#### **OAKLAND NOTES**

- Oakland is now 38-19 since the All-Star Break, and 59-25 since June 16, both of which are the best records in baseball over those respective spans.
- The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is now three...currently have a 6.5 game lead over Tampa Bay, who won today...they are currently 1.5 games out of the first AL Wild Card spot behind the Yankees, who also won today...with Houston winning, the Athletics now have a tragic number of six to be eliminated from the division race.
- Khris Davis had his 22nd career multi-homer game, his seventh this year...set a career high (43 in 2017) with his 45th home run of the season, which leads the Major Leagues...the 45 homers are fourth-most in Oakland history and the sixth-most in Athletics history.
- Davis's 10th-inning home run was his fourth career walk-off home run, two of which have come this season (5/5 vs. Baltimore).
- Mark Canha hit his 17th home run, besting a career high that had been set in 2015...it was Canha's second pinch-hit homer of his season as well as his career...13 of Canha's homers have come against lefties, which is second in the American League behind Texas' Joey Gallo (15).
- Blake Treinen lowered his ERA to 0.83, the lowest among all Major League pitchers with at least 20 innings pitched...he now has a 13.1-inning hitless streak, which is second in Oakland history to Sean Manea's record of 14.0 earlier this year.

### MINNESOTA NOTES

- Joe Mauer reached base with an intentional walk in the sixth...he now has reached base safely 3,069 times in his career, and needs to reach base three more times to tie Harmon Killebrew for the most in club history.
- In a no decision, **José Berríos** struck out eight for the second start in a row, the third time he has done so in 2018.
- **Robbie Grossman** homered for the first time since 7/2/18 at Milwaukee, snapping a 51-game homerless streak, which had been the longest of his career.
- **Taylor Rogers** extended his scoreless streak to 23.1 innings, the eighth-longest streak in club history and the longest active streak in the majors.
- Ehire Adrianza went 2 for 4, and is now batting .438 in his career vs. the Athletics.
