OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-83) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (62-87)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2017 — COMERICA PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have alternated wins and losses over the first six games of the current road trip (L, W, L, W, L, W) and are now 14-13 over the last 27 games...are 66-83 (.443) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for seventh worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season but are two wins shy of their win total from 2015 (68-94) and three short of their total from last year (69-93)...this marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 115 days in fifth overall...should the A's remain in last the rest of the way, they will spend 129 days in sole possession of last, which would be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (three games)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)...are 24-50 (.324) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the majors (SF, 24-51/.320)...the 50 road losses are the A's most since 2011 (also 50) and are tied for sixth most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977, 51 in 1993, 1997 and 1978)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...return home following the game Wednesday for the final homestand of the season against Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (4-0) and have a 42-33 (.560) record in Oakland...the home winning percentage is .236 better than the road, which is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 4-18-2 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (118) and unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in double plays (153), passed balls (16) and stolen bases allowed (105) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

STRIKEOUTS: Matt Olson struck out in the sixth inning yesterday for the A's 1388th strikeout of the season...that broke the Athletics franchise record of 1387 set in 2012...now have 1394 strikeouts, which is eighth most in American League history (7th is MIN with 1426 in 2016)...it ranks second in the AL this year (TB, 1446) and third in the majors (MIL, 1454).

OFFENSE: The A's rank third in the American League in doubles (280) and extra base hits (512), fourth in walks (531) and fifth in home runs (217)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are tied for ninth most (8th is 517 in 2003, 7th is 518 in 1930, 6th is 527 in 1932)...have 48 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is second most in the majors (MIN, 50)...home runs have accounted for 334 of the A's 680 runs (49.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (37), rank third in fewest stolen bases (55) and fourth in lowest batting average (.245) and fewest triples (15).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.75 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...the last time the A's had an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...lead the majors with an Athletics franchise record 81 wild pitches...have allowed 499 extra base hits, which is fourth most in the AL and fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1108 strikeouts, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL but is ninth most in Athletics history (8th is 1117 in 2001, 7th in 1124 in 2009)...have allowed 193 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but third most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-16 with a 5.78 ERA (153 er in 238.1 ip) and .306 (296-for-967) opponents batting average over the last 47 games after going 32-41 with a 4.41 ERA and .254 opponents batting average over the first 102 contests through July 27...are 46-57 with a 4.82 ERA (433 er in 809.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (624) and fourth in most losses and fewest home runs (118)...Daniel Mengden snapped the Athletics franchise record streak of 186 consecutive games without a complete game on Friday...it was the A's first complete game since Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL

(Graveman)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

SEPTEMBER BATTING: The A's are batting .266 (147-for-552) in the month of September...rank second in the American League in home runs (30), walks (66), extra base hits (67) and on-base percentage (.349), third in slugging percentage (.504) and tied for fourth in runs (93)...are tied with the Dodgers for the Major League lead with 160 strikeouts...have set franchise records for most strikeouts in the month of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...the record for September is 276 in 2012

TRAGIC NUMBER: The A's can be officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 150 tonight with a loss and a Minnesota win...were eliminated from the playoffs in game 147 last year and 149 in 2015...were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Sept. 4, which was the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977).

