### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (72-85) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (77-81)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight after winning a season-high seven consecutive games and are now 14-5 over the last 19 contests...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 37-37 since then...are 72-85 (.459) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for ninth worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...finished last in the AL West in each of the previous two seasons...can clinch a tie for last with a loss or a Texas win today and would clinch sole possession of last with a loss and a Texas win...have never had three straight last place finishes in the AL West...have had more than two straight last place finishes in the AL twice in Athletics history (7, 1915-21; 4, 1940-43)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 124 days in fifth overall...the days in sole possession of last will be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's conclude the home portion of the schedule today...are 3-2 on the final homestand against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (0-2) and have won 11 of the last 15 home games...are 45-35 (.563) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...have the sixth best home record in the American League but the second worst road record...the home winning percentage is .212 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...leave following the game today for the final road trip of the season, a four-game series at Texas...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 13-9-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

**MORE AT HOME:** The A's hit two home runs last night to break the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum...now have 128 home runs at home, which tops the previous mark of 126 in 2000...have also set Oakland records for extra base hits (303) and strikeouts (713) at home...are slugging .470, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have 163 doubles, which is second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 411 runs scored, which ranks sixth (466 in 2000, 461 in 1999, 440 in 1996, 427 in 2002, 423 in 2001)...lead the American League in extra base hits, rank second in doubles and strikeouts, third in home runs and slugging and fourth in runs scored...the pitching staff has set an Oakland record for strikeouts at home (646)...has a 4.43 ERA, which will be third highest in Oakland history if it remains above 4.34 (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 97 home runs, which is second most in Oakland history (102 in 1996).

**A's IN SEPTEMBER:** The A's are 14-10 in September and need one more win to clinch a winning record in a month for the first time since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the 14 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 15-12 in June of 2015...the streak of 10 consecutive losing months is an Oakland record...have hit 41 home runs, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in Athletics history in the month of September (47 in 2000, 42 in 2012, 42 in 2013)...have struck out 222 times, which is third most in the AL and in Oakland history (276 in 2012, 223 in 1999)...have already set franchise records for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...also rank second in the AL in walks (88), tied for third in extra base hits (89) and fourth runs (130), slugging percentage (.475) and on-base percentage (.339).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have a season-high eight-game errorless streak, which is second longest by an A's team over last nine years (15, June 25-July 9, 2016)...however, lead the majors with 118 errors for the season, which is six more than any other team (CWS, 112)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in stolen bases allowed (109), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fewest outfield assists (21) and fourth in double plays (161).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have struck out a franchise record 1456 times, which is fourth most in American League history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1496 by TB

in 2017, 1482 by TB in 2016)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits (534) this year, tied for third in doubles (291) and fifth in home runs (228), walks (553) and slugging percentage (.435)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are sixth most (555 in 2001, 547 in 1996, 543 in 2000, 542 in 1999, 540 in 2004)...have 59 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is the most in the majors (CLE and MIN 58)...home runs have accounted for 353 of the A's 717 runs (49.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (41), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 205 home runs, which is eighth most in the American League but ties the Oakland record for home runs allowed in a season, set in 1996...have a 4.69 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.58 was in 1999 (4.69)...rank second in the majors with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 526 extra base hits, which is fourth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998)...have 1165 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1188 in 2016, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of the last 11 games and are 6-2 with a 2.91 ERA (19 er in 58.2 ip) over that span...overall, rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (655), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in fewest home runs (126) and most losses (59)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

**ROOKIES:** The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 52 home runs in just 225 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 24-25 (.490) against teams that have either clinched a playoff spot (BOS, CLE, HOU, NYY, WASH) or currently have a playoff spot (MIN)...are 48-60 (.444) against all other teams...are 33-27 (.550) during day games compared to 39-58 (.402) at night...are 29-42 (.408) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 15 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have 33 players on the active roster.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's have lost each of their last eight games to Seattle, which is the longest losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (previous: 7, Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009 and Aug. 13-Sept. 30, 2016)...have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season as they trail 6-12 entering the final game today...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 3-5 in Oakland and went 3-7 in Seattle...are 36-58 (.383) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-282 against the Mariners...that includes 183-126 in Oakland, 156-154 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-90 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...in **1914** the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in **1970** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in **1989** Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-4, 4.17 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 6-4 with a 4.17 ERA in 18 starts in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder (April 15-26 and May 26-Aug. 2)...the ERA is a career high as is his opponents batting average (.279), on-base percentage (.339), slugging percentage (.444) and OPS (.783)...has allowed 11 home runs and his average of 1.00 home runs per nine innings is a career low...his 18 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland.

