OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-85) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (76-83)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2017 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP RAUL ALCANTARA (1-1, 6.86) VS. LHP MARTIN PEREZ (12-12, 4.83) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, nine of the last 11 and 16 of the last 21 games...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 39-37 since then...are 74-85 (.465) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...the A's are in last place in the AL West and trail fourth place Texas by two games with three games remaining...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a last place finish in the West for the third consecutive season...have never finished last in the West three straight years...before divisional play, the A's had three or more consecutive last place finishes in the AL twice (7, 1915-21; 4, 1940-43)...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 126 days in fifth overall.

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's have clinched a winning record in September as they are 16-10 with two games remaining...that snaps an Oakland record streak of 10 consecutive months with a losing record...this is the first time the A's have posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the 16 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 17-9 in June of 2014...have hit 43 home runs, which is tied for second in the American League...it is second most Athletics history in the month of September and is four short of the record of 47 in 2000...have 97 extra base hits, which ranks fourth in the AL and is two short of the Athletics record for September (99 in 2013)...have struck out 234 times, which is fourth most in the AL and second most in Athletics history to the record of 276 in 2012...also rank second in the AL in walks (91), third in slugging percentage (.475) and fourth in on-base percentage (.337).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's opened their final road trip of the season last night with a win to extend their road winning streak to a season-high five games...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0)...have won back-to-back road series for the first time since Sept. 12-18 of last year (KC/TEX)...are 28-50 (.359) on the road and finished 46-35 (.568) at home...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 27-51)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years... the 50 road losses are the A's most since 2011 (also 50) and are tied for sixth most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977, 51 in 1993, 1997 and 1978)...the home winning percentage is .209 better than the road, which is currently the third largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999, .199 in 1986)...went 4-2 on the final homestand against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (1-2) and finished with a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 13-9-4 in home series and are 5-18-2 in road series

MORE ON THE ROAD: The A's have hit 101 home runs on the road, which is eighth most in Oakland history (130 in 1996, 123 in 1999, 113 in 2000, 111 in 1987, 103 in 2012, 103 in 2013, 102 in 2016)...hitters have set an Athletics record for strikeouts on the road (749)...are hitting .236 (631-for-2669), which is second lowest in the American League (TEX, .224) and currently third lowest in Oakland history (.230 in 1968, .234 in 2014, .239 in 2011)...have scored 310 runs, which is the fewest in the AL (DET, 312 in 78 games)...are averaging 3.97 runs per game on the road...have averaged under 4.00 runs per game on the road seven times in Oakland history but just twice over the last 38 years (3.81 in 2010, 3.83 in 2011)...the pitching staff has set an Athletics record for home runs allowed on the road (108).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their season-high errorless streak snapped at nine games last night...the streak tied for fifth longest in Oakland history...now have a Major League leading 119 errors, which is six more than any other team (CWS and MIL, 113)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also have a Major League leading 83 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2000 (also 83)...last had more in 1999 when they had 96...are tied for second in the American League in fewest outfield assists (21), rank third in stolen bases allowed (109), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (162).

OFFENSE: The A's have set a franchise record for strikeouts in a season (1468) and have 542 extra base hits, which is 13 short of the record of 555 set in 2001...the strikeouts are third most in the American League this year but are fifth most in AL history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1514 by TB

in 2017, 1482 by TB in 2016, 1471 by TEX in 2017)...have homered in a season-high 15 consecutive games, which is tied for the seventh longest such streak in Oakland history...now have 230 home runs, which is fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits and doubles (297) and fifth in home runs, walks (556) and slugging percentage (.436)...have been hit by the fewest pitches (42), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15)...have 61 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is tied for second most in the majors (CLE, 62)...home runs have accounted for 355 of the A's 727 runs (48.8%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's have set an Athletics record for wild pitches (83)... have set an Oakland record with 207 home runs, which is 13 short of the Athletics record of 220 by the Kansas City A's in 1964...have 1180 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1188 in 2016, 1183 in 2013)...have allowed 529 extra base hits, which is fourth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998)...have a 4.66 ERA and have not finished the season with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...the 83 wild pitches are second most in the majors (HOU, 85).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of the last 13 games and are 7-2 with a 2.78 ERA (22 er in 71.1 ip) over that span...overall, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (665), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in most losses (59)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

