OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-1) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (1-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have started the season 1-1 for the second consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...this marks the 20th consecutive season Oakland has not swept or been swept in the first series of the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...has a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's have started the season with back-to-back one-run games for the second time in the last 32 years (also 2016)...have started the season with three straight one-run games twice in Oakland history (1972 and 2016)...went 21-21 in one-run decisions last year.

WEST COAST: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...are 1-1 on this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-1) and Texas (four games)...that is followed by an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games) from April 6-15...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games) beginning April 16.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Four players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Davis, Joyce, Lowrie, Semien)...that does not include Kendall Graveman, who became just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years (Sonny Gray, 2014-15)...Oakland has used 11 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 13 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...Matt Olson was the A's seventh different Opening Day starter at first base in the last seven years, Matt Chapman was the A's fifth different third baseman in the last five years and Boog Powell was the A's fifth different center fielder in the last five years...Marcus Semien made his fourth consecutive Opening Day start at short.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...prior to last year, the A's had not opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...10 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Casilla, Coulombe, Davis, Graveman, Hendriks, Joyce, Lowrie, Manaea, Semien, Triggs) and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Chapman, Gossett, Hatcher, Maxwell, Mengden, Olson, Pinder, Powell, Smolinski, Treinen)...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Bucher, Pagán, Piscotty).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for just the second time in the last 12 years (also 2014)...five players had six or more years of service: Casilla (10 years, 148 days), Lowrie (9 years, 111 days), Joyce (8 years, 123 days), Lucroy (7 years, 136 days) and Petit (7 years, 16 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turned 24 on Thursday, is the youngest player...he is followed by Matt Chapman (24 years, 335 days), Daniel Mengden (25 years, 38 days) and Boog Powell (25 years, 74 days)...there are eight players age 30 or older...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days)...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (33 years, 347 days), Matt Joyce (33 years, 238 days), Yusmeiro Petit (33 years, 127 days) and Chris Hatcher (33 years, 76 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): tomorrow vs. Los Angeles (AL), next Tuesday and Thursday against Texas, April 7 and 8 at Los Angeles (AL) and April 10 at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's have split the first two games of 2018 after going 7-12 against the Angels last year for the second consecutive season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 32-46 (.410) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 10 of the last 12 games at Angel Stadium and 26 of the last 37...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 429-367 against the Angels...that includes 224-173 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 478-444 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson has hit safely in each of his last seven games against the Angels and has homered in five of those...is 9-for-34 (.265) with six home runs and nine RBI in nine career games against Los Angeles...**Yusmeiro Petit** inherited his first runner of the season last night and stranded him...now has a streak of 32 consecutive inherited runners stranded and has not allowed an inherited runner to score since May 8, 2016 at Chicago (NL).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

This is the second time the A's have played on March 31...in 2014 the A's extended their Opening Day losing streak to a Major League record 10 consecutive games in a 2-0 loss to Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (2-2, 3.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Begins his third season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the 22nd of his career.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-0 with a 6.12 ERA in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .293 (29-for-99) opponents batting average...ranked fourth among Cactus League pitchers with 25.0 innings pitched...posted a 10.80 ERA over his first four games...then started in each of his final three assignments and compiled a 3.00 ERA.

MENGDEN vs. LOS ANGELES: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 8-1 loss at Anaheim on Sept. 27, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Trout in the first and was charged with seven runs in the fourth inning without recording an out...Marte had a grand slam and Graterol an RBI double and he was relieved by Neal with runners on second and third...Neal allowed both runs to score.

2017 RECAP: Combined to make just 18 starts between the majors and minors due to two stints on the disabled list...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland...was also 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Triple-A Nashville and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded...his ERA during his second stint was fifth lowest in the American League over that span.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .187 (14-for-75) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .268 (22-for-82) against left-handers...issued seven of his nine walks to righties...allowed a .176 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that...his career splits are .201 (35-for-174) the first time through the lineup, .305 (84-for-275) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in three starts at home, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA in four starts on the road...is now 0-8 with a 6.43 ERA (40 er in 56.0 ip) in 11 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 5-3 with a 4.12 ERA (27 er in 59.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road...his eight-game career-opening home losing streak is the longest by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty had an 11-game streak from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the third longest home losing streak in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough lost nine straight from Sept. 27, 1981 to July 9, 1982.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 0.64 ERA in innings one and two, a 4.34 ERA from the third inning on...his career numbers are 1.93 (9 er in 42.0 ip) in innings one and two, 7.15 (58 er in 73.0 ip) from the third inning on...tied for fifth in the AL in complete games (1)...made five of his seven starts during the day...has made 11 of his 21 career starts in day games...the A's went 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments after going 3-11 (.214) in 2016.

MORE 2017: Began the season on Oakland's 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Andrew Triggs (5-6, 4.27 ERA in 2017): Went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts...allowed a .227 (20-for-88) opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...is 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17.0 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 8 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Los Angeles...went 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA (1 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts last year...was on the A's Opening Day roster in 2017 and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...lost each of his final four starts of 2017 (20 er in 18.2 ip, 9.64 ERA) and the four-game losing streak is a career-high.

Varner...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was recalled for the first time May 29 and allowed three home runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day at Cleveland...it is the only time in his career he allowed more than one home run in a start...allowed four runs in 4.2 innings in his next start June 3 against Washington and was 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA in two starts when he was optioned back to Nashville June 3...returned to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded and went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA in five starts...including 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA in September...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in September...tossed his first career complete game and the A's only complete game of the season a two-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Philadelphia Sept. 15...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a career-high 118 pitches...tossed seven scoreless innings in his next start Sept. 20 at Detroit for the first winning streak of his career...it was his first career victory in 10 starts during the day...did not walk a batter and joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...did not allow a run in the first three innings of his next start Sept. 26 against Seattle for a career-high and A's season-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed seven scoreless innings to defeat the Rangers in the final game of the season Oct. 1 at Texas...finished the season with a 23.0-inning scoreless streak on the road, which is two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991).

- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the American League, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)...had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

- Compiled a 9.82 ERA and .378 opponents batting average in eight relief appearances this spring...walked six batters in 7.1 innings...did not allow an earned run in six of his eight outings.

- Logged a 10.80 ERA in seven spring training appearances...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but surrendered three home runs.
- Has not allowed a run in 11 of his 12 appearances against the Angels over the previous three seasons (12.0 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr, 0.75 ERA)...is 2-0 with four saves and a 2.51 ERA (8 er in 28.2 ip) in career appearances against Los Angeles (AL).

Last Year: Began the season as the A's closer and saved a team-leading 16 games before Blake Treinen took over in July...was 16-for-23 (69.6%) in save opportunities, which was the second lowest percentage in the majors...compiled a 4.27 ERA in 63 games.

- Had a loss, a save and a blown save in four appearances against Los Angeles (AL) last year (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 1 hr).
