OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-8) VS. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (4-6)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 11, 2018 — DODGER STADIUM — 7:10 P.M. PDT
RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (0-2, 6.55) VS. LHP ALEX WOOD (0-1, 1.93)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and are now 4-8 for the season...that is the A's worst record after 12 games since the 2001 club started the season 2-10 before going 100-50 over its final 150 games...with a loss last night, the A's extended their season-opening stretch of consecutive series without a win to four...have lost two series and split one...this marks the first time the A's have not won one of their first four series of the season since 2001 when they started 0-4-0 before winning series number five.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's began interleague play with a 4-0 loss to the Dodgers last night...this marks the earliest interleague start in Oakland history...the previous earliest was in 2014 when they played a three-game series against Washington from May 9-11 (games 36-38)...after this two-game set with Los Angeles, the A's next interleague series is May 25-27 against Arizona...will also host San Diego (July 3-4), San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8) and play at San Diego (June 19-20), San Francisco (July 13-15) and Colorado (July 27-29)...the A's went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which tied for the fifth worst record in the majors...it matched the 2016 club for the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...are 205-180 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: Sean Manaea grounded out in the lone at bat by an A's pitcher last night...Oakland pitchers went 2-for-17 (.118) with two runs, two walks, 10 strikeouts and four sacrifice hits last year...they are batting .080 (31-for-388) with four doubles, 11 RBI, 12 walks and 185 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .086)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 0-4 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-4 against right-handers...Oakland is one of three teams that has not defeated a lefty (Detroit, 0-0; Cincinnati, 0-2)...are scheduled to face a left-handed starter in two of the next three games...are batting .222 against left-handed pitchers, which is fifth lowest in the American League compared to .253 against right-handed pitchers, which is third highest.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: The A's have scored just one run in the first inning, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest first inning batting average (6-for-41, .146) to San Diego (.125)...have scored a Major League leading 12 runs in the second inning and are hitting .346 (18-for-52), which is second best to Texas (.353).

THE STARTING INFIELD: Matt Olson (1B), Jed Lowrie (2B), Marcus Semien (SS) and Matt Chapman (3B) have started each of the A's first 12 games at their respective positions...the only time in Oakland history the A's used the same starting infield in more than each of the first 12 games was in 1976 when Don Baylor (1B), Phil Garner (2B), Sal Bando (3B) and Bert Campaneris (SS) started each of the first 39 games.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the first time last night and are 8-for-61 (.131) with one run scored over the last two games...hit .265 and averaged 4.3 runs per game over the first 10 contests...are hitting .245 overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...are tied for third in walks (44) and rank fourth in strikeouts (107)...have stolen just three bases, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...are 6-for-41 (.146) with runners in scoring position over the last seven games.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.73 ERA (21 er in 33.0 ip) over the first four games of the road trip after posting a 3.89 ERA in eight games on the first homestand...walked two batters last night and have issued just 26 free passes in 107.0 innings overall...Oakland's average of 2.19 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the majors...however, have a .271 opponents batting average, which is second highest in the majors to Texas (.287)...surrendered three home runs last night and now have a streak of four consecutive games with two or more home runs allowed (nine home runs total)...that matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 18 years...the last longer streak is a five-game streak from May 30-June 4, 2000...have surrendered 16 round-trippers for the season, which is tied with Baltimore and Toronto for

the most in the majors...lead the majors with 11 wild pitches...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have two outings longer than 5.2 innings this season, both by Sean Manaea...Manaea is 1-2 with a 1.74 ERA (4 er in 20.2 ip) while the rest of the rotation is 1-5 with a 7.23 ERA (34 er in 42.1 ip)...starters are 2-7 with a 5.43 ERA (38 er in 63.0 ip) overall...have the second most losses in the American League (Texas, 8) and the third highest ERA.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone three consecutive games without an error and have committed just two errors over the last seven games...have six errors overall, which is tied for sixth most in the American League, but they have led to eight unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83)

