OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-6) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (6-2)

SATURDAY, APRIL 7, 2018 — ANGEL STADIUM — 6:07 P.M. PDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (0-0, 1.80) VS. RHP JC RAMIREZ (0-1, 7.71) NBCSCA PLUS — A'S RADIO NETWORK (Q102 102.1 FM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost last night after splitting a four-game series with Texas... lostthree of four to Los Angeles (AL) to start the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world titles (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

MULTI-HIT MADNESS: Matt Chapman has recorded 5 straight multi-hit games...the last time an A's player had 5+ consecutive multi-hit efforts was Ryon Healy (Sept. 12-16, 2016)...the last A's player with 6 straight was Danny Valencia (Aug. 14-20, 2016)...Chapman leads the Majors with 6 multi-hit games this season.

MATCHUPS TO WATCH: Khris Davis is 4-for-6 with 1 home run and 1 walk against Angels starter JC Ramirez...Marcus Semien is 2-for-3 with a home run and a walk against the right-hander.

BULLPEN WORKLOAD: The A's bullpen has tossed 33.0 innings this season, 4th-most in the American League and 7th-most in the Majors...in the AL, rank behind just the Angels (37.2), Texas (36.1) and Baltimore (34.0)... amongst AL relievers, Emilio Pagán's 6.0 innings are T4th-most and Yusmeiro Petit (5.1) is T9th in the AL.

HEATING UP: Over the last three games, the A's are hitting a combined .330 (34-for-103) with 18 runs, 6 doubles, 5 home runs, 16 RBI, a .376 on-base percentage and a .534 slugging mark, averaging 6.0 runs per game...in the first 6 games of the season, the club hit .239 (49-for-205), averaging 3.0 runs per game...are batting .269 overall, which ranks third in the American League and fifth in the Majors...rank tied for third in the AL in walks (30) and third in on-base percentage (.340)....are third in most strikeouts (76).

ROAD WARRIOR: Jed Lowrie has reached base safely via hit or walk in his last 23 road games (since Aug. 19, 2017)...in his last 31 road games (since July 26), he's hitting .301 (34-for-113) with 19 runs, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 21 RBI, a .407 on-base percentage and a .531 slugging mark...in his first 46 road games of 2017, he hit .253 (43-for-170) with a .326 on-base percentage and a .388 slugging mark.

HIGH FIVE: Athletics had 5 different players hit a home run last night vs. the Angels...it is the first time since May 26, 2014 vs. Detroit that the A's have had 5 players homer in the same game...last time 6+ players homered in a single game for the A's was Aug. 21, 1997 vs. Boston at Oakland Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue their first road trip of the season tonight, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

PITCHING: The A's walked five batters yesterday and have issued two free passes or fewer in seven of the first nine games...have walked 18 batters for the season, which is T3rd-fewest in the majors, while tossing 82.0 innings, which is the most in the Majors (TEX, 79.0)...are averaging 1.98 walks per nine innings...have yielded 11 of their 48 runs for the season in the second inning...lead the Majors in wild pitches (7) ahead of Arizona, Pittsburgh and St. Louis (6)...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors...have the second highest opponents batting average in the American League (.274).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-5 to start the season and the losses are tied for the most in the Majors...Sean Manaea picked up the first win by an A's starting pitcher Wednesday night...starters had been 0-4 to start the season, which marked the second time in Oakland history A's starters lost at least each of their first four decisions (went 0-7 to start the 1979 season)...have allowed just three home runs in the last seven games after surrendering four in the first two...yielded 10 runs in the four-game series against the Rangers (3.47 ERA) after surrendering 16 runs in the four-game series against the Angels (6.04 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-3 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 3-3 when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 2-1 when scoring first, 1-5 when the opponent scores first...have committed one error in six of the nine games and are tied for third in the AL in errors (6)...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and continue an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle tonight...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16...this series with the Angels will conclude a season-opening stretch of 11 games in 11 days... have Monday and Thursday off next week and will play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...had no rookies on the Opening Day roster...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): <u>TONIGHT</u> and Sunday against the Angels and Tuesday against the Dodgers...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season... Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost 4 of the 5 meetings this season vs. the Angels...went 7-12 against the Angels last year for the second consecutive season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 32-49 (.395) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 11 of the last 13 games at Angel Stadium and 27 of the last 38...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 429-370 against the Angels...that includes 225-174 in Oakland and 205-195 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 479-446 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman had two hits in each of the last five games (10-for-20, .500) and has a Major League leading six multiple hit games overall...has a career-high eight-game hitting streak (14-for-30, .467)...Jonathan Lucroy has thrown out 5-of-8 (62.5%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, which is the most by any Major League catcher over that span.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1996** Ernie Young starts the sixth triple play in Oakland history with a spectacular catch against Detroit in Las Vegas...after slamming into the wall to catch a Bobby Higginson fly ball, his return throw doubled up Alan Trammell and Chad Curtis.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-0, 1.80 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...had a no decision in his first start after losing each of his final four starts of 2017...is now 0-4 with a 7.99 ERA (21 er in 23.2 ip) and .346 (36-for-104) opponents batting average over his last five starts dating back to May 21, 2017...the four-game losing streak is a career high...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas last Monday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning... Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