ROOKIES: The A's have used 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...had seven rookies in the starting lineup once (Sept. 9 vs. HOU, G#2), six (including the starting pitcher) five times and at least one every day dating back to May 31...rookies have 17 home runs and 47 RBI over the last 13 games...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 31-27 (.534) during day games compared to 35-56 (.385) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 40-43 (.482) against everyone else...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 49 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three in Oakland in May...lost the season series last year, 3-4...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are now 42-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 254-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 34-28 (.548) at Comerica Park, which is the second best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (LAA, 40-32/.556)...all-time, the A's are 922-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (17) and extra base hits (31) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** needs one more home run to join Jimmie Foxx (1932-34) as the only players in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for second in Oakland history and tied for seventh in Athletics history with 45 doubles...the Oakland record for doubles in a season is 47 by Jason Giambi in 2001...**Matt Olson** has homered in three straight games for the fourth time this year...has homered in each of the A's last seven series and has homered 13 times in his last 19 games...his 21 home runs are tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** the A's clinch their second consecutive American League Championship with a 14-10 win over Chicago...in **1982** the A's strand a club record 17 baserunners in a nine inning game but come back to defeat Chicago 5-4 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **2000** Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...Giambi would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...in **2002** Billy Koch saves his 40th game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in major league history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (8-10, 5.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 3-2 with a 6.85 ERA (36 er in 47.1 ip) and .293 (56-for-191) opponents batting average in nine starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 over his last five starts for the first three-game winning streak of his career...however, allowed 11 runs in 9.0 innings in his two no decisions over that stretch and has a 5.74 ERA (17 er in 26.2 ip) and .267 (28-for-105) opponents batting average during the winning streak...has surrendered nine home runs.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed his 28th home run of the season in his last start, which broke the Athletics rookie record of 27 set by Dan Pfister in 1962 and matched by Trevor Cahill in 2009...they are the most home runs allowed by a Major League rookie since Wei-Yin Chen had 29 with Baltimore in 2012...they are second most by any A's pitcher over the last 11 years (Griffin, 36 in 2013)...has allowed an average of 2.03 home runs per nine innings for the season, which is the highest mark in Athletics history among pitcher with 120 or more innings pitched (Jerry Walker, 1.70 in 1962)...has allowed at least one home run in each of his last seven starts and has surrendered 13 home runs in 38.2 innings total over that stretch (3.03 per nine innings)...allowed three home runs in back-to-back start on Sept. 2 and 8 and is the first A's pitcher to do that since Cory Lidle in 2001 (June 21 and 29)...14 of his home runs have come with two outs, which is second most in the American League (Zimmerman, DET 16)...13 have come over the first two innings, including seven in the second inning, which is tied for third most in the AL.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (8) and ranks second in strikeouts (99), innings pitched (124.0) and games started (23)...this marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in balks (2), tied for sixth in unearned runs (11) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (9)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...has a 5.81 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL among pitchers with 120 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, it is the highest by an A's pitcher since Jimmy Haynes had a 6.34 ERA in 152.0 innings in 1999.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-3 with a 3.99 ERA (17 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts against American League Central teams compared to 5-7 with a 6.62 ERA (63 er in 85.2 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-4 with a 4.74 ERA (30 er in 57.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest, 3-6 with a 6.72 ERA (50 er in 67.0 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-6 with a 7.52 ERA (54 er in 64.2 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in 12 starts in Oakland compared to 5-4 with a 3.94 ERA (26 er in 59.1 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 11 starts on the road...is tied for second in the majors in home runs allowed at home and is two short of the Oakland record of 20 set by Trevor Cahill in 2009...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he has the highest home ERA in the majors (Kennedy, KC 6.82) and in Oakland history (Mark Redman, 7.46 in 2004).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-7 with a 7.78 ERA (51 er in 59.0 ip) and .339 (84-for-248) opponents batting average in 12 starts at night compared to 6-3 with a 4.02 ERA (29 er in 65.0 ip) and .205 (48-for-234) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...has the third highest night ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at night...using the same minimum, it is third highest in Oakland history (Blake Stein, 9.00 in 1998; Dave Stewart, 8.15 in 1995)...is tied for second in the AL in day wins...is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed during the day (15)...is now 2-7 with a 6.72 ERA (56 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 career starts at night, 8-3 with a 3.56 ERA (31 er in 78.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...had a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from May 9 to June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...left the start against the White Sox with a

blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville before he was reinstated July 30...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings in an 8-3 win over Texas on Aug. 27...allowed a career-high tying seven runs and also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in 5.0 innings in a 9-8 loss to Houston Sept. 8.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 7-3 win at Boston last Wednesday...the A's scored four times in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a Betts RBI ground out...had a 6-1 lead when he allowed a Benintendi RBI double in the third...also allowed a leadoff home run to Bradley in the bottom of the fifth.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts.

RHP Daniel Gossett (4-9, 5.02 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-3 with a 4.73 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in five starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with the Sounds...has combined for a 2.10 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in innings one and two and has a 6.75 ERA and .332 opponents average from the third inning on...is one of three pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least nine games over his first 15 career appearances (Morgan 12, Mengden 10)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss at Boston last Thursday (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Tigers in his career.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 10-of-21 (47.6%) save opportunities over the last 57 games...is 29-for-52 (55.8%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 54.3%)...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the third fewest saves.
- Has a 4.22 ERA (99 er in 211.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.36).
- Has allowed 75 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (191), is third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.431), is tied for third in most losses (26) and is third in fewest wins (20).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (195).