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on the first road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (0-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's had their first day off of the season on Monday and will have their second tomorrow...after playing 11 games in 11 days to start the season, Oakland is scheduled to play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19)...are scheduled to play each of their first 22 games on the west coast (all but three in California)...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and are currently on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle today...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Chad Pinder and Boog Powell to the disabled list on Saturday and Sunday respectively after beginning the season with five players on the DL for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...now have seven players on the DL...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL and Dull, Núñez and Phegley are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. DODGERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2018 last night...won three of four from the Dodgers the last time the two clubs met in 2015...split two games at Los Angeles (July 28-29) and swept a two-game series in Oakland (Aug. 18-19)...have won 17 of their last 23 games against Los Angeles...are 4-5 over the last nine games at Dodger Stadium but have an eight-game winning streak in the Coliseum...have won six of the nine season series and lead the all-time series 19-11 (.633)...that is the best record by any team against the Dodgers (CWS, 14-11; .560)...are 14-2 in Oakland and 5-9 in Los Angeles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for the American League lead with six multiple hit games...**Jonathan Lucroy** has thrown out 5-of-9 (55.6%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are tied for the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span...**Marcus Semien** has an eight-game hitting streak (8-for-34, .235) and is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all 12 games.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1993** Rickey Henderson's eighth inning home run was the 200th of his career...in **1994** Henderson collects his 231st double in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 289 doubles...in **2012** Jonny Gomes is hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning to force in the winning run in a 5-4 win over Kansas City...it is the first of 14 "walk-off" wins for the A's in 2012.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-2, 6.55 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the 24th of his career...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts...is in his third season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his first road start of the season...went 3-0 over his final three road starts of 2017 and did not allow a run in 23.0 innings...the 23.0-inning road scoreless streak is two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991)...went 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip) in his first two starts this year, both at home...is now 0-10 with a 6.45 ERA (48 er in 67.0 ip) in 13 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 5-3 with a 4.12 ERA (27 er in 59.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road...his 10-game career-opening home losing streak is one short of the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1908...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history...the record is 14, held by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in three starts at home last year, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA in four starts on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA in two interleague starts last year...has made six of his 23 career starts against the National League...is 2-3 with a 3.52 ERA (15 er in 38.1 ip) in six career interleague starts compared to 3-10 with a 6.16 ERA in 17 starts against the American League.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1-for-2 with a walk and a run scored in his lone interleague at bats last year on Sept. 15 at Philadelphia...is now 1-for-8 (.125) with a run, walk, three strikeouts and a sacrifice hits in 10 career plate appearances...never batted in the minors.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on March 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Trout in the first and two more runs, one earned, in the third...also yielded a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0...Hendriks allowed both inherited runners to score.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, all in the second inning...yielded a RBI single to Odor and then his own throwing error on a Rua sacrifice allowed two more runs to score...Robinson added a RBI single to give the Rangers a 4-0 lead.

2017 RECAP: Combined to make just 18 starts between the majors and minors due to two stints on the disabled list...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland...was also 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Triple-A Nashville and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season

concluded...his ERA during his second stint was fifth lowest in the American League over that span.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .187 (14-for-75) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .268 (22-for-82) against left-handers...issued seven of his nine walks to righties...allowed a .176 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that...his career splits are .220 (42-for-191) the first time through the lineup, .293 (89-for-304) after that.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 0.64 ERA in innings one and two, a 4.34 ERA from the third inning on...his career numbers are 2.54 (13 er in 46.0 ip) in innings one and two, 6.98 (62 er in 80.0 ip) from the third inning on...tied for fifth in the AL in complete games (1)...made five of his seven starts during the day...has made 13 of his 23 career starts in day games...the A's went 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments after going 3-11 (.214) in 2016.

MORE 2017: Began the season on Oakland's 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was recalled for the first time May 29 and allowed three home runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day at Cleveland...it is the only time in his career he allowed more than one home run in a start...allowed four runs in 4.2 innings in his next start June 3 against Washington and was 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA in two starts when he was optioned back to Nashville June 3...returned to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded and went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA in five starts...including 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA in September...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in September...tossed his first career complete game and the A's only complete game of the season a two-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Philadelphia Sept. 15...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a career-high 118 pitches...tossed seven scoreless innings in his next start Sept. 20 at Detroit for the first winning streak of his career...it was his first career victory in 10 starts during the day...did not walk a batter and joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...did not allow a run in the first three innings of his next start Sept. 26 against Seattle for a career-high and A's season-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed seven scoreless innings to defeat the Rangers in the final game of the season Oct. 1 at Texas.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Andrew Triggs (1-0, 2.53 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...had a no decision in his first start and then picked up the win in his last start, a 7-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...had lost each of his final four starts of 2017 before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...his win against Los Angeles (AL) was his first since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels...is 0-1 with an 8.53 ERA (12.2 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 4 hr) in three career appearances, two starts, against Seattle...went 0-1 with a 5.91 ERA in two starts last year...went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts, during the spring...allowed a .227 opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was on the A's Opening Day roster in 2017 and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13.

- Has allowed runs in six straight games after going two games without allowing a run...has 3.07 ERA overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss on Friday night...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since June 4, 2017 vs Washington.
- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)... had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

- Had his 19 road game scoreless streak snapped with a homer to Valbuena on Saturday...it was the first run he has allowed on the road since July 20th of last season (16.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 6 bb, 10 so).
- Has faced the Dodgers 15 times in his career, going 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 er, 14.1 ip) with 23 strikeouts...unscored upon in 12 of those 15 games.
- Has a 1.95 ERA (6 er in 27.2 ip) in 28 career appearances in April.
- Compiled a 9.82 ERA and .378 opponents batting average in eight relief appearances this spring...walked six batters in 7.1 innings.
