OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-82) VS. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (57-90)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2017 — CITIZENS BANK PARK — 7:05 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (5-4, 4.48) VS. RHP BEN LIVELY (3-6, 3.86) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the series opener yesterday and now have alternated wins and losses over the first four games of the road trip (L, W, L, W)...the loss Thursday guaranteed a losing record, the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have won seven of the last nine games after losing a season-high eight in a row...are 65-82 (.442) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 113 days in fifth overall.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's conclude interleague play with this threegame series at Philadelphia...are 6-12 (.333), which is the fifth worst record in the majors...have clinched a losing record in interleague play for the second consecutive year and seventh time in 21 seasons...have also clinched at least the third worst interleague record in Oakland history (5-13/.278 in 2009, 7-13/.350 in 2016)...have a 5.83 ERA (104 er in 160.2 ip), which is the second highest in the majors (BAL, 5.90)...the highest in Oakland history is 5.77 in 1998...have set Oakland interleague records for runs allowed (112) and extra base hits (74), have matched the record for home runs (26, also 2000 and 2003) and are closing in on the record for hits (181, record is 188 in 2000)...the offense is batting .253 (155-for-613) but has 74 walks, which is tied for sixth most in the majors...have hit 27 home runs, which is two short of the Oakland interleague record 29 (1999 and 2000)...are 204-178 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-14 (.143) with two runs, two walks, eight strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year...pitchers are 5-for-75 (.067) over the last four seasons and are batting .081 (31-for-384) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 12 walks and 183 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .086)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (1-0) and Detroit (three games)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)...the win on Wednesday snapped an eight-game road losing streak and the A's have now lost nine of their last 11 road games...are 23-49 (.319) on the road and have the worst road record in the majors...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 49 road losses are second most by an A's team over the last 20 years and are the most since the 2011 club went 31-50...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...have a 42-33 (.560) record in Oakland and the home winning percentage is .241 better than the road...that is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)... are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 3-18-2 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (114) and unearned runs (80)...rank tied for second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (104) and double plays (152) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .277 (214-for-773) with 45 doubles, 4 triples, 41 home runs and 127 runs scored over the last 22 games (5.8 runs per game)...for the season, rank third in the American League in doubles (277) and extra base hits (504)...however, have the fourth lowest batting average (.246).

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 43 home runs in the last 23 games and have 212 for the season...that is the fourth highest total in Athletics history and is the most since 2000 (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...A's players have 18 individual multi-homer games, which is second most in Oakland history (20 in 1996)...home runs have accounted for 326 of the A's 671 runs (48.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 1375 times, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1431) and third most in the majors (MIL, 1438)...it is 12 short of the Athletics record of 1387 set in 2012.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed 28 home runs in the last 16 games and has a 5.69 ERA (89 er in 140.2 ip) over that span...have surrendered 192 home runs for the season, which is third most in Oakland history and the most since 1997 (197)...the record is 205 in 1996...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (78), third in fewest strikeouts (1092) and fourth in highest ERA (4.77)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

STARTING PITCHING: Mengden's complete game last night snapped an Athletics franchise record 186-game streak without one...were one of four teams in the majors without a complete game this season (ATL, CWS, TB)...prior to last night, their last complete game was on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the A's have never gone an entire season without a complete games...A's starting pitchers are 13-16 with a 5.91 ERA (152 er in 231.1 ip) and .308 (289-for-939) opponents batting average over the last 45 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (620) and fourth in highest ERA (4.85), most losses (57) and fewest home runs (118).

ROOKIES: The A's have used 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...had seven rookies in the starting lineup in the second game of the doubleheader last Saturday...have had exactly six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup five times and at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31... have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 30-27 (.526) during day games compared to 35-55 (.389) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 39-42 (.481) against everyone else...have a run differential of -98, which is tied for second lowest in the AL...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 54 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's and Phillies are meeting for the sixth time in interleague play...the home team has won two of three games in each of the previous five meetings...the A's lead the all-time series, 9-7...are 6-3 in Oakland and 3-4 in Philadelphia...are 2-2 at Citizens Bank Park...last met in 2014 when the A's won two of three in Oakland...last met in Philadelphia in 2011 when the A's dropped two of three.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (16) and extra base hits (30) since the All-Star Break...*Jed Lowrie* is tied for second in Oakland history and tied for seventh in Athletics history with 45 doubles...*Matt Olson* has homered in each of the A's last seven series and is batting .303 (20-for-66) with 11 home runs and 21 RBI in 18 games over that span...has 15 home runs since the All-Star Break, which is second most among Major League rookies (Hoskins, PHI 18).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Sugar Cain and Johnny Marcus toss complete games as the A's sweep a doubleheader at St. Louis 2-1 and 2-0...in **1947** the A's score all seven of their runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning to defeat Cleveland 7-3 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1980** Mike Norris goes the distance in the A's 4-2, 11 inning win at Texas... Oakland scores two in the ninth and two in the 11th as Norris wins his 20th game of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (5-4, 4.48 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-1 with a 3.92 ERA (18 er in 41.1 ip) and .289 (46for-159) opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to Aug. 8...the bullpen has blown the save in each of his three no decisions over that span...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 27 and was 0-2 with a 7.56 ERA and .330 opponents batting average in five starts in between.

