## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-7) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (3-6)

TUESDAY, APRIL 10, 2018 — DODGER STADIUM — 7:10 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Lost two of three to Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend and have now lost two series and split one to start the season...this marks the first time the A's have not won one of their first three series of the season since 2007 when they started 0-2-1 before winning series number four...are 4-7, which matches the A's worst record after 11 games over the last 17 years (also 2012 and 2015)...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world titles (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's begin interleague play with this two-game series against the Dodgers...these games will be the A's 12th and 13th of the season, which marks the earliest interleague start in Oakland history...the previous earliest was in 2014 when they played a three-game series against Washington from May 9-11 (games 36-38)...after this series, the A's next interleague series is May 25-27 against Arizona...will also host San Diego (July 3-4), San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8) and play at San Diego (June 19-20), San Francisco (July 13-15) and Colorado (July 27-29)...the A's went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which tied for the fifth worst record in the majors...it matched the 2016 club for the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...are 205-179 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is sixth best in Major League history.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers went 2-for-17 (.118) with two runs, two walks, 10 strikeouts and four sacrifice hits last year...they are batting .080 (31-for-387) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 12 walks and 185 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .086)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-2 on the first road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each game against the Dodgers plus the second game at Seattle...are 0-3 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-4 in games in which the opponent starts a right-hander...Oakland is one of two American League teams that has not defeated a lefty...the other is Detroit, which has yet to face a lefty.

**PITCHING:** The A's logged a 6.12 ERA (17 er in 25.0 ip) in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) after posting a 3.89 ERA in eight games on the first homestand...walked 11 batters in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) after walking 13 batters in eight games on the first homestand...have issued just 24 walks in 99.0 innings and Oakland's average of 2.18 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the majors...however, have a .265 opponents batting average, which is second highest in the majors (TEX, .271)...lead the majors with 10 wild pitches...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have two outings longer than 5.2 innings this season, both by Sean Manaea...Manaea is 1-1 with a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) while the rest of the rotation is 1-5 with a 7.23 ERA (34 er in 42.1 ip)...starters are 2-6 with a 5.59 ERA overall...have the second most losses in the American League (TEX, 7) and the third highest ERA.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .253 over the first 11 games, which is the third highest batting average in the American League...are tied for second in walks

(42) and rank third in hit by pitches (6)...have a .336 on-base percentage, which is second best to the White Sox (.340)...have stolen just three bases, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...are 6-for-38 (.158) with runners in scoring position over the last six games.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just two errors over the last six games after making four over the first five contests...the six errors have led to eight unearned runs, which is tied with Milwaukee for the most in the majors...the errors are fifth most in the American League...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83)

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The A's had their first day off of the season yesterday and will have their second on Thursday...after playing 11 games in 11 days to start the season, Oakland is scheduled to play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19)...are scheduled to play each of their first 22 games on the west coast (all but three in California)...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and are currently on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle today...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's added Chad Pinder and Boog Powell to the disabled list on Saturday and Sunday respectively after beginning the season with five players on the DL for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...now have seven players on the DL...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL and Dull and Núñez are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A'S ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): today against the Dodgers...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

**A's vs. DODGERS:** The A's won three of four from the Dodgers the last time the two clubs met in 2015...split two games at Los Angeles (July 28-29) and swept a two-game series in Oakland (Aug. 18-19)...have won 17 of their last 22 games against Los Angeles...are 4-4 over the last eight games at Dodger Stadium but have an eight-game winning streak in the Coliseum...have won six of the nine season series and lead the all-time series 19-10 (.655)...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (CWS, 14-11; .560)...are 14-2 in Oakland and 5-8 in Los Angeles.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is tied for the Major League lead with six multiple hit games...**Jed Lowrie** has hit safely in each of his last five games and is 10-for-19 (.526) with four walks (.609 on-base percentage), two doubles, two home runs, five RBI and three multiple hit games over that stretch...**Jonathan Lucroy** has thrown out 5-of-9 (55.6%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are tied for the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span...**Marcus Semien** has a seven-game hitting streak (7-for-30, .233) and is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all 11 games.

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1968 the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore...John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in 1975 Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in 1990 Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-1, 1.17 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has allowed one run in each of his first two starts and is the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster and is beginning his third season in the majors.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Went 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (21.0 ip, 31 h, 15 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in four interleague starts last year...is now 2-3 with a 3.63 ERA (16 er in 39.2 ip) in seven career starts against the National League.

**WITH THE BAT:** Went 0-for-3 with a walk and two strikeouts last year...the walk on July 22 at New York (NL) was the first by an A's pitcher since Dan Straily on July 9, 2013 at Pittsburgh...is now 0-for-5 with a walk, three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...never batted as a minor leaguer.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter of the game, Mike Trout, but that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings...retired 12 straight at one point and set down 21 of the final 23 hitters...left trailing 1-0 as the A's scored their only run in the bottom of the ninth.

