OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-3) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (1-3)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning the opener...are 1-3 after the first four games for the second time in the last three years (2016)... have not started the season 1-4 since 2011...lost or split the first series of the season for the eighth consecutive year...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland... only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...has a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League... since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

WEST COAST: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast... are 1-3 on this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (four games)...begin an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games) on Friday... return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games) beginning April 16.

THIS AND THAT: The A's issued two walks yesterday after walking just two batters over the first three games...the four walks are the fewest in the majors...however, have allowed 44 hits, which are the most in the majors...lead the American League in wild pitches (4)...A's starting pitchers have allowed 24 runs over the first four games and have a 6.04 ERA, which is the highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...the defense has committed one error in each of the last three games and is tied for the most errors in the AL (3)... the opponent has scored first in each of the first four games.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Four players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Davis, Joyce, Lowrie, Semien)...that does not include Kendall Graveman, who became just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years (Sonny Gray, 2014-15)...Oakland has used 11 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 13 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...prior to last year, the A's had not opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...10 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Casilla, Coulombe, Davis, Graveman, Hendriks, Joyce, Lowrie, Manaea, Semien, Triggs) and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Chapman, Gossett, Hatcher, Maxwell, Mengden, Olson, Pinder, Powell, Smolinski, Treinen)...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Bucher, Pagán, Piscotty).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015... only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for just the second time in the last 12 years (also 2014)...five players had six or more years of service: Casilla (10 years, 148 days), Lowrie (9 years, 111 days), Joyce (8 years, 123 days), Lucroy (7 years, 136 days) and Petit (7 years, 16 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turned 24 on Thursday, is the youngest player...he is followed by Matt Chapman (24 years, 335 days), Daniel Mengden (25 years, 38 days) and Boog Powell (25 years, 74 days)...there are eight players ages 30 or older...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days)...he is followed by Jed Lowrie (33 years, 347 days), Matt Joyce (33 years, 238 days), Yusmeiro Petit (33 years, 127 days) and Chris Hatcher (33 years, 76 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): tomorrow and Thursday against Texas, Saturday and Sunday at Los Angeles (AL) and April 10 at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have an eight-game home winning streak against Texas, which matches the A's longest Coliseum winning streak against the Rangers (June 17, 2003-April 6, 2004)...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 49-46 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 352-361 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 186-170 in Oakland and 166-191 in Texas... are 99-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 449-443 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is a .310 (40-for-129) career hitter with 18 home runs and 38 RBI in 37 career games against Texas...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...**Yusmeiro Petit** allowed two inherited runners to score yesterday, snapping a streak of 32 consecutive inherited runners stranded...it was the first time he allowed an inherited runner to score since May 8, 2016 at Chicago (NL).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1997** the A's play on April 2 for the first time in Oakland history and open the season with a 9-7 loss against Cleveland...Geronimo Berroa and Ernie Young homer in the loss...in **2002** Carlos Pena hits the game ending home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Texas, 3-2 and start the season 2-0 for the first time since 1993.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-6, 4.27 ERA in 2017)

FOR OPENERS: Begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...started the A's fourth game of the season last year against Los Angeles (AL), and was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win (5.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...lost each of his final four starts of 2017 (20 er in 18.2 ip, 9.64 ERA) and the four-game losing streak is a career-high...allowed at least six runs in each start...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow six runs in four consecutive games, the first since Vin Mazzaro (July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...is the second of those four to take the loss in each start (Bill Krueger, May 26-June 14, 1985)...the last A's pitcher to allow at least six runs in five consecutive games is Gordon Rhodes for the 1936 Philadelphia A's (July 15-30).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts...allowed a .227 (20-for-88) opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...retired 21 consecutive batters over a three-game stretch from March 6-17.

TRIGGS vs. TEXAS: Is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 1 er, 8 so) in three career appearances, including two starts...made one appearance last year, a start in the A's 4-2 win on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...his other start came in a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss at Texas Aug. 16, 2016...had a 1-0 lead when he was relieved by Dull with two outs in the sixth inning and a runner on second...Dull allowed the run to score for the blown save...also pitched in relief on May 18, 2016 in Oakland (1.0 ip, 1 so).

