OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-83) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (62-88)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2017 — COMERICA PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (4-9, 5.02) VS. LHP CHAD BELL (0-3, 6.42) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games and nine of the last 12...are 15-13 over the last 28 games and 67-83 (.447) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for seventh worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season but are one win shy of their win total from 2015 (68-94) and two short of their total from last year (69-93)...this marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 116 days in fifth overall...should the A's remain in last the rest of the way, they will spend 129 days in sole possession of last, which would be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (1-0)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)... are 25-50 (.333) on the road, which is tied with Philadelphia for the second worst road record in the majors (SF, 24-51/.320)...the 50 road losses are the A's most since 2011 (also 50) and are tied for sixth most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977, 51 in 1993, 1997 and 1978)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...return home following the game tomorrow for the final homestand of the season against Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (4-0) and have a 42-33 (.560) record in Oakland...the home winning percentage is .227 better than the road, which is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 4-18-2 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (118) and unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in double plays (153), passed balls (16) and stolen bases allowed (105) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1399 times...that ranks second in the American League (TB, 1446) and third in the majors (MIL, 1462)...it is eighth most in AL history (7th is MIN with 1426 in 2016)... rank third in the AL in doubles (283) and extra base hits (516), fourth in walks (537) and fifth in home runs (218)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are ninth most (8th is 517 in 2003, 7th is 518 in 1930, 6th is 527 in 1932)...have 49 home runs back to Aug. 21, which is second most in the majors (MIN, 50)...home runs have accounted for 336 of the A's 688 runs (48.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (39), rank third in fewest stolen bases (55) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.74 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...lead the majors with an Athletics franchise record 81 wild pitches...have allowed 503 extra base hits, which is tied for third most in the AL and is fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1114 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but ninth most in Athletics history (8th is 1117 in 2001, 7th in 1124 in 2009, 6th is 1136 in 2012)...have allowed 194 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but third most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed just one earned run in the last four games (19.2 ip, 0.46 ERA) but are 14-16 with a 5.69 ERA (153 er in 242.0 ip) and .304 (298-for-980) opponents batting average over the last 48 contests...are 46-57 with a 4.79 ERA (433 er in 813.0 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (626) and fourth in most losses and fewest home runs (118)...Daniel Mengden snapped the Athletics franchise record streak of 186 consecutive games without a complete game on Friday...it was the A's first complete game since Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

SEPTEMBER BATTING: The A's are batting .272 (161-for-591) in the month of September...are tied for the American League lead in home runs (31), rank second in walks (72), extra base hits (71), slugging percentage (.504) and on-base percentage (.357) and third in runs (101)...lead the

AL and rank second in the majors with 165 strikeouts...have set franchise records for most strikeouts in the month of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...the record for September is 276 in 2012

TRAGIC NUMBER: The A's can be officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 151 tonight with a loss and a Minnesota win...were eliminated from the playoffs in game 147 last year and 149 in 2015...were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Sept. 4, which was the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977).

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (22), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (12) have combined for 49 home runs, which is tied for third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 1987; 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 1977)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...rookies have combined for 18 home runs and 51 RBI over the last 14 games...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...had seven rookies in the starting lineup once (Sept. 9 vs. HOU, G#2), six (including the starting pitcher) five times and at least one every day dating back to May 31

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 31-27 (.534) during day games compared to 36-56 (.391) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 41-43 (.488) against everyone else...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 0 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series 3-1...won the first game in Detroit last night after winning two of three in Oakland in May...lost the season series last year, 3-4...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are now 43-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 111-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 35-28 (.556) at Comerica Park, which is tied for the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (LAA, 40-32/.556)...all-time, the A's are 923-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (17) and extra base hits (31) since the All-Star Break...*Khris Davis* needs one more home run to join Jimmie Foxx (1932-34) as the only players in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...*Jed Lowrie* had his 46th double of the season last night, which is one short of the Oakland record of 47 set by Jason Giambi in 2001...*Matt Olson* has homered 14 times in his last 20 games, which match the most in Oakland history over a 20-game span and the most in ML history by a rookie over a 20-game span (York, 1937; McGwire, 1987...source: Elias)...has 11 home runs this month, which are the most in ML history by a rookie in September...his 22 home runs are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a rookie... has tied the Oakland rookie record for consecutive games with a home run (4, Dan Johnson, Aug 3-6, 2005)...has homered in each of the A's last eight series.

