OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-5) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (5-2)

FRIDAY, APRIL 6, 2018 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:07 P.M. PDT
RHP DANIEL GOSSETT (0-1, 9.00) VS. RHP PARKER BRIDWELL (FIRST 2018 START)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series with Texas after losing three of four to Los Angeles (AL) to start the season...are 3-5, which marks the first time the A's have been under .500 after eight games since 2011 when they were also 3-5...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their first road trip of the season tonight, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

PITCHING: The A's walked two batters yesterday and have issued two free passes or fewer in seven of the first eight games...have walked 13 batters for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, while tossing 74.0 innings, which is second most in the majors (MIA, 75.0)...are averaging 1.58 walks per nine innings...allowed four runs in the second inning yesterday and have yielded 10 of their 35 runs for the season in the second inning...that is the most in the majors...are tied with Arizona and St. Louis for the Major League lead in wild pitches (7)...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors...have the third highest opponents batting average in the American League (.261).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-5 to start the season and the losses are the most in the majors...Sean Manaea picked up the first win by an A's starting pitcher Wednesday night...starters had been 0-4 to start the season, which marked the second time in Oakland history A's starters lost at least each of their first four decisions (went 0-7 to start the 1979 season)...have allowed just one home run in the last six games after surrendering four in the first two...yielded 10 runs in the four-game series against the Rangers (3.47 ERA) after surrendering 16 runs in the four-game series against the Angels (6.04 ERA).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .290 in the four-game series against Texas after batting .229 in the season-opening four-game series against Los Angeles (AL)...however, hit .143 with runners in scoring position against the Rangers after batting .310 with RISP against the Angels...are batting .258 overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...rank second in the AL in walks (29) and hit by pitches (5) and third in on-base percentage (.338)...are second in most strikeouts (71).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-3 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 3-2 when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 2-0 when scoring first, 1-5 when the opponent scores first...have committed one error in five of the eight games and are tied for second in the American League in errors (5)...the errors have led to three unearned runs, which is tied for the AL lead...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and start an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle tonight...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16...this series with the Angels will conclude a season-opening stretch of 11 games in 11 days...have Monday and Thursday off next week and will play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in

fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...had no rookies on the Opening Day roster...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): tomorrow and Sunday against the Angels and Tuesday against the Dodgers...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's lost three of four in Oakland last week to open the season series...went 7-12 against the Angels last year for the second consecutive season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 32-48 (.400) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 10 of the last 12 games at Angel Stadium and 26 of the last 37...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 429-369 against the Angels...that includes 225-174 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 479-445 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman had two hits in each of the four games against Texas (8-for-16, .500) and has a Major League leading five multiple hit games overall...has a career-high seven-game hitting streak (12-for-26, .462)...**Jonathan Lucroy** has thrown out 5-of-7 (71.4%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, which is the most by any Major League catcher over that span...**Blake Treinen** has converted 13 straight save opportunities dating back to last season...his last blown save came on Aug. 4, 2017 at Los Angeles (AL).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1982** an Opening Day crowd of 48,348 watches the A's defeat the California Angels 3-2 in 11 innings...the A's score the winning run when Davey Lopes walks with the bases loaded to force in Dwayne Murphy with the go-ahead run...in **2015** Sonny Gray tosses eight shutout innings of one-hit ball and combines with Evan Scribner on a one-hit, 8-0 shutout of the Texas Rangers to snap the A's Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (0-1, 9.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 20th of his career...took the loss in his first start after going 4-11 in 18 starts last year...his 12 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first 19 games of his career (Mike Morgan went 2-13 in 16 career games with Oakland).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the second time in his career...the other time was in his final start of 2017 (Sept. 30 at Texas)...allowed back-to-back RBI doubles to Valbuena and Marte in the second inning but Matt Chapman hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the inning to give the A's a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Petit with no outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Petit allowed both inherited runners to score to give Gossett the loss.