**LAST NINE STARTS:** Is 4-1 with a 3.40 ERA (19 er in 50.1 ip) and .277 (53-for-191) opponents batting average over his last nine starts dating back to Aug. 8...the bullpen has blown the save in three of his four no decisions over that span and he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in the other start before he was removed following a rain delay...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 27 and was 0-2 with a 7.56 ERA and .330 opponents batting average in five starts in between.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-0 with a 2.79 ERA (19 er in 61.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA (27 er in 38.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...the only starting pitcher in Oakland history to go undefeated at home with five or more decisions is Kenny Rogers, who went 11-0 in 17 starts in 1998...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-10 with a 3.43 ERA (80 er in 210.0 ip) in 34 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.85 ERA (103 er in 191.0 ip) in 36 starts on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season today, but just his fourth in a day game...is 2-0 with a 3.20 ERA (7 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts during the day, 4-4 with a 4.41 ERA (39 er in 79.2 ip) in 15 starts at night.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 5-2 with a 3.30 ERA (29 er in 79.0 ip) in 13 starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with a 7.52 ERA (17 er in 20.1 ip) in five starts against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (16 er in 43.1 ip) and .248 (41-for-165) opponents batting average in seven starts on four days rest compared to 3-4 with a 4.82 ERA (30 er in 56.0 ip) and .303 (66-for-218) opponents average in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .279 opponents batting average, which includes a mark of .238 (41-for-172) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (66-for-211) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against lefties, .272 against righties...lefties are 12-for-74 (.162) against him over his last eight starts...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed this year have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .261 (24-for-92) with runners in scoring position but they are hitting just .171 (7-for-41) with RISP and two outs...has a .238 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is third highest in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...the opponents number three hitter is batting .489 (22-for-45) with five doubles, four home runs (.867 slugging percentage) and five walks (.540 on-base percentage).

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed 15 of his 47 runs in the first inning for a 7.50 ERA (15 er in 18.0 ip)...has a 3.43 ERA (31 er in 81.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are hitting .324 (24-for-74) in the first inning, .269 (83-for-309) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

**THIS AND THAT:** The bullpen has blown the save in four of his 18 starts...has four double plays, which is tied for second in the American League among pitchers...had the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...is 4-3 with a 4.78 ERA (40 er in 75.1 ip) in 14 starts since then

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starter on April 3 against Los Angeles (AL) and picked up the win in a 4-2 decision...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings on April 14 against Houston, his first career start without a strikeout...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...issued a career-high tying four walks May 3 at Minnesota...left his start on May 14 at Texas with a 4-3

lead but Madson blew the save...it was the first of four times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (Aug. 8 vs. Seattle, Aug. 30 at Los Angeles-AL, Sept. 5 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...was 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts after he was reinstated from the DL before returning to the DL a second time with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts...had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings at Iowa July 19 (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came July 29 at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr)...was reinstated from the DL Aug. 3 and is 4-2 with a 4.48 ERA (26 er in 52.1 ip) and .298 (61-for-205) opponents batting average in 11 starts since his return...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in a 9-3 victory over Baltimore Aug. 13.

**LAST START:** He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 4-1 win over Texas last Friday in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he surrendered a two-out solo home run to Choo in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

**GRAVEMAN vs. SEATTLE:** Is 1-3 with a 4.85 ERA (42.2 ip, 57 h, 24 r, 23 er, 10 bb, 24 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts...is 0-0 with a 2.70 ERA (3 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts at Safeco Field and 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA (21 er in 32.2 ip) in seven games, five starts, in his home ballparks...is 1-3 with a 4.99 ERA (22 er in 39.2 ip) in his seven starting assignments...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-6 A's loss in 10 innings on Aug. 8 in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters and had a 3-0 lead when he was charged with an unearned run in the third inning...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Dyson RBI single in the fourth and a 6-2 lead when he allowed a two-run double to Gamel in the sixth...left after 5.2 innings with a 6-4 lead but the pen allowed single runs in the seventh and eighth innings for the blown save.
