### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (69-83) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (76-76)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (5-4, 4.39) VS. RHP NICK MARTÍNEZ (3-6, 5.47) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series at Detroit to close out the last road trip...it was their sixth series sweep of the season but just their second on the road (June 23-25 at Chicago-AL)...now have a four-game winning streak, which is one short of the season high of five (April 18-22 and Sept. 6-10)...have won 11 of the last 14 games and are 25-24 dating back to July 29...are 69-83 (.454) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...the 69 wins match the A's season total from last year and are one more than 2015... have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 119 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games)...are 42-33 (.560) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...the home winning percentage is .209 better than the road, which is currently the third largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...the A's road record is second worst in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE AT HOME: The A's have hit 122 home runs at home, which is third most in the majors (BAL 132, NYY 126) and four short of the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum (126 in 2000)...are slugging .476, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have already set Oakland records for extra base hits (293) and strikeouts (681) at home...have 159 doubles, which are second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 394 runs scored, which ranks eighth (7th is 402 in 2009, 6th is 405 in 2004)...the pitching staff has 610 strikeouts, which is five short of the Oakland record (615 in 2014)...has a 4.53 ERA...if the A's finish with an ERA above 4.34, it will be the third highest home ERA in Oakland history (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 89 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history (102 in 1996, 96 in 1997).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors with 118 errors...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)... also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in passed balls (16) and stolen bases allowed (108) and fourth in double plays (154) and fewest outfield assists (21).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have struck out a franchise record 1424 times...that ranks second in the American League (TB, 1468) and third in the majors (MIL, 1490)...it is eighth most in AL history (7th is MIN with 1426 in 2016, 6th is MIN with 1430 in 2013, 5th is HOU with 1442 in 2014)...rank third in the AL in doubles (287) and extra base hits (524), fourth in walks (544) and tied for fourth in home runs (222)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are seventh most (6th is 527 in 1932, 5th is 540 in 2004)...have 53 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is the most in the majors (CLE and MIN, 51)...home runs have accounted for 344 of the A's 700 runs (49.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (39), rank third in fewest stolen bases (56) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.74 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...are tied for the Major League lead with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 514 extra base hits, which is third most in the AL and fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1129 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1136 in 2012, 5th is 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 197 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but tied for second most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last six games and are 3-0 with a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) over that span...however, are 15-16 with a 5.64 ERA (159 er in 253.2 ip) and .305 (314-for-1030) opponents batting average over the last 50 contests...rank

second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (633) and fourth in most losses (57), highest ERA (4.79) and fewest home runs (120)...Daniel Mengden snapped the Athletics franchise record streak of 186 consecutive games without a complete game a week ago today...it was the A's first complete game since Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

**SEPTEMBER BATTING:** The A's are batting .271 (181-for-667) in the month of September...lead the majors with 35 home runs...rank second in the American League in walks (79), extra base hits (79) and slugging percentage (.501), third in on-base percentage (.353) and fourth in runs (113)...rank third in the AL with 190 strikeouts...have set franchise records for most strikeouts in the month of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...the record for September is 276 in 2012

**TRAGIC NUMBER:** The A's can be officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 153 tonight with a loss or a Minnesota win...were eliminated from the playoffs in game 147 last year and 149 in 2015...were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Sept. 4, which was the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977).

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (23), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 51 home runs in just 216 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)... this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...rookies have combined for 20 home runs and 53 RBI over the last 16 games...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are 32-27 (.542) during day games compared to 37-56 (.398) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 43-43 (.500) against everyone else...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 18 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at six games each...the A's are 5-1 in Oakland but are 1-5 in Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 44-44 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 347-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 183-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 444-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (17) and extra base hits (32) since the All-Star Break...Jed Lowrie has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001)...Matt Olson has homered five times in his last six games, seven times in his last 10 and a ML leading 15 times in 22 games dating back to Aug. 27... has 12 home runs in September, which is the most in MLB history by a rookie...has homered in each of his last eight series...leads ML rookies and is tied for second among all American Leaguers with 19 home runs since the All-Star Break...leads the AL with 19 home runs since he was promoted from Nashville Aug. 8...has 23 home runs for the season, which ranks fourth among AL rookies and tied for third most in Athletics history by a rookie.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1912 Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game for the second time in 11 days, an American League record that still stands today...in 1913 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in 1970 Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats, including a pair of doubles, but the A's lose to Minnesota, 5-3...in 1989 Dave Stewart wins his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career in a 5-2 win at Minnesota...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's...in 1996 Mark McGwire ties a major league record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (5-4, 4.39 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 5-4 with a 4.39 ERA in 17 starts in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder (April 15-26 and May 26-Aug. 2)...the ERA is a career high as is his opponents batting average (.283), on-base percentage (.341), slugging percentage (.448) and OPS (.789)...has allowed 10 home runs and his average of 0.97 home runs per nine innings is a career low...his five wins and 17 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland.

