OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-10) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (4-8)

MONDAY, APRIL 16, 2018 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-2, 6.19) VS. RHP REYNALDO LOPEZ (0-1, 0.69) NBCSCA PLUS — A'S RADIO NETWORK (Q102 102.1 FM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost four of the last six games and six of the last nine...are 6-10, which is their worst record after 16 games since 2009 when they were also 6-10...with a loss tonight, the A's would have their worst record after 17 games since 2001 (5-12)...won on Sunday to avoid being swept in Seattle but have yet to win a series this year...have lost three series and split two and the season-opening streak of five consecutive series without a win matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history (0-2-3 in 1973)...the longest was in 1998 when Oakland went 0-3-3 before winning the seventh series of the season...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by seven games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 7½ on April 14...spent the first day of the season tied for first, the second day tied for second and every day since then in fourth (nine days) or tied for fourth (seven days).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit 17 home runs in eight games on the last road trip after hitting five home runs in eight games on the first homestand...have 22 home runs for the season, which is second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 26) and fourth most in the majors (Colorado and St. Louis, 24)... the pitching staff allowed 18 home runs on the trip after surrendering seven on the first homestand...yielded one home run yesterday, ending the A's Oakland-record tying streak of seven consecutive games with two or more home runs (also April 29-May 5, 1997)...now have a streak of 11 consecutive games with at least one home run (21 home runs total), which matches the A's longest such streak over the last three years...have allowed 25 home runs for the season, which is second most in the majors to Cincinnati (26).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...also went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for fifth best home record in American League but tied for the second worst road record.

OFFENSE: The A's averaged 5.88 runs per game on the last road trip after averaging 3.38 runs per game on the first homestand...rank fourth in the American League in runs scored (74)...are also third in batting (.261), on-base percentage (.333) and slugging percentage (.429)...A's hitters have combined for 39 multi-hit games, which is third most in the Majors behind Los Angeles-AL (54) and Boston (45)...the A's were hit by a pitch three times yesterday and rank second in the AL with 10 hit by pitches for the season...are tied with the White Sox for the AL lead in grounded into double plays (13) and rank fourth in most strikeouts (144)...are tied with the Dodgers and the Mets for the fewest stolen bases in the majors (3).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 5.78 ERA on the last road trip after logging a 3.89 ERA on the first homestand...have a 4.79 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League...are averaging a Major League low 2.17 walks per nine innings but have a Major League high .277 opponents batting average...lead the majors with 14 wild pitches...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have three outings longer than 5.2 innings this season, all by Sean Manaea...Manaea and Andrew Triggs are a combined 3-2 with a 2.08 ERA (10 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts while the rest of Oakland's starters are 1-6 with an 8.63 ERA (39 er in 40.2 ip) in nine starts...are 4-8 with a 5.25 ERA (49 er in 84.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League and have the fourth highest ERA.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...however, those errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is tied with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Texas for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 16)...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-5 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 5-5 against right-handers...the .167 winning percentage against left-handed starters is second worst in the American League to Detroit (0-1, .000)...the six games against left-handed starters are tied with Baltimore for the most in the AL...the A's are 5-2 when scoring first, 1-8 when opponent scores first...are one of two AL teams that does not have

a last at bat loss (Seattle)...are 3-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 3-8 in games decided by three runs or more.

SCHEDULE NOTES: This homestand concludes a season-opening stretch where the A's are scheduled to play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...the three-game series in Seattle over the weekend were the A's only games outside of California...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and followed that with an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle...begin a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston tonight.

50th ANNIVERSARY GAME: Tomorrow marks the 50th anniversary of the Oakland A's first home game...on April 17, 1968, the A's lost to the Baltimore Orioles 4-1 in front of a crowd of 50,164...Lew Krausse, who started for Oakland that night, will toss out the ceremonial first pitch tomorrow night... to commemorate the A's half-century in Oakland, admission for tomorrow night is free...both teams will wear throwback 1968 jerseys for the game... parking, which is also free, opens at noon...the season ticket members gate opens at 3:30 pm and all other stadium gates open at 4:30 pm...seating is general admission, although seats in sections 106 through 128 will be reserved for season ticket members until the game begins.

