OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-2) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (2-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have started the season 1-2 for the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last eight years...this marks the 20th consecutive season Oakland has not swept or been swept in the first series of the season...it is the eight straight season the A's have lost or split their first series of the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...has a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

WEST COAST: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...are 1-2 on this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Texas (four games)...that is followed by an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games) from April 6-15...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games) beginning April 16.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have gone back-to-back games without a home run for the first time since Aug. 19-20 of last year...have not gone more than two straight games without a home run since Sept. 20-24, 2016 when they had a four-game streak...the A's pitching staff has walked just two batters over the first three games (29.0 ip), which is tied with Cleveland for the fewest in the majors...that includes just one walk in 18.1 innings by the starters.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Four players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Davis, Joyce, Lowrie, Semien)...that does not include Kendall Graveman, who became just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years (Sonny Gray, 2014-15)...Oakland has used 11 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 13 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...prior to last year, the A's had not opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...10 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Casilla, Coulombe, Davis, Graveman, Hendriks, Joyce, Lowrie, Manaea, Semien, Triggs) and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Chapman, Gossett, Hatcher, Maxwell, Mengden, Olson, Pinder, Powell, Smolinski, Treinen)...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Bucher, Pagán, Piscotty).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have

played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for just the second time in the last 12 years (also 2014)...five players had six or more years of service: Casilla (10 years, 148 days), Lowrie (9 years, 111 days), Joyce (8 years, 123 days), Lucroy (7 years, 136 days) and Petit (7 years, 16 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turned 24 on Thursday, is the youngest player...he is followed by Matt Chapman (24 years, 335 days), Daniel Mengden (25 years, 38 days) and Boog Powell (25 years, 74 days)...there are eight players ages 30 or older...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days)...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (33 years, 347 days), Matt Joyce (33 years, 238 days), Yusmeiro Petit (33 years, 127 days) and Chris Hatcher (33 years, 76 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): today vs. Los Angeles (AL), Tuesday and Thursday against Texas, April 7 and 8 at Los Angeles (AL) and April 10 at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost two of the first three games of this series after going 7-12 against the Angels last year for the second consecutive season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 32-47 (.405) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 10 of the last 12 games at Angel Stadium and 26 of the last 37...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 429-368 against the Angels...that includes 225-173 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 479-444 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jonathan Lucroy has hit safely in each of his last eight games against the Angels (10-for-31, .323) and is a .304 (24-for-79) career hitter against Los Angeles...**Yusmeiro Petit** inherited his first runner of the season Friday night and stranded him...now has a streak of 32 consecutive inherited runners stranded and has not allowed an inherited runner to score since May 8, 2016 at Chicago (NL).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1996** the A's play on April 1 for the first time in Oakland history and lose to the Toronto Blue Jays, 9-6 in Las Vegas...the A's play their first homestand in Las Vegas as the Coliseum was not ready after renovations to the stadium...in **2003** Tim Hudson and Ricardo Rincon combine on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Seattle, the first Opening Day shutout in Oakland history...Erubiel Durazo sets an Oakland Opening Day record with five RBI.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (4-11, 6.11 ERA in 2017)

FOR STARTERS: Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...went 4-11 in 18 starts last year and his 11 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first 18 games of his career (Mike Morgan went 2-13 in 16 career games with Oakland).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a save and a 4.73 ERA in five games, including one start...allowed a .235 (12-for-51) opponents batting average... each of his first four appearances came in relief before starting in his final outing...allowed two runs in 0.2 innings in his first outing and four runs in 3.2 innings in his final outing but had a 1.00 ERA in three games in between.

GOSSETT vs. LOS ANGELES: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 3-1 A's loss at Anaheim on Aug. 28, 2017...allowed a run in the first inning on a Calhoun RBI single, but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...then yielded a RBI double to Cowart in the fourth inning to give the Angels the lead for good...also allowed an unearned run in the seventh when Maldonado scored on a Joyce error following a Revere RBI double.

2017 RECAP: Went 4-11 with a 6.11 ERA in 18 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...his .267 winning percentage was third lowest in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since Steve Karsay went 3-12 (.200) in 1997...had 91.1 innings pitched and did not qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 90 innings pitched, he had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.549), the fourth highest batting average (.306) and OPS (.906) and the fifth highest ERA...using the 90 inning minimum, his slugging percentage, OPS and average of 2.07 home runs per nine innings were second highest in Oakland history to Gil Heredia in 2001 (.554, .911, 2.22)...his ERA was sixth highest and the highest since Omar Olivares had a 6.75 ERA in 2000...ranked fifth among AL rookies in games started (18), sixth in innings pitched (91.1) and eighth in strikeouts (72)...tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in wild pitches (10).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .296 (63-for-213) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .319 (53-for-166) against left-handers...surrendered 15 of his 21 home runs to righties...yielded a .315 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .225 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .360 after that...opponents hit .359 with a .410 on-base percentage and .543 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .200 batting average but the nine hitter batted .419.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.50 ERA in the first inning, a 5.19 ERA in innings two and three and a 9.08 ERA from the fourth inning on...his opponents batting average over those splits were .209, .259 and .379...made 12 of his 18 starts on the road and 10 during the day...received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and was 0-10 in those starts...went 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...was 1-7 in eight starts against AL West competition, 3-4 against all other teams.

MORE 2017: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...had a sacrifice hit in his first professional plate appearance but then had an infield single off Edinson Volquez in the fourth inning for his first ML hit...joins Tim Hudson (June 8, 1999 at San

Diego) as the only pitchers in Oakland history with a hit in their ML debut...earned his first ML win in his third start, allowing two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 win at Chicago (AL) June 24...yielded a career-high nine hits in a 7-6 win over the White Sox July 4 but had a no decision...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games through July 4 (3 bb in 26.0 ip, 1.04 walks per nine innings)...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...then walked two batters or more in nine of his final 13 starts (28 bb in 65.1 ip, 3.86 per nine innings)...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...allowed a run on three hits in a career-high 7.0 innings at San Francisco Aug. 2 and picked up the win...however was optioned to Nashville the next day with a 3-6 record, a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in 10 starts...was recalled Aug. 23 and went 1-5 with a 7.47 ERA and .342 opponents batting average in eight starts following his return...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 28...finished August 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts...then went 1-4 with an 8.42 ERA and .336 opponents batting average in six starts in September...based on a minimum of 25 innings pitched, his ERA was the highest in the majors in the month and the highest by an A's pitcher in September since Hod Lisenbee had a 9.10 ERA in 1936...tied for the ML lead with nine home runs in September...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3...struck out a career-high seven in an 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader Sept. 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Detroit Sept. 19...yielded a career-high four home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-1 loss to Seattle Sept. 25...allowed four runs in a career-low 1.2 innings and took the loss in his final start Sept. 30 at Texas.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Compiled a 4-4 record with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against left-handers...opponents hit .161 with runners in scoring position and two outs...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...tossed six innings or fewer 12 times...walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...took the loss in his only start in June on the 5th at Omaha and was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts when he was promoted to Oakland June 14...ranked sixth in the PCL in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time...returned to Nashville following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland and went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-6, 4.27 ERA in 2017): Went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts...allowed a .227 (20-for-88) opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 1 er, 8 so) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Texas...had a win in his only start last year on April 18 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 5 so)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...lost each of his final four starts of 2017 (20 er in 18.2 ip, 9.64 ERA) and the four-game losing streak is a career-high.

- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams...has pitched in 215 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
