 opponents batting average...tossed 3.2 innings in each of his first two starts but then struck out a season-high seven while allowing just one run in 6.0 innings in a 13-3 win at Fresno May 18...was reinstated from the Oakland disabled list and optioned to Nashville May 20...combined with Chris Smith on a three-hit shutout in Nashville's 10-0 win over Omaha May 23...tossed a season-high seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...was promoted to Oakland May 29...was optioned back to Nashville June 3 but did not pitch before going on the disabled list June 9 with a strained right oblique...made two rehab starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings Aug. 4 against the Dodgers and 3.0 scoreless and hitless innings Aug. 9 at the Cubs...was reinstated Aug. 14 and went 0-3 with a 6.09 ERA over his final five starts with the Sounds...walked a season-high four batters in back-to-back starts on Aug. 19 against Iowa and Aug. 24 against Round Rock...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in just 4.0 innings on the 24th...yielded a season-high four runs on a season-high eight hits in 5.0 innings in a 9-3 loss to Omaha on Aug. 29.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in his third professional season after beginning the year with no experience above Single-A...went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts with Double-A Midland, 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts with Triple-A Nashville and 2-9 with a 6.50 ERA in 14 starts over two stints with Oakland...his ERA with the A's was second highest in the majors among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched (Blair, ATL 7.59)...his .182 winning percentage was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decisions (Morgan, PHI .154) and sixth lowest in Oakland history...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (72.0) and strikeouts (71)...allowed a .284 opponents batting average, which included a .283 (39-for-138) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (44-for-154) against right-handers.

2016 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Midland and Nashville...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for second in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...his opponents batting average included a .190 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position.

RHP Kendall Graveman (5-4, 4.48 ERA): Is 3-1 with a 3.92 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to Aug. 8...the bullpen has blown the save in each of his three no decisions over that span...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 27 and was 0-2 with a 7.56 ERA and .330 opponents batting average in five starts in between...is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA in seven starts on the road...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 10-2 A's win over Houston last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Phillies in his career...was the losing pitcher in his only interleague start this year on Aug. 3 at San Francisco and is now 1-3 with a 6.15 ERA and .353 opponents batting average in six career interleague appearances, all starts.

- Has a 4.20 ERA (94 er in 201.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.38).
- Has allowed 74 home runs, which is third most in the AL and tied with the Oakland record set in 2015...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (189), is second in highest opponents slugging percentage (.433), is tied for fourth in most losses (25) and is third in fewest wins (20).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (190).
- Has allowed 49 stolen bases, which is second in the majors.
