### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-83) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (76-77)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (11-10, 4.56) VS. RHP MIGUEL GONZÁLEZ (8-11, 4.75) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won their 70th game of the season last night, which surpasses their win total from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have a season-high tying five-game winning streak (April 18-22 and Sept. 6-10)...are 12-3 over the last 15 games, which is their best 15-game stretch since April 3-20, 2014 (also 12-3)...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 35-35 since then...are 70-83 (.458) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 120 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high six-game home winning streak, which matches their longest such streak over the last three years... are 1-0 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (1-0) and Seattle (three games)...are 43-33 (.566) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...the home winning percentage is .215 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...the A's road record is second worst in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE AT HOME: The A's have hit 123 home runs at home, which is third most in the majors (BAL 133, NYY 126) and three short of the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum (126 in 2000)...are slugging .475, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have already set Oakland records for extra base hits (295) and strikeouts (690) at home...have 160 doubles, which are second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 398 runs scored, which ranks eighth (7th is 402 in 2009, 6th is 405 in 2004, 5th is 423 in 2001)...the pitching staff has set an Oakland record for strikeouts at home (617)...has a 4.48 ERA...if the A's finish with an ERA above 4.34, it will be the third highest home ERA in Oakland history (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 90 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history (102 in 1996, 96 in 1997).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors with 118 errors, which is seven more than any other team (CWS, 111)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in stolen bases allowed (108), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (155) and fewest outfield assists (21).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1433 times, which is sixth most in American League history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1482 by TB in 2016, 1473 by TB in 2017, 1452 by HOU in 2016, 1442 by HOU in 2014)...rank third in the AL in doubles (288) and extra base hits (526), fourth in walks (546) and tied for fourth in home runs (223)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are seventh most (6th is 527 in 1932, 5th is 540 in 2004)...have 54 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is the most in the majors (MIN, 53)...home runs have accounted for 346 of the A's 704 runs (49.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (39), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.72 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...are tied for the Major League lead with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 517 extra base hits, which is tied for third most in the AL and is fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1136 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but tied for sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 198 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but second most in Oakland history to the record of 205 in 1996.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in five of the last seven games and are 4-0 with a 1.88 ERA (8 er

in 38.1 ip) over that span...however, are 16-16 with a 5.52 ERA (160 er in 260.2 ip) and .303 (320-for-1056) opponents batting average over the last 51 contests...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (637), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in most losses (57) and fewest home runs (121)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 12-8 in September and have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the streak of 10 consecutive losing months is an Oakland record...the A's offense leads the majors with 36 home runs in September...rank second in the American League in walks (81), extra base hits (81), slugging percentage (.494) and on-base percentage (.350) and fourth in runs (117)...are tied for second in the AL with 199 strikeouts...have set franchise records for most strikeouts in the month of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...the record for September is 276 in 2012.

**ROOKIES:** The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 52 home runs in just 219 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)... this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-25 (.490) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season was over, 46-58 (.442) against everyone else... are 32-27 (.542) during day games compared to 38-56 (.404) at night... are 27-40 (.403) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 5 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have 33 players on the active roster.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 7-6...are 6-1 in Oakland but are 1-5 in Texas...have a six-game winning streak at home, which is the A's longest Coliseum winning streak against the Rangers since an eight-game streak from June 17, 2013-April 6, 2004...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against Texas...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 45-44 against the Rangers over the last five seasons...are 348-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 184-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 445-441 against the Rangers/ Senators franchise.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (17) and extra base hits (32) since the All-Star Break...Jed Lowrie has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001)...Matt Olson has homered six times in his last seven games and nine times in his last 12...has 16 home runs over his last 23 games, which are the most in ML history by a rookie over a 23-game stretch...has 13 home runs in September, which match the most by a rookie in any month over the last 30 seasons (Bellinger, LAD 13 in June 2017)...they match the most by any player in Athletics history in September (Giambi, 2000)... has 24 home runs in 68 career games, which are tied for second most in ML history by a player over his first 68 games (since 1913)...is averaging 7.63 at bats per home run, which is fourth lowest in ML history among batters with 200 or more plate appearances.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1950 the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...Joe Astroth has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in 1973 Vida Blue wins his 20<sup>th</sup> as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in 1988 Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in 2001 Mark Mulder wins his 20<sup>th</sup> game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle... in 2003 the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13<sup>th</sup> in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (11-10, 4.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 11-10 with a 4.56 ERA in 28 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and is 3-5 with a 6.27 ERA (36 er in 51.2 ip) and .346 (80-for-231) opponents average over his last 11 starts...has 134 strikeouts in 152.0 innings after fanning 124 in 144.2 innings last year...his 258 career strikeouts are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors (Hudson, 301; Zito, 283)...his 11 wins this year top his seven from a year ago and his 18 career wins are tied for seventh most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors...his ERA went from 3.86 last year to 4.56 this year and his opponents OPS increased from .713 to .775