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11) and stolen bases allowed (15).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers...held the opposition to a .211 batting average with two outs but surrendered six of his nine home runs in that situation...allowed a .188 average against the opponents clean-up hitter and has a .175 (10-for-57) average in that situation in his career...opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded...the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors.

SPLITS: Compiled a 2-2 record and a 3.14 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...went 4-1 with a 2.04 ERA in six starts against AL West competition, 1-5 with a 6.90 ERA in six starts against everyone else...was 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 2.56 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more

fewer in 12 of his 18 career starts...eight of his 19 walks came in the first inning.

MORE 2017: Won each of his first three starts and did not allow an earned run for a season-opening 17.2-inning streak without an earned run...the season-opening streak of no earned runs was the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...since the earned run became an official stat in the AL in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918)...received 16 runs of support in those three starts (8.15 RSA) but had just 16 runs of support over his final nine starts (3.02 RSA)...issued a career-high three walks in his first start April 6 against Los Angeles (AL), his first of three starts with three walks (May 10 vs. Los Angeles-AL, May 21 vs. Boston)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to 2016...allowed his only home run over his first seven starts (40.2 ip) in that outing...surrendered at least one home run in each of his final five starts (8 hr in 24.2 ip)...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings April 29 at Houston...finished April with a 4-1 record, a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts...tied for second in the AL in wins in April and ranked seventh in ERA...the wins matched the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time) and the ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015)...then went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in May...tied for fifth in the AL in May losses...tossed a career-high 105 pitches in a 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) May 10...had his only no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...then allowed at least six runs in each of his final four starts beginning May 21...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow six runs in four consecutive games, the first since Vin Mazzaro (July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...is the second of those four to take the loss in each start (Bill Krueger, May 26-June 14, 1985)...compiled a 9.61 ERA and .381 opponents batting average during the four-game losing streak, which is the longest of his career...was charged with five unearned runs May 28 at New York (AL), which match the most unearned runs by an A's pitcher over the last eight seasons (last: Milone on June 30, 2012 vs. Texas)...yielded a career-high nine hits in 3.2 innings each of his final two starts on June 2 against Washington and June 9 at Tampa Bay...had career highs in home runs (3) and runs (8) in the latter contest...was placed on the disabled list June 10 with a strained left hip...underwent surgery on July 13 in Vail, Col when Dr. Marc Philippon repaired the labrum in Triggs' left hip.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (0-0, 9.00 ERA): Made his second consecutive Opening Day start last Thursday to become just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 so)...is 4-2 with a 4.11 ERA (50.1 ip, 52 h, 24 r, 23 er, 9 bb, 28 so, 5 hr) in eight career starts against Texas...went 3-0 with a 2.28 ERA in four starts last year...went 1-2 with a 7.53 ERA and .305 opponents batting average in five starts this spring...went 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts last year in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder...the ERA was a career high as was his opponents batting average (.280), on-base percentage (.338), slugging percentage (.442) and OPS (.780)...allowed 12 home runs and his average of 1.03 home runs per nine innings was a career low...his 19 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland.

- Became the last A's reliever to appear in a game this season yesterday.
- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams...has pitched in 216 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17-18) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
- Is on his 10th Opening Day roster (2008-09, 17-18 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Logged a 10.80 ERA in seven spring training appearances...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but surrendered three home runs.
- Has made 27 career appearances against the Rangers...is 2-2 with a 9.53 ERA in those 27 outings (24 er in 22.2 ip), including four saves in seven opportunities.
- Has a 1.79 ERA (18 er in 90.2 ip) in 89 career appearances in April.

- Compiled a 2.45 ERA and held the opposition to a .130 batting average in eight spring training appearances...did not allow a run in seven of his eight games, including each of his final six (5.1 ip).
- Has made 19 career appearances against Texas, earning a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip)...has 10 strikeouts and five walks in those 19 outings.
- Is in his fifth season in the majors but is on his second Opening Day roster...his first was last year with Oakland.
