OAKLAND ATHLETICS (72-83) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (76-79)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to seven games yesterday, which is an on-going season-high and the longest by an A's team since a nine-game winning streak from April 3-12, 2013...are 14-3 over the last 17 games, which is their best 17-game stretch since Sept. 6-23, 2013 when they also won 14 of 17...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 37-35 since then...are 72-83 (.465) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 122 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have an eight-game home winning streak, which is second longest by an Oakland team over the last 11 years...won 11 straight from May 17-June 13, 2013...are 3-0 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (three games)...are 45-33 (.577) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...the home winning percentage is .226 better than the road, which is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...leave following the game Wednesday for the final road trip of the season, a four-game series at Texas...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...the A's road record is second worst in the AL...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 13-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE AT HOME: The A's have hit 125 home runs at home, which is third most in the majors (BAL 133, NYY 126) and one short of the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum (126 in 2000)...are slugging .472, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have already set Oakland records for extra base hits (300) and strikeouts (700) at home...have 163 doubles, which are second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 407 runs scored, which ranks sixth (466 in 2000, 461 in 1999, 440 in 1996, 427 in 2002, 423 in 2001)...the pitching staff has set an Oakland record for strikeouts at home (635)...has a 4.38 ERA...if the A's finish with an ERA above 4.34, it will be the third highest home ERA in Oakland history (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 91 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history (102 in 1996, 96 in 1997).

A'S IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 14-8 in September and need one more win to clinch a winning record in a month for the first time since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the 14 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 15-12 in June of 2015...the streak of 10 consecutive losing months is an Oakland record...the A's offense has 38 home runs, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the majors...are tied for the American League lead in walks (85), rank second in extra base hits (86) and slugging percentage (.486), third in on-base percentage (.347) and fourth in runs (126) and strikeouts (209)...the Athletics record for strikeouts in September is 276 in 2012...have already set franchise records for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors with 118 errors, which is six more than any other team (CWS, 112)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in stolen bases allowed (108), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (157) and fewest outfield assists (21).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1443 times, which is fifth most in American League history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1488 by TB in 2017, 1482 by TB in 2016, 1452 by HOU in 2016)...rank third in the AL in doubles (291) and extra base hits (531) and fifth in home runs (225) and walks (550)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are sixth most (555 in 2001, 547 in 1996, 543 in 2000, 542 in 1999, 540 in 2004)...have 56 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is tied with the Twins for second most in the majors (CLE, 57)...home runs have accounted for 349 of the A's 713 runs (48.9%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of

runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (41), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) over the last nine games but have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.58 was in 1999 (4.69)...rank second in the majors with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 518 extra base hits, which is tied for fourth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1154 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but sixth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1188 in 2016, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 199 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but second most in Oakland history to the record of 205 in 1996.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in six of the last nine games and are 6-0 with a 1.49 ERA (8 er in 48.1 ip) over that span...overall, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (648), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in fewest home runs (121)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 52 home runs in just 223 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-25 (.490) against teams that have either clinched a playoff spot (BOS, CLE, HOU, NYY, WASH) or currently have a playoff spot (MIN)...are 48-58 (.453) against all other teams...are 33-27 (.550) during day games compared to 39-56 (.410) at night...are 29-40 (.421) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 43 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have 33 players on the active roster.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season as they trail 6-10 entering this final three-game series...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...have lost each of the last six games, which is one short of their longest losing streak ever against Seattle (7, Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009 and Aug. 13-Sept. 30, 2016)...are 3-3 in Oakland this year and went 3-7 in Seattle...are 36-56 (.391) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-280 against the Mariners...that includes 183-125 in Oakland, 156-154 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-90 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001)...**Matt Olson** has homered six times in his last nine games, nine times in his last 14 and 16 times in his last 25...has 13 home runs in September, which match the most by a rookie in any month over the last 30 seasons (Belling, LAD 13 in June 2017)...they match the most by any player in Athletics history in September (Giambi, 2000)...has 24 home runs in 70 career games, which are third most in ML history by a player over his first 70 games (since 1913)...is averaging 7.88 at bats per home run, which is fourth lowest in ML history among batters with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit what was then a Major League rookie record 49 home runs...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (4-9, 5.38 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-9 with a 5.38 ERA in 16 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...was first selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...was recalled Aug. 23 and is 1-3 with a 5.74 ERA (20 er in 31.1 ip) and .333 (.43-for-129) opponents batting average in six starts since his return

LOSSES: Has nine losses over the first 16 starts of his career...is one of four pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least nine games over his first 16 career appearances (Morgan 13, Mengden 10, Mazzaro 9).

BASES ON BALLS: Walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts and walked just three batters in 26.0 innings total over that span (1.04 per nine innings)...has walked two batters or more in eight of his 11 starts since then and has issued 25 free passes in 59.1 innings over that stretch (3.79 per nine innings).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in the first inning, a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) in the second innings and a 4.50 ERA (8 er in 16.0 ip) in the third inning for a combined 2.81 ERA...has an 8.68 ERA (36 er in 37.1 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a .228 (41-for-180) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a .376 (64-for-170) average from the fourth inning on

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .300 opponents batting average, which is sixth highest in the American League among pitchers with at least 81 innings pitched...the average breaks down to .294 (59-for-201) against right-handed hitters and .309 (46-for-149) against left-handers...has surrendered 12 of his 16 home runs to righties...has a .209 (28-for-134) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .356 (77-for-216) after that...has held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .190 (8-for-42) batting average...however, the nine hitter is batting .429 (12-for-28) and the eight hitter has a .344 (11-for-32) average...opponents are batting .376 (32-for-85) with a .430 on-base percentage (8 walks) and .576 slugging percentage (five doubles, four home runs) when leading off an inning

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 3-5 with a 4.91 ERA (30 er in 55.0 ip) in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts before the break...has allowed eight home runs in 55.0 innings since the break after allowing eight in 30.1 innings before the break.

THIS AND THAT: Has made 11 of his 16 starts this year on the road...10 have come during day games...is tied for ninth in the American League in wild pitches (9)...has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 16 starts and is 0-8 in those starts...is 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-8 win at Detroit last Tuesday...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 4.2 innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Kinsler in the third...yielded a RBI single to McCann in the fourth but then surrendered four runs in the fifth on a Presley leadoff homer and a McCann two-run triple...was relieved by Coulombe, who allowed McCann to score.

GOSSETT vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (8.0 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two career starts, both this year at Seattle...the first loss came in a 4-0 decision on July 9...retired six of the first seven batters before allowing Dyson to score on a Segura grounded into double play in the third...also allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the fourth...Hernandez and four Seattle relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits and five walks...then took the loss in a 10-2 decision on Sept. 3...allowed a two-run home run to Cano in the first inning and a RBI single to Cano in the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fourth inning, the bases loaded and the A's trailing 3-0...Albers no-hit the A's over the first five innings.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14.

HIGHLIGHTS WITH NASHVILLE: Earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (2-1, 3.30 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in his last start last Wednesday at Detroit, a 3-2 A's win (7 h, 4 so) after firing a complete game two-hit shutout in his previous start on Sept. 15 at Philadelphia...did not walk a batter in either start and he joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Seattle, a 3-2 A's loss last year in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Nashville.

Saves/Opportunities: 33-for-56 (58.9%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 14-of-25 (56.0%) save opportunities over the last 63 games...is 33-for-56 (58.9%) for the season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the majors...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the fourth fewest saves.
- Has a 4.13 ERA (107 er in 233.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.66)...the last time the A's bullpen finished the season with an ERA above 4.62 was in 1997 (4.82).
- Has allowed 78 home runs, which is tied for third most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