**TEAM LEADERS:** Leads the A's in wins (11), games started (28), innings pitched (152.0), strikeouts (134) and hits (164) and is tied for the lead in losses (10) and walks (52)...will finish with the fewest innings pitched by an A's team-leader since Don Wengert led Oakland with 134.0 innings in 1997...that was also the last time the A's did not have a pitcher with 31 or more starts as Steve Karsay led the club with 24.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA (32 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 starts in Oakland and has allowed just five home runs in 68.2 innings (0.66 per nine innings)...is 5-7 with a 4.86 ERA (45 er in 83.1 ip) in 15 starts on the road and has yielded 13 home runs in 83.1 innings (1.40 per nine innings)...is now 11-6 with a 3.55 ERA (60 er in 152.0 ip) in 27 career games at home, 7-13 with a 4.91 ERA (79 er in 144.2 ip) in 26 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-1 with a 3.57 ERA (25 er in 63.0 ip) and .230 (56-for-243) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 5-9 with a 5.26 ERA (52 er in 89.0 ip) and .302 (108-for-358) opponents average in 17 starts at night...is tied for second in the American League in day wins...is now 8-3 with a 3.53 ERA (41 er in 104.2 ip in 18 career day games, 10-16 with a 4.59 ERA (98 er in 192.0 ip) in 35 starts at night.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Left-handed hitters are 26-for-84 (.310) against him over his last 18 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts... overall, has held left-handed hitters to a .230 (28-for-122) batting average...right-handers are hitting .284 (136-for-479) with 16 of his 18 home runs and 46 of his 52 walks...has a .598 OPS against lefties, .820 against righties...his career splits are a .207 (46-for-222) batting average and .566 OPS against lefties, .274 (253-for-924) with a .789 OPS against righties.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 4-5 with a 5.83 ERA (38 er in 58.2 ip) and .332 (85-for-256) opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the break...has allowed 10 home runs in 58.2 innings since the break after yielding just eight in 93.1 innings before the break

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 6-5 with a 3.97 ERA (34 er in 77.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 5.16 ERA (43 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 33-for-107 (.308) with runners in scoring position over his last 17 starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...12 of the 18 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots... has a .161 (51-for-317) opponents batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .388 (26-for-67) opponents batting average to the opponents number the two hitter but has held the three hitter to a .211 (15-for-71) average.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: Has allowed 43 of his 87 runs over the first two innings of his starts...has a 6.13 ERA (37 er in 54.1 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 3.21 ERA (26 er in 73.0 ip) over innings three through five and a 7.56 ERA (14 er in 16.2 ip) in the sixth inning...has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (8.0 ip)...last year, he allowed just nine runs in the first inning and second inning (1.29 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed fewer than four innings in four of his last eight starts and five times for the season...is tied for third in the American League with four pickoffs and opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for 10th...is tied for eighth in unearned runs (10)...is 4-7 against AL West competition, 7-3 against all other teams

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win at Philadelphia last Sunday...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Franco RBI single...Oakland tied the game with two in the fourth but he allowed another RBI single to Franco in the fifth...the A's then scored four times in the sixth inning to take the lead for good and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the bottom of the sixth.

loss came in an 8-1 decision at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score...the win came in the A's 8-3 victory on Aug. 26 in Oakland... allowed a two-run double to Beltre in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...left after five innings with a 6-2 lead.

**2016 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
