OAKLAND NOTES

- Frankie Montas turned in his shortest outing of the season, lasting 5.1 innings and surrendering five earned runs...he also allowed runs in the first five innings of a game for the first time this season.
- Montas also took his first loss of the season...he had been 3-0 in three starts.
- **Khris Davis**' second-inning home run was his third straight at-bat with a home run...five of his last seven hits have been home runs.
- Davis recorded two consecutive games with multiple extra-base hits for the second time this season (4/11 and 4/13).
- With today's loss, Oakland fell below .500 for the first time since 5/16/18 (21-22).
- The Athletics fell to 10-24 against the AL West.
- Matt Chapman committed two errors in a game for only the second time this season, and the third time in his career.
- Matt Olson snapped an 0-for-15 streak with a two-run home run in the seventh inning.

HOUSTON NOTES

- Justin Verlander recorded his 14th quality start in 15 starts total...the three earned runs he gave up tie his most of any start this season.
- In the last eight contests, Houston has outscored Oakland 69-20...The eight-game winning streak against the Athletics is the longest in Astros history.
- The Astros won their eighth game in a row, their longest winning streak since an 11-game win streak from 5/27/17 to 6/5/17.
- Houston completed their fifth sweep of 2018, and their second in a row against the A's.
- Alex Bregman's hitting streak snapped at ten games...
 However, he extended his on-base streak to 25 games, the second-longest in MLB (Shin-Soo Choo, 28 games).