GOSSETT vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career starts...including a loss in one start this year (see last start above)...also took the loss in his only start last year, a 3-1 decision at Anaheim on Aug. 28...allowed a run in the first inning on a Calhoun RBI single, but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...then yielded a RBI double to Cowart in the fourth inning to give the Angels the lead for good...also allowed an unearned run in the seventh when Maldonado scored on a Joyce error following a Revere RBI double.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a save and a 4.73 ERA in five games, including one start...allowed a .235 (12-for-51) opponents batting average...each of his first four appearances came in relief before starting in his final outing...allowed two runs in 0.2 innings in his first outing and four runs in 3.2 innings in his final outing but had a 1.00 ERA in three games in between.

2017 RECAP: Went 4-11 with a 6.11 ERA in 18 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...his .267 winning percentage was third lowest in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since Steve Karsay went 3-12 (.200) in 1997...had 91.1 innings pitched and did not qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 90 innings pitched, he had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.549), the fourth highest batting average (.306) and OPS (.906) and the fifth highest ERA...using the 90 inning minimum, his slugging percentage, OPS and average of 2.07 home runs per nine innings were second highest in Oakland history to Gil Heredia in 2001 (.554, .911, 2.22)...his ERA was sixth highest and the highest since Omar Olivares had a 6.75 ERA in 2000...ranked fifth among AL rookies in games started (18), sixth in innings pitched (91.1) and eighth in strikeouts (72)...tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in wild pitches (10).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .296 (63-for-213) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .319 (53-for-166) against left-handers...surrendered 15 of his 21 home runs to righties...yielded a .315 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .225 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .360 after that...opponents hit .359 with a .410 on-base percentage and .543 slugging per-

centage when leading off an inning...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .200 batting average but the nine hitter batted .419.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.50 ERA in the first inning, a 5.19 ERA in innings two and three and a 9.08 ERA from the fourth inning on...his opponents batting average over those splits were .209, .259 and .379...made 12 of his 18 starts on the road and 10 during the day...received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and was 0-10 in those starts...went 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...was 1-7 in eight starts against AL West competition, 3-4 against all other teams.

MORE 2017: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...had a sacrifice hit in his first professional plate appearance but then had an infield single off Edinson Volquez in the fourth inning for his first ML hit...joins Tim Hudson (June 8, 1999 at San Diego) as the only pitchers in Oakland history with a hit in their ML debut...earned his first ML win in his third start, allowing two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 win at Chicago (AL) June 24...yielded a career-high nine hits in a 7-6 win over the White Sox July 4 but had a no decision...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games through July 4 (3 bb in 26.0 ip, 1.04 walks per nine innings)...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...then walked two batters or more in nine of his final 13 starts (28 bb in 65.1 ip, 3.86 per nine innings)...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...allowed a run on three hits in a career-high 7.0 innings at San Francisco Aug. 2 and picked up the win...however was optioned to Nashville the next day with a 3-6 record, a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in 10 starts...was recalled Aug. 23 and went 1-5 with a 7.47 ERA and .342 opponents batting average in eight starts following his return...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 28...finished August 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts...then went 1-4 with an 8.42 ERA and .336 opponents batting average in six starts in September...based on a minimum of 25 innings pitched, his ERA was the highest in the majors in the month and the highest by an A's pitcher in September since Hod Lisenbee had a 9.10 ERA in 1936...tied for the ML lead with nine home runs in September...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3...struck out a career-high seven in an 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader Sept. 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Detroit Sept. 19...yielded a career-high four home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-1 loss to Seattle Sept. 25...allowed four runs in a career-low 1.2 innings and took the loss in his final start Sept. 30 at Texas.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Compiled a 4-4 record with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against left-handers...opponents hit .161 with runners in scoring position and two outs...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...tossed six innings or fewer 12 times...walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...took the loss in his only start in June on the 5th at Omaha and was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts when he was promoted to Oakland June 14...ranked sixth in the PCL in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time...returned to Nashville following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland and went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (0-0, 1.80 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...had a no decision in his first start, a 3-1 A's win over Texas last Monday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17.0 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 8 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Los Angeles...went 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA in two starts last year...went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts this spring...allowed a .227 opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...was on the A's Opening Day roster last year and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts.