INTERLEAGUE: Was the losing pitcher in his only interleague start this year on Aug. 3 at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 0 so, 31.50 ERA)...is now 1-3 with a 6.15 ERA (26.1 ip, 41 h, 18 r, 18 er, 10 bb, 19 so, 4 hr) and .353 (41-for-116) opponents batting average in six career interleague appearances, all starts.

WITH THE BAT: Did not have an at bat in his first interleague start this year at San Francisco...is 0-for-4 with three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in five career plate appearances, all in 2016.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA (18 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA (27 er in 36.0 ip) in seven starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 11-10 with a 3.50 ERA (79 er in 203.0 ip) in 33 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.90 ERA (103 er in 189.0 ip) in 35 starts on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (16 er in 43.1 ip) and .248 (41-for-165) opponents batting average in seven starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.55 ERA (29 er in 47.0 ip) and .317 (59-for-186) opponents average in nine starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Left-handed hitters are 7-for-52 (.135) against him over his last six starts...has allowed a .240 (36-for-150) average against left-handed hitters overall compared to .318 (64-for-201) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against left-ies, .272 against righties...seven of the 10 home runs he has allowed this year have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .276 (24-for-87) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .184 (7-for-38) with RISP and two outs...the opponents number three hitter is batting .512 (21-for-41) with five doubles, four home runs (.927 slugging percentage) and five walks (.565 on-base percentage.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 15 of his 46 runs in the first inning for an 8.44 ERA (15 er in 16.0 ip)...has a 3.63 ERA (30 er in 74.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .353 (24-for-68) in the first inning, .269 (76-for-283) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Has made 13 of his 16 starts at night...the bullpen has blown the save in four of his 16 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...is 3-3 with a 5.29 ERA (39 er in 66.1 ip) in 12 starts since then...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter on April 3 against Los Angeles (AL) and picked up the win in a 4-2 decision...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)... won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...did not strike out a bat-ter in 5.0 innings on April 14 against Houston, his first career start without a strikeout...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...issued a career-high tying four walks May 3 at Minnesota...left his start on May 14 at Texas with a 4-3 lead but Madson blew the save ... it was the first of four times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (Aug. 8 vs. Seattle, Aug. 30 at Los Angeles-AL, Sept. 5 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...was 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts after he was reinstated from the DL before returning to the DL a second time with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts...had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings at lowa July 19 (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came July 29 at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr)... was reinstated from the DL Aug. 3 and is 3-2 with a 5.19 ERA (25 er in 43.1

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Houston last Sunday in Oakland...shutout the Astros on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Bregman in the sixth...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Dull to start the seventh.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (10-10, 4.65 ERA): Is 2-5 with a 6.75 ERA and .356 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch...has 130 strikeouts in 147.0 innings this year after fanning 124 in 144.2 innings last year...his 254 career strikeouts are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors...is 5-1 with a 3.72 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-9 with a 5.26 ERA in 17 starts at night...has a 7-3 career record during the day, 10-16 at night...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 11-1 A's loss at Boston on Tuesday (3.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 so, 1 hr)...has never faced the Phillies in his career...is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA in three interleague starts this year and 1-3 with a 3.89 ERA in six in his career...is 0-for-3 with a walk and two strikeouts in his career as a hitter.

- Has a 4.20 ERA (94 er in 201.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.37).
- Has allowed 74 home runs, which is third most in the AL and tied with the Oakland record set in 2015...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (189), is second in highest opponents slugging percentage (.433), is tied for fourth in most losses (25) and is third in fewest wins (20).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (190).
- Has allowed 49 stolen bases, which is second in the majors.




