OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-87) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (78-83)

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2017 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 2:05 P.M. CDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (2-2, 3.75) VS. LHP COLE HAMELS (11-5, 4.10) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight but are 16-7 in their last 23 games...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 39-39 since then...are 74-87 (.460) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for ninth worst in the majors...the A's are in last place in the AL West and are guaranteed a last place finish in the West for the third consecutive season...is the first time they have ever finished last in the West three straight years...before divisional play, the A's had three or more consecutive last place finishes in the AL twice (7, 1915-21; 4, 1940-43)...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 128 days in fifth overall.

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's finished September with a winning record in the month (16-12), which snapped an Oakland record streak of 10 consecutive months with a losing record...marked the first time the A's have posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016... the 16 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 17-9 in June of 2014...hit 46 home runs, which were third most in the American League... it was second most in Athletics history in the month of September and was one short of the record of 47 in 2000...finished the month with 103 extra base hits, which tied for third in the AL and set a new Athletics record for September (was 99 in 2013)...struck out 249 times, which was fifth most in the AL and second most in Athletics history to the record of 276 in 2012... also finished the month third in the AL in walks (97), fourth in slugging percentage (.469) and fifth in on-base percentage (.334).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on their final road trip of the season... Friday's loss snapped a season-high five-game road winning streak...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0)...have won back-to-back road series for the first time since Sept. 12-18 of last year (KC/TEX)...are 28-52 (.350) on the road and finished 46-35 (.568) at home...are tied for the worst road record in the American League (CWS, 28-52)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 52 road losses are the A's most since 1979 (58) and are tied for second most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977)...the home winning percentage is 2.18 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999, .199 in 1986)...went 4-2 on the final homestand against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (1-2) and finished with a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 13-9-4 in home series and are 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE ON THE ROAD: The A's have hit 104 home runs on the road, which is fifth most in Oakland history (130 in 1996, 123 in 1999, 113 in 2000, 111 in 1987)...hitters have set an Athletics record for strikeouts on the road (764)...are hitting .236 (646-for-2737), which is second lowest in the American League (TEX, .224) and currently third lowest in Oakland history (.230 in 1968, .234 in 2014, .239 in 2011)...have scored 317 runs, which is the fewest in the AL (DET, 318 in 80 games)...are averaging 3.96 runs per game on the road...have averaged under 4.00 runs per game on the road seven times in Oakland history but just twice over the last 38 years (3.81 in 2010, 3.83 in 2011)...the pitching staff has set an Athletics record for home runs allowed on the road (111).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their season-high errorless streak snapped at nine games Thursday night...the streak tied for fifth longest in Oakland history...now have a Major League leading 121 errors, which is seven more than any other team (CWS/MIL, 114)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also have a Major League leading 83 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2000 (also 83)...last had more in 1999 when they had 96...are tied for third in the American League in fewest outfield assists (22), rank third in stolen bases allowed (111), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (162).

OFFENSE: The A's have set a franchise record for strikeouts in a season (1483) and have 548 extra base hits, which is seven short of the record of 555 set in 2001...the strikeouts are tied for second most in the American League this year but are third most in AL history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1514 by TB in 2017)...have homered in a season-high 17 consecutive games, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history

(23 from July 2-27, 1996; 18 from July 30-Aug. 17, 1999; 18 from July 6-27, 1999)...now have 233 home runs, which is fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits, tied for third in doubles (300), fourth in home runs, and are fifth in walks (562) and slugging percentage (.435)...have been hit by the fewest pitches (43), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15)...have 64 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is the most in the majors (CLE, 63) during that stretch...home runs have accounted for 360 of the A's 734 runs (49.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's have set an Athletics record for wild pitches (84)... have set an Oakland record with 210 home runs, which is 10 short of the Athletics record of 220 by the Kansas City A's in 1964...have 1192 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014)...have allowed 536 extra base hits, which is third most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996)...have a 4.69 ERA and have not finished the season with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (also 4.69)...the 84 wild pitches are second most in the majors (HOU, 86).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 22 earned runs over their last six starts (29.0 ip, 6.83 era) but are 7-4 with a 3.49 ERA (30 er in 77.1 ip) over their last 15 games...overall, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (667), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in most losses (61)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