Anaheim...went 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA (1 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts last year... the first win came in a 5-1 win decision in Oakland on April 6...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win...won again in Oakland on May 10, a 3-1 victory...walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks...tossed a career-high 105 pitches...those were his only three walks of the game...the first walk (Escobar) scored on a Marte fielders choice and Triggs blanked the Angels on three hits over his final five innings.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts... despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11) and stolen bases allowed (15).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers...held the opposition to a .211 batting average with two outs but surrendered six of his nine home runs in that situation...allowed a .188 average against the opponents clean-up hitter and has a .167 (10-for-60) average in that situation in his career...opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded...the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors.

SPLITS: Compiled a 2-2 record and a 3.14 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...went 4-1 with a 2.04 ERA in six starts against AL West competition, 1-5 with a 6.90 ERA in six starts against everyone else...was 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 2.56 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more

THIS AND THAT: Allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 12 starts... walked one batter or fewer six times and has now issued one free pass or fewer in 12 of his 19 career starts...eight of his 19 walks came in the first inning

MORE 2017: Won each of his first three starts and did not allow an earned run for a season-opening 17.2-inning streak without an earned run...the season-opening streak of no earned runs was the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...since the earned run be came an official stat in the AL in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs... joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918)...received 16 runs of support in those three starts (8.15 RSA) but had just 16 runs of support over his final nine starts (3.02 RSA)...issued a career-high three walks in his first start April 6 against Los Angeles (AL), his first of three starts with three walks (May 10 vs. Los Angeles-AL, May 21 vs. Boston)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to 2016... allowed his only home run over his first seven starts (40.2 ip) in that outing... surrendered at least one home run in each of his final five starts (8 hr in 24.2 ip)...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings April 29 at Houston...finished April with a 4-1 record, a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts...tied for second in the AL in wins in April and ranked seventh in ERA...the wins matched the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time) and the ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015)...then went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in May...tied for fifth in the AL in May losses...tossed a careerhigh 105 pitches in a 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) May 10...had his only no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...then allowed at least six runs in each of his final four starts beginning May 21... is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow six runs in four consecutive games, the first since Vin Mazzaro (July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...is the second of those four to take the loss in each start (Bill Krueger, May 26-June 14, 1985)... compiled a 9.61 ERA and .381 opponents batting average during the fourgame losing streak, which is the longest of his career...was charged with five unearned runs May 28 at New York (AL), which match the most unearned runs by an A's pitcher over the last eight seasons (last: Milone on June 30, 2012 vs. Texas)...yielded a career-high nine hits in 3.2 innings each of his final two starts on June 2 against Washington and June 9 at Tampa Bay...had career highs in home runs (3) and runs (8) in the latter contest...was placed on the disabled list June 10 with a strained left hip...underwent surgery on July 13 in Vail, Col when Dr. Marc Philippon repaired the labrum in Triggs' left hip.

RHP Kendall Graveman (0-1, 8.10 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has surrendered four home runs over his first two starts, which is tied for the most in the American League...has allowed at least four runs in each start and his 8.10 ERA is 3rd highest in the AL...has struck out just one batter in each start...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 2-2 with a 4.33 ERA in 12 career starts against Los Angeles...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-5 A's win on Opening Day (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 so)...went 1-2 with a 7.53 ERA and .305 opponents batting average in five starts this spring...was 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts last year in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder...the ERA was a career high as was his opponents batting average (.280), on-base percentage (.338), slugging percentage (.442) and OPS (.780).

2-1, 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 1-for-2 (50.0%)

- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)... had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.
- Have allowed runs in three straight games after going two games without allowing a run.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss on Friday night...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since 6/4/2017 vs Washington.

- Has faced the Angels three times in his career...has not allowed a run in those three appearances (3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Has a 1.67 ERA (5 er in 27.0 ip) in 26 career appearances in April.
- Compiled a 9.82 ERA and .378 opponents batting average in eight relief appearances this spring...walked six batters in 7.1 innings...did not allow an earned run in six of his eight outings.

- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams... has pitched in 216 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17-18) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
- Is on his 10th Opening Day roster (2008-09, 17-18 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Logged a 10.80 ERA in seven spring training appearances...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but surrendered three home runs.
- Has made 31 career appearances against the Angels...is 2-0 with a 2.56 ERA in those 31 outings (9 er in 31.2 ip), including four saves in six opportunities.
- Has a 1.87 ERA (18 er in 91.2 ip) in 91 career appearances in April
