## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-0) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (0-1)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's opened their 51st season in Oakland yesterday with a win...it marked the third time in the last four years the A's won their opener... followed each of the previous two Opening Day wins with a loss and have not started the season 2-0 since 2004...the A's have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)... has a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland... only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**OPENING DAY RECAP:** The A's defeated the Angels yesterday 6-5 in 11 innings after trailing 4-0 entering the bottom of the fifth...it marked just the second time in Athletics history the A's overcame a deficit of four or more runs to win on Opening Day...the other time was in 1925 when the Philadelphia A's trailed Boston 6-0 after six innings before winning 9-8 in 10 innings...it was the fourth Opening Day walk-off in Oakland history (1972, 1982 and 1984), but Marcus Semien was the first Athletic with walk-off *hit* in an opener since Bing Miller had a walk-off single on April 17, 1934 in a 6-5 win over the Yankees...it was the seventh extra inning game on Opening Day in Oakland history (1972, 1980, 1982, 1987, 2008, 2012) and the third extra inning win...at four hours and two minutes, it was the longest opener by time in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 3:38 in 2008...Khris Davis and Matt Olson hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth innings, marking the second time in Oakland history the A's have hit back-to-back home runs on Opening Day...the other time was in 1990 by Dave Henderson and Terry Steinbach.

**WEST COAST:** The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast... are 1-0 on this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-0) and Texas (four games)...that is followed by an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games) from April 6-15...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games) beginning April 16.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

**OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS:** Four players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Davis, Joyce, Lowrie, Semien)...that does not include Kendall Graveman, who became just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years (Sonny Gray, 2014-15)...Oakland has used 11 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 13 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...Matt Olson was the A's seventh different Opening Day starter at first base in the last seven years, Matt Chapman was the A's fifth different third baseman in the last five years and Boog Powell was the A's fifth different center fielder in the last five years...Marcus Semien made his fourth consecutive Opening Day start at short.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...prior to last year, the A's had not opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster,

which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...10 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Casilla, Coulombe, Davis, Graveman, Hendriks, Joyce, Lowrie, Manaea, Semien, Triggs) and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Chapman, Gossett, Hatcher, Maxwell, Mengden, Olson, Pinder, Powell, Smolinski, Treinen)...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Butcher, Pagán, Piscotty).

**TENURE:** Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015... only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

**ROOKIE AND VETERANS:** The A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for just the second time in the last 12 years (also 2014)...five players had six or more years of service: Casilla (10 years, 148 days), Lowrie (9 years, 111 days), Joyce (8 years, 123 days), Lucroy (7 years, 136 days) and Petit (7 years, 16 days).

**THE YOUNG AND THE OLD:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turns 24 yesterday, is the youngest player...he is followed by Matt Chapman (24 years, 335 days), Daniel Mengden (25 years, 38 days) and Boog Powell (25 years, 74 days)...there are eight players age 30 or older...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days)...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (33 years, 347 days), Matt Joyce (33 years, 238 days), Yusmeiro Petit (33 years, 127 days) and Chris Hatcher (33 years, 76 days).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A'S ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): Sunday vs. Los Angeles (AL), next Tuesday and Thursday against Texas, April 7 and 8 at Los Angeles (AL) and April 10 at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's won the first game of 2018 last night after going 7-12 against the Angels last year for the second consecutive season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 32-45 (.416) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)... have lost 10 of the last 12 games at Angel Stadium and 26 of the last 37... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 429-366 against the Angels... that includes 224-172 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 478-443 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** hit his third career Opening Day home run as an Athletic yesterday, which ties the Oakland record held by Dave Henderson and Terry Steinbach...**Matt Olson** became the fourth Major Leaguer dating back to 1908 to hit an Opening Day home run on his birthday...he joins Jeff Mathis (2011), Ian Stewart (2010) and Scott Rolen (2000).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster and is beginning his third season in the majors...also started the second game of the season last year, also against the Angels...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA in three games this spring, all starts...also pitched in a minor league game on March 23...allowed a .237 (9-for-38) opponents batting average...issued five walks in 10.2 innings...yielded two runs or fewer in each start.

**MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 1-2 with a 5.10 ERA (30.0 ip, 30 h, 19 r, 17 er, 11 bb, 19 so, 5 hr) in six career starts...is 0-2 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts in Anaheim and 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...went 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA (17.1 ip, 20 h, 13 r, 12 er, 7 bb, 12 so, 2

hr) in four starts last year...the first no decision came in a 7-6 loss in Oakland on April 4...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook...then took the loss in an 8-5 decision at Los Angeles April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...had another no decision in the A's 11-10 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 6...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the first and a solo home run to Trout in the third...Oakland scored four times in the fourth inning to take a 4-2 lead, but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a two-run double by Graterol, a RBI single by Pennington and an error...the lone win came in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 6 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and logged a career-high 116 pitches...allowed five hits and walked three and retired the side in order just once (5th inning).

**2017 RECAP:** Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...this marked just the third time in Oakland history (Wengert, 161.1 ip in 1996 and 134.0 ip in 1997) and fourth time in Athletics history (Garver, 145 ip in 1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the fifth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (Karsay, 24 in 1997; Wengert, 25 in 1996; Young, 27 in 1986; Langford, 29 in 1979)...struck out 264 batters over his first two seasons, which are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors (Hudson, 301; Zito, 283)...his 19 wins tied for sixth most.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 18 home runs and issued 49 of his 55 walks to righties...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties...now has a .207 (48-for-232) career batting average and .565 OPS against lefties compared to .271 (254-for-936) with a .783 OPS against righties...12 of the 18 home runs he allowed were solo shots...allowed a .160 batting average with two strikes...held the three hitter in the batting order to a .216

batting average but the two hitter batted .377...now has a .207 (28-for-135) career average against the three hitter.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Went 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA in 13 starts in Oakland and allowed just five home runs in 68.2 innings (0.66 per nine innings)...was 6-7 with a 4.50 ERA in 16 starts on the road and yielded 13 home runs in 90.0 innings (1.30 per nine innings)...is now 11-6 with a 3.55 ERA (60 er in 152.0 ip) in 27 career games at home, 8-13 with a 4.70 ERA (79 er in 151.1 ip) in 27 starts on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Was 6-1 with a 3.57 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 6-9 with a 4.89 ERA and .292 opponents average in 18 starts at night...tied for sixth in the American League in day wins...is now 8-3 with a 3.53 ERA (41 er in 104.2 ip) in 18 career day games, 11-16 with a 4.44 ERA (98 er in 198.2 ip) in 36 starts at night.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Was 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the All-Star Break, 5-5 with a 5.23 ERA and .317 opponents average in 13 starts after the break...allowed eight home runs in 93.1 innings before the break, 10 in 65.1 innings after the break

**INNING BY INNING:** Yielded 43 of his 88 runs over the first two innings of his starts...had a 5.91 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 3.08 ERA over innings three through five and a 7.13 ERA in the sixth inning...did not allow a run after the sixth inning (8.2 ip)

**THIS AND THAT:** Went 5-7 against AL West competition, 7-3 against all other teams...tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (4), tied for fifth in triples (5) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (11) and hit batters (10)...received no runs of support in four of his 10 losses.

**MORE 2017:** Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings in his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 decision...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an AL pitcher...had a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1 to 18...compiled an 11.37 ERA and .415 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned four starts...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch...went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...tied for fifth in the AL in losses in August...struck out just seven batters in 17.2 innings, an average of 3.57 per nine innings...is now 3-7 with a 5.75 ERA (33 er in 51.2 ip) in 11 career starts in August...then went 3-2 with a 3.54 ERA in five starts in September and is 4-2 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) in eight career starts in the month...tossed a career-high 116 pitches for his 10th win of the season Sept. 6 against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 11 hits in 3.2 innings in an 11-1 loss at Boston Sept. 12...was scratched from his scheduled start Sept. 23 against the Rangers with a left upper back strain...returned to make his final start Sept. 28 at Texas and allowed one unearned run in 6.2 innings for the win.

<b>RHP Daniel Mengden (3-2, 3.14 ERA in 2017):</b> Went 0-0 with a 6.12 ERA in seven games, including five starts, during the spring...ranked fourth among Cactus League pitchers with 25.0 innings pitched...posted a 10.80 ERA over his first four games...then started in each of his final three assignments and compiled a 3.00 ERA...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Angeles, a start in the A's 8-1 loss at Anaheim on Sept. 27, 2016 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...combined to make just 18 starts between the majors and minors last year due to two stints on the disabled list...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland...was also 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Triple-A Nashville and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage

- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the American League, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