THIS AND THAT: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (14) have combined for 53 home runs in just 227 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/ Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...the A's are 34-27 (.557) during day games compared to 40-58 (.408) at night...are 24-25 (.490) against playoff teams, 50-60 (.455) against all other teams...are 31-42 (.425) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...are 35-35 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-50 (.438) before the break...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 1 second per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series as they lead 10-6 with three games remaining...have a seven-game winning streak, which is their longest against the Rangers since July 17-Sept. 10, 2005 when they also won seven straight...the Oakland record for longest winning streak against Texas is nine (July 28, 2002-April 9, 2003 and June 26, 2003-April 6, 2004)...are 2-5 in Texas but went 8-1 in Oakland, tying the Oakland record for home wins against the Rangers (8-2 in 2002, 8-1 in 2003)...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against Texas...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 48-44 against the Rangers... that breaks down to 186-170 in Oakland and 165-189 in Texas...are 98-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 448-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...*Jed Lowrie* has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1962** Bill Fischer walks Detroit's Bubba Morton on four pitches, snapping a string of 84 1/3 consecutive innings without walking a batter...in **1983** rookie pitcher Mike Warren, who started the year in Double-A, no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in the A's 3-0 win...in **1988** the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 6-2 for their 102nd win of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 101 set in 1971...in **1991** Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Raul Alcantara (1-1, 6.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is schedule to make the ninth start of his career today, his fifth against Texas...is 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA in seven games, including three starts, over two stints with the A's this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the starting rotation...made just one start and two appearances out of the bullpen before he was designated for assignment April 25...was 0-1 with a 16.71 ERA at the time...was selected by Oakland Sept. 5 at the conclusion of Triple-A Nashville's season and is 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 er in 12.2 ip) and .163 (7-for-43) opponents batting average in four games, including two starts, since his return...the two starts have come in his last two outings and came as last minute replacements for Jharel Cotton (Sept. 18 at Detroit) and Sean Manaea (Sept. 23 vs. Texas)...has not allowed a run in either of those two starts (8.2 ip, 4 h, 3 bb, 7 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .230 opponents batting average... however, 10 of the 17 hits he has allowed (58.8%) are for extra bases (six doubles, four home runs) and he has a .473 opponents slugging percentage...25 of the 48 hits he has allowed in his career (52.1%) are extra base hits (12 doubles, 13 home runs)...has issued 10 walks in 19.2 innings this year (4.58 per nine innings) and has hit three batters for a .341 opponents on-base percentage.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed four home runs in 19.2 innings this year (1.83 per nine innings) and has now surrendered 13 home runs in 42.0 innings over 12 career appearances (3.63 per nine innings)...the 13 home runs are tied for second most in Athletics history by a pitcher over the first 12 games of his career (Straily, 14).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 6.75 ERA (8 er in 10.2 ip) and .200 (8-for-40) opponents batting average in his three starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 7.00 ERA (7 er in 9.0 ip) and .265 (9-for-34) opponents average in four relief appearances...did not inherit any runners as a reliever and first batters faced were 1-for-3 with a walk.

MORE OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 7 of his 10 walks this year and 10 of 14 in his career to left-handed hitters...has yielded all four of his home runs with runners on base and opponents are batting .323 (10-for-31) with runners on compared to .163 (7-for-43) with the bases empty... has a .176 (9-for-51) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .348 (8-for-23) after that...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight (0-for-7) or nine hitter (0-for-7)...opponents are 3-for-20 (.150) with two outs...they are 3-for-15 (.200) when leading off an inning but he has walked four and hit one for a .400 on-base percentage.

2017 GAME-BY-GAME: Began the season in the starting rotation and started the fifth game of the season at Texas April 7...allowed a career high eight runs on four hits and two walks in 2.0 innings and was the losing pitcher in a 10-5 decision...it was the shortest start of his career... yielded two home runs to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least one home run in each of his first six career appearances (Adams 1996, Overton, 2016)...was moved to the bullpen and allowed two unearned run in 2.0 innings April 14 against Houston...his third outing came in relief on April 23 against Seattle when he allowed five runs on six hits in 3.0 innings...had a 16.71 ERA and .323 opponents batting average when he was designated for assignment April 25...was outrighted to Nashville April 29 and returned to Oakland Sept. 5 following the conclusion of the Sounds season...tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief in his first game on Sept. 8 against Houston...allowed a two-run home run to Betts in 2.0 innings at Boston Sept. 12...made an emergency start on Sept. 18 at Detroit when Jharel Cotton was injured during warm-ups and tossed 3.2 scoreless innings.

LAST START: He made his second consecutive emergency start, replacing Sean Manaea...combined with four relievers on a four-hit, 1-0 shutout over Texas last Saturday...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits... yielded a one-out single to Gomez in the second and a two-out single to Chirinos in the fifth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

MINORS: Was 1-2 with four saves and a 2.67 ERA in 18 games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was on the disabled list from May 26 to July 28 with a strained right elbow and had a four-game rehab assignment with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League (5.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 7 so) from July 17 to 25...combined with both clubs to go 1-2 with four saves and a 2.31 ERA in 22 games, five starts...did not allow a home run in 39.0 innings...walked just eight batters, an average 1.85 per nine innings...allowed a .255 opponents batting average, including .241 (19-for-79) against right-handed hitters compared to .271 (19-for-70) against left-handers. was 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in 17 relief appearances, 0-2 with a 3.21 ERA in five starts...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...opponents hit .167 with one walk (.189 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .218 batting average with the bases empty, .306 with runners on...had a .174 opponents average with RISP and two outs...did not allow a run in nine games on the road with Nashville (15.0 ip) and held the opponents to a .173 batting average.