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Is 3-1 with a 3.74 ERA (18 er in 43.1 ip) and .285 (47-for-165) opponents batting average over his last eight starts dating back to Aug. 8...the bullpen has blown the save in three of his four no decisions over that span and he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in the other start before he was removed following a rain delay...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 27 and was 0-2 with a 7.56 ERA and .330 opponents batting average in five starts in between.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA (18 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA (27 er in 38.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 11-10 with a 3.50 ERA (79 er in 203.0 ip) in 33 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.85 ERA (103 er in 191.0 ip) in 36 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season today, his 15th in a night game...is 3-4 with a 4.71 ERA (38 er in 72.2 ip) in 14 starts at night, 2-0 with a 3.20 ERA (7 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts during the day.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 4-2 with a 3.50 ERA (28 er in 72.0 ip) in 12 starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with a 7.52 ERA (17 er in 20.1 ip) in five starts against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (16 er in 43.1 ip) and .248 (41-for-165) opponents batting average in seven starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.33 ERA (29 er in 49.0 ip) and .313 (60-for-192) opponents average in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .283 opponents batting average, which includes a mark of .240 (37-for-154) against left-handed hitters compared to .315 (64-for-203) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against lefties, .272 against righties...lefties are 8-for-56 (.143) against him over his last seven starts...seven of the 10 home runs he has allowed this year have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .276 (24-for-87) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .184 (7-for-38) with RISP and two outs...has a .247 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is the highest in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...the opponents number three hitter is batting .500 (21-for-42) with five doubles, four home runs (.905 slugging percentage) and five walks (.553 on-base percentage.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed 15 of his 46 runs in the first inning for a 7.94 ERA (15 er in 17.0 ip)...has a 3.58 ERA (30 er in 75.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .338 (24-for-71) in the first inning, .269 (77-for-286) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: The bullpen has blown the save in four of his 17 starts... has four double plays, which is tied for second in the American League among pitchers...had the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...is 3-3 with a 5.14 ERA (39 er in 68.1 ip) in 13 starts since then

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter on April 3 against Los Angeles (AL) and picked up the win in a 4-2 decision...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)... won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings on April 14 against Houston, his first career start without a strikeout...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...issued a career-high tying four walks May 3 at Minnesota...left his start on May 14 at Texas with a 4-3 lead but Madson blew the save...it was the first of four times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (Aug. 8 vs. Seattle, Aug. 30 at Los Angeles-

AL, Sept. 5 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...was 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts after he was reinstated from the DL before returning to the DL a second time with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts...had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings at lowa July 19 (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came July 29 at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr)... was reinstated from the DL Aug. 3 and is 3-2 with a 4.96 ERA (25 er in 45.1 ip) and .307 (55-for-179) opponents batting average in 10 starts since his return...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in a 9-3 victory over Baltimore Aug. 13.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Philadelphia last Saturday...tossed just 2.0 innings as he did not return following a rain delay...retired five of the six batters he faced, allowing a one-out single to Herrera in the second...was relieved by Smith to start the bottom of the third.

cision at Texas on April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...then had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas May 14...had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss...won for the second time on Aug. 25 in Oakland in a 3-1 victory... allowed a run on three hits in the first inning, including a RBI single by Beltre...then shutout the Rangers on six hits over his final six innings.