A's ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): tonight against the White Sox... additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Phegley, Powell) and have used the DL eight times this year...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL and Phegley is currently on a rehab assignment...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's went 5-1 against Chicago last year to win the season series for the first time since 2013...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in Chicago...are 20-20 against the White Sox over the previous six years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 307-287 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 161-138 in Oakland and 146-149 in Chicago...including 64-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 984-1042 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has played 100 career games and his 19 home runs are fourth most in Oakland history by a player over the first 100 games of his career (McGwire 37, Olson 26 in 86 games, Canseco 23)...Jed Lowrie Is batting .439 (18-for-41) with four home runs and 12 RBI over his last 10 games after hitting .200 with two RBI over his first six contests...leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with 23 hits...Jonathan Lucroy has thrown out 6-of-12 (50.0%) attempted base stealers and the six caught stealings are the most in Majors...has tossed out 183 since 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span...Marcus Semien is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all 16 games...Jake Smolinksi has a 43-game streak without an RBI, which matches the Oakland record of 43 set by Ted Martinez from May 26-Sept. 20, 1975...his last RBI came on Aug. 31, 2016 at Houston.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1969 Sal Bando hits the first grand slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum...in 1984 Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and two-run shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-2, 6.19 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 25th of his career...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his three starts and his average of 1.13 walks per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League...however, his 6.19 ERA is fourth highest...is in his third season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in one start on the road...is now 0-10 with a 6.45 ERA (48 er in 67.0 ip) in 13 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 6-3 with a 4.22 ERA (30 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts on the road... his 10-game career-opening home losing streak is one short of the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1908...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history...the record is 14, held by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...has won each of his last four road starts dating back to Sept. 15 of last year and has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) over that stretch...allowed a run in the first inning of his first road start this year, snapping a 23.0-inning road scoreless streak...that fell two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991)...went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in three starts at home last year, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA in four starts on the road.

AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Defeated the Dodgers in his last start for his first win after losing to the Angels and Rangers in his first two starts...is now 3-3 with a 3.74 ERA (18 er in 43.1 ip) in seven career starts against National League teams compared to 3-10 with a 6.16 ERA (60 er in 87.2 ip) in 17 starts against the American League.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on March 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Trout in the first and two more runs, one earned, in the third...also yielded a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0...Hendriks allowed both inherited runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas on April 5 in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, all in the second inning...yielded a RBI single to Odor and then his own throwing error on a Rua sacrifice allowed two more runs to score...Robinson added a RBI single to give the Rangers a 4-0 lead.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 16-6 win at Los Angeles (NL) last Wednesday...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed a Seager RBI ground out in the bottom of the first...Oakland added five more in the fourth before he allowed a solo home run to Grandal in the bottom of the fourth...had a 9-2 lead when he was relieved by Petit with no outs and runners on first and third in the sixth...Petit allowed both runs to score.

0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded...his ERA during his second stint was fifth lowest in the American League over that span.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .187 (14-for-75) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .268 (22-for-82) against left-handers...issued seven of his nine walks to righties...allowed a .176 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that... his career splits are .225 (45-for-200) the first time through the lineup, .292 (93-for-318) after that.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 0.64 ERA in innings one and two, a 4.34 ERA from the third inning on...his career numbers are 2.63 (14 er in 48.0 ip) in innings one and two, 6.94 (64 er in 83.0 ip) from the third inning on...tied for fifth in the AL in complete games (1)...made five of his seven starts during the day...has made 13 of his 24 career starts in day games...the A's went 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments after going 3-11 (.214) in 2016.

MORE 2017: Began the season on Oakland's 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital... the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was recalled for the first time May 29 and allowed three home runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day at Cleveland...it is the only time in his career he allowed more than one home run in a start... allowed four runs in 4.2 innings in his next start June 3 against Washington and was 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA in two starts when he was optioned back to Nashville June 3...returned to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded and went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA in five starts...including 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA in September...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in September...tossed his first career complete game and the A's only complete game of the season a two-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Philadelphia Sept. 15...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a careerhigh 118 pitches...tossed seven scoreless innings in his next start Sept. 20 at Detroit for the first winning streak of his career...it was his first career victory in 10 starts during the day...did not walk a batter and joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...did not allow a run in the first three innings of his next start Sept. 26 against Seattle for a career-high and A's season-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed seven scoreless innings to defeat the Rangers in the final game of the season Oct. 1 at Texas.

- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth
 in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)...
 had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most
 by an A's team since at least 1974.