**LAST START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-2 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Mazara led off with a single, went to second on a Chirinos walk, third on a Profar sacrifice fly and scored on a Rua fielders choice...did not allow a run over his final three innings and retired each of the final 12 batters he faced.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA in three games this spring, all starts...also pitched in a minor league game on March 23...allowed a .237 (9-for-38) opponents batting average...issued five walks in 10.2 innings...yielded two runs or fewer in each start.

**2017 RECAP:** Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...this marked just the third time in Oakland history (Wengert, 161.1 ip in 1996 and 134.0 ip in 1997) and fourth time in Athletics history (Garver, 145 ip in 1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the fifth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (Karsay, 24 in 1997; Wengert, 25 in 1996; Young, 27 in 1986; Langford, 29 in 1979)...struck out 264 batters over his first two seasons, which are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors (Hudson, 301; Zito, 283)...his 19 wins tied for sixth most.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 18 home runs and issued 49 of his 55 walks to righties...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties...now has a .206 (50-for-243) career batting average and .559 OPS against lefties compared to .265 (259-for-976) with a .766 OPS against righties...12 of the 18 home runs he allowed were solo shots...allowed a .160 batting average with two strikes...held the three hitter in the batting order to a .216 batting average but the two hitter batted .377...now has a .213 (30-for-141) career average against the three hitter.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Went 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA in 13 starts in Oakland and allowed just five home runs in 68.2 innings (0.66 per nine innings)...was 6-7 with a 4.50 ERA in 16 starts on the road and yielded 13 home runs in 90.0 innings (1.30 per nine innings)...is now 12-7 with a 3.33 ERA (62 er in 167.2 ip) in 29 career games at home, 8-13 with a 4.70 ERA (79 er in 151.1 ip) in 27 starts on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Was 6-1 with a 3.57 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 6-9 with a 4.89 ERA and .292 opponents average in 18 starts at night...tied for sixth in the American League in day wins...is now 8-3 with a 3.53 ERA (41 er in 104.2 ip) in 18 career day games, 12-17 with a 4.20 ERA (100 er in 214.0 ip) in 38 starts at night.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Was 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the All-Star Break, 5-5 with a 5.23 ERA and .317 opponents average in 13 starts after the break...allowed eight home runs in 93.1 innings before the break, 10 in 65.1 innings after the break

**INNING BY INNING:** Yielded 43 of his 88 runs over the first two innings of his starts...had a 5.91 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 3.08 ERA over innings three through five and a 7.13 ERA in the sixth inning...did not allow a run after the sixth inning (8.2 ip)

**THIS AND THAT:** Went 5-7 against AL West competition, 7-3 against all other teams...tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (4), tied for fifth in triples (5) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (11) and hit batters (10)...received no runs of support in four of his 10 losses.

**MORE 2017:** Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings in his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codioli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 decision...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville and was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an AL pitcher...had a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1 to 18 (11.37 ERA, .415 opponents batting)...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...tied for fifth in the AL in losses in August...then went 3-2 with a 3.54 ERA in five starts in September and is 4-2 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) in eight career starts in the month...tossed a career-high 116 pitches for his 10th win of the season Sept. 6 against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 11 hits in 3.2 innings in an 11-1 loss at Boston Sept. 12...was scratched from his scheduled start Sept. 23 against the Rangers with a left upper back strain...returned to make his final start Sept. 28 at Texas and allowed one unearned run in 6.2 innings for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Daniel Mengden (0-2, 6.55 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the 24th of his career...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts, including his last start last Thursday against Texas in Oakland, a 6-3 A's loss (5.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...went 3-0 over his final three road starts of 2017 and did not allow a run in 23.0 innings...the 23.0-inning road scoreless streak is two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson and matched by Dennis Eckersley...is 2-3 with a 3.52 ERA in six career interleague starts compared to 3-10 with a 6.16 ERA in 17 starts against the American League...has never faced the Dodgers in his career...went 0-0 with a 6.12 ERA in seven games, including five starts, during the spring...ranked fourth among Cactus League pitchers with 25.0 innings pitched...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland last year.

- Has allowed runs in four straight games after going two games without allowing a run...has 2.85 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss on Friday night...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since June 4, 2017 vs Washington.
- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)... had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

- Allowed his first runs of the season, both unearned on Friday night...with a homer to Luis Valbuena on Saturday night, he allowed his first earned run since Sept. 11, 2017 vs Chicago-AL.
- Had his 19 road game scoreless streak snapped with a homer to Valbuena on Saturday...it was the first run he has allowed on the road since July 20th of last season (16.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 6 bb, 10 so).
- Has faced the Dodgers 15 times in his career, going 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 er, 14.1 ip) with 23 strikeouts...unscored upon in 12 of those 15 games.
- Has a 1.95 ERA (6 er in 27.2 ip) in 28 career appearances in April.
- Compiled a 9.82 ERA and .378 opponents batting average in eight relief appearances this spring...walked six batters in 7.1 innings.
- Was acquired from Kansas City with Brandon Moss and cash for Jesse Hahn and Heath Fillmyer, Jan. 29, 2018.