THIS AND THAT: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (14) have combined for 53 home runs in just 229 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...the A's are 34-27 (.557) during day games compared to 40-60 (.400) at night...are 24-25 (.490) against playoff teams, 50-62 (.446) against all other teams...are 31-44 (.413) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...are 35-37 (.486) since the All-Star Break after going 39-50 (.438) before the break...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 56 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series as they lead 10-8 with one game remaining...had their seven-game winning streak against Texas snapped Friday, which was their longest against the Rangers since July 17-Sept. 10, 2005 when they also won seven straight...the Oakland record for longest winning streak against Texas is nine (July 28, 2002-April 9, 2003 and June 26, 2003-April 6, 2004)...are 2-7 in Texas but went 8-1 in Oakland, tying the Oakland record for home wins against the Rangers (8-2 in 2002, 8-1 in 2003)...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against Texas...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 48-46 against the Rangers over the last five seasons...are 351-361 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 186-170 in Oakland and 165-191 in Texas...are 98-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 448-443 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie has set the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 48 (previous: Jason Giambi, 47 in 2001)...**Khris Davis** hit .321 (27-for-84) with five doubles, six home runs, 18 RBI, and a .997 OPS in September.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove defeats St. Louis 6-2 in the first game of the World Series...in **1950** Gus Zernial hits three home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago but the A's lose 4-3...he adds another home run in the nightcap, a 10-6 loss...in **1983** the A's use a club record 22 players in a 7-3 loss to Kansas City in the second game of a doubleheader...Oakland uses six pitchers including five (Jeff Jones, Tom Underwood, Dave Beard, Curt Young and Keith Atherton) in the ninth inning when the Royals scored four times to break a 3-3 tie...in **2000** Tim Hudson combines with Jason Isringhausen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Texas in the final game of the season...it is Hudson's 20th win of the season and it clinches the A's 11th AL West Championship...in **2003** Ramon Hernandez has a "walk-off" bunt in the 12th inning as the A's defeat Boston 5-4 in Game 1 of the ALDS.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (2-2, 3.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has combined to make just 17 starts this year between the majors and minors due to two stints on the disabled list...is 2-2 with a 3.75 ERA in six starts over two stints with the A's...has walked just eight batters in 36.0 innings (2.00 per nine innings)...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3 and is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) and .194 (19-for-98) opponents batting average in four starts since returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when Triple-A Nashville's season concluded...his 1.93 ERA in September was sixth lowest in the American League...went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA nine starts with the Sounds and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League.

THE DISABLED LIST: Began the season on Oakland's 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...started a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was on the Sounds disabled list from June 9 to Aug. 13 with a strained right oblique.

LOSSES: Is 4-11 in 20 career starts...the 11 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 20 career games...Mike Morgan has the most as he was 2-13 in 16 career games with the A's.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (10 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts at home and is 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts on the road...is now 0-8 with a 6.43 ERA (40 er in 56.0 ip) in 11 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 4-3 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...his eight-game career-opening home losing streak is the longest by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty had an 11-game streak from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the third longest home losing streak in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough lost nine straight from Sept. 27, 1981 to July 9, 1982...Keough holds the Oakland record with a 14-game home losing streak from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979.

THIS AND THAT: Picked up the win Sept. 20 at Detroit for his first career victory in 10 starts during the day...is 1-7 during the day, 3-4 at night...the A's are 4-2 in his starting assignments this year after going 3-11 last year... has allowed a .241 opponents batting average, including .172 (11-for-64) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (21-for-69) against left-handers...opponents are 3-for-15 (.200) with runners in scoring position.

2017 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland on May 29...allowed three home runs, which marks the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in a start...yielded a leadoff home run to Jackson in the third inning and then surrendered four runs in the fourth inning on back-to-back homers by Santana and Encarnacion, a RBI singles by Gomes and a Jackson sacrifice fly...had a no decision in the A's 10-4 win over Washington on *June 3*...Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the first but he allowed a Drew sacrifice fly in the second...the A's built a 6-1 lead before he allowed a three-run home run to Lind in the third...had a 7-4 lead when he was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...had a no decision in the A's 11-4 win over Houston in the second game of the doubleheader on **Sept. 9** in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first five innings but Peacock shutout the A's on three hits over the first five innings...Mengden allowed three runs in the sixth on a two-run home run by Altuve and a RBI single by Reddick but Oakland tied the game in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Moll to start the seventh...tossed his first career complete game, a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Philadelphia Sept. 15...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a career-high 118 pitches... those were the most pitches by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 119 on May 3, 2015 at Texas...Crawford had both of the Phillies hits...had a oneout single in the third and a leadoff single in the sixth...retired each of the final 11 batters he faced...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Detroit Sept. 20...it marked the first winning streak of his career.. tossed seven scoreless innings and yielded seven hits without walking a batter... joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...allowed a runner to reach third base three times...was relieved by Dull to start the eighth inning with a 3-0 lead and Dull allowed two runs in the ninth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and two walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high and A's season-high 19.0 innings...the streak came to an end when Yonder

walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth...the no decision came in a 7-6 loss at Texas on July 25...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a solo home run to Desmond in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more runs in the third and he allowed a RBI double to Wilson in the fourth...then yielded a two-run single to Odor in the fifth and was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the fifth inning, runners on first and second, and the A's leading 5-4...Rzepczynski got the final out but Beltre hit a two-run walk-off home run off Madson.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in nine starts with Nashville...also had a two-start rehab assignment with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and did not allow a run in 5.0 innings (1 h, 3 bb, 9 so)...combined with both clubs for a 2-4 record, a 3.69 ERA and .237 opponents batting average...the batting average broke down to .190 (15-for-79) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (26-for-94) against right-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...yielded a .217 average with runners in scoring position... tossed more than five innings in just two of his starts.