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 30th game in a 2-1 win over Chicago...in **1954** the Philadelphia A's play the Yankees in their last game at Connie Mack Stadium...in **1972** Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...in **1974** Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in **1988** Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West championship... in **2000** the A's set an Oakland record by walking 15 times in a 7-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (4-9, 5.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-3 with a 4.73 ERA (14 er in 26.2 ip) and .318 (34-for-107) opponents batting average in five starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3.

LOSSES: Has nine losses over the first 15 starts of his career...is one of three pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least nine games over his first 15 career appearances (Morgan 12, Mengden 10).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season today, but just his sixth in a night game...is 1-4 with a 3.48 ERA (12 er in 31.0 ip) and three home runs allowed in five starts at night, 3-5 with a 5.98 ERA (33 er in 49.2 ip) and 11 home runs allowed in 10 starts during the day.

BASES ON BALLS: Walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts and walked just three batters in 26.0 innings total over that span (1.04 per nine innings)...has walked two batters or more in seven of his 10 starts since then and has issued 22 free passes in 54.2 innings over that stretch (3.62 per nine innings).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed three runs in the first inning over his last four starts after allowing no runs in the first over his first 11 starts...has combined for a 2.10 ERA (7 er in 30.0 ip) and .216 (24-for-111) opponents batting average in innings one and two and has a 6.75 ERA (38 in 50.2 ip) and .332 (72-for-217) opponents average from the third inning on... has surrendered 18 of his 50 runs in the fourth inning for a 9.88 ERA (15 er in 13.2 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed three home runs over his last seven starts (37.1 ip, 0.72 per nine innings) after yielding 11 over his first eight (43.1 ip, 2.28 per nine innings)...has a .293 (41-for-140) opponents batting average with 13 walks against left-handed hitters and .293 (55-for-188) with 12 walks against right-handers...however, has surrendered 11 of his 14 home runs to righties...has a .208 (26-for-125) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .345 (70-for-203) after that...opponents are batting .388 (31-for-80) with a .443 on-base percentage (8 walks) and .563 slugging percentage (five doubles, three home runs) when leading off an inning...the opponents number nine hitter is batting .444 (12-for-27) and the eight hitter has a .355 (11-for-31) average...has held the clean-up hitter to a .205 (8-for-39) average.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 15 starts and is 0-8 in those starts...is 4-1 in six starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second start, a 4-1 decision against Houston on June 19, to become the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)... allowed two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in his third start on June 24 at Chicago (AL) for his first Major League win...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...allowed a career-high nine hits...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...matched his career-high with 7.0 innings pitched in a 6-1 win at San Francisco Aug. 2...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 28...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3...struck out a career-high seven batters in an 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader Sept. 9 in Oakland.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Boston last Thursday...shutout the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Vazquez in the fifth...then allowed a RBI double to Benintendi in the sixth and was relieved by Dull, who allowed Benintendi to score.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-1, 4.30 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and is 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA (2 er in 15.0 ip) and .143 (7-for-49) opponents batting average in two starts since his return...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...tossed his first career complete game in his last start, a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Philadelphia last Friday (0 bb, 7 so)...became the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...has never faced the Tigers in his career...began the season on the 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with the Sounds.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 10-of-21 (47.6%) save opportunities over the last 58 games...is 29-for-52 (55.8%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 54.3%)...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the third fewest saves.
- Has a 4.24 ERA (102 er in 216.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.35).
- Has allowed 76 home runs, which is tied for third most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (194), is second in highest opponents slugging percentage (.432), is tied for third in most losses (26) and is third in fewest wins (21).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (198).

Has allowed 53 stolen bases, which is first in the majors.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville on Sept. 5 for his second stint with the A's this year...made his first appearance on Sept. 8.
- Was on the Opening Day roster and made one start before moving to the bullpen...was 0-1 with a 16.71 ERA in three games when he was designated for assignment April 25 and outrighted to Nashville April 29.
- Has allowed at least one home run in eight of his 11 career appearances and has surrendered 13 home runs in 37.0 career innings (3.16 per nine innings)...the home runs match the most by an A's pitcher over the first eight games of his career (Overton).
- Faced the Tigers for the first time last night.




