# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-11) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (17-2)

SATURDAY, APRIL 21, 2018 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (2-2, 1.63) VS. LHP CHRIS SALE (1-0, 1.23) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their season-best four-game winning streak snapped last night...are now 5-3 over the last eight games after starting the year 4-8... are in fourth place in the American League West for the 12th consecutive day...spent the first day of the season tied for first, the second day tied for second and every day since then in fourth (14 days) or tied for fourth (seven days)...swept a three-game series from Chicago to start the homestand for the first series win of the season...had lost three series and split two and the season-opening streak of five consecutive series without a win matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history (0-2-3 in 1973)...the longest was in 1998 when Oakland went 0-3-3

*LEFT AND RIGHT:* The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tonight for the second consecutive game...are also scheduled to face a lefty tomorrow and in all three games of the Texas series...are 1-6 (.143) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-5 (.615) against right-handers...the winning percentage against left-handed starters is second worst in the majors to Detroit (0-1, .000)...are batting .278 with a .743 OPS against left-handers, .267 with a .805 OPS against righties.

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff has allowed at least one home run in 15 consecutive games (26 home runs total), which is one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with a home run allowed...had a 16-game streak from Aug. 5-22, 2015...has allowed 30 home runs for the season, which is second most in the majors to Los Angeles-AL (31)...had an Oaklandrecord tying streak of seven consecutive games with two or more home runs allowed from April 6-14 (also April 29-May 5, 1997)...the A's offense had its streak of seven consecutive games with a home run end last night...have hit 21 home runs in the last 12 games and 26 for the season, which is tied for third in the American League.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .302 (93-for-308) with 63 runs scored over the last eight games (7.9 runs per game) after hitting .245 and averaging 3.7 runs per game over the first 12 contests...have 35 extra base hits over the last eight games (21 doubles, 14 home runs) after tallying 31 over the first 12 (17 doubles, 2 triples, 12 home runs)...are hitting .270 overall, which is the second highest batting average in the American League behind Boston (.293)...also rank second with a .349 on-base percentage (Boston, .361) and .788 OPS (Boston, .858) and third with a .439 slugging percentage...are second in hit by pitches (11), third in extra base hits (66), tied for third in runs (107), doubles (38), home runs (26) and walks (79) and fourth in most strikeouts (187)...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors in grounded into double plays (17).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.31 ERA (69 er in 117.0 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 3.74 ERA over the first seven contests...are averaging 2.23 walks per nine innings and 7.02 strikeouts per nine innings, both of which are the lowest marks in the majors...however, have the third highest opponents batting average (.274) and slugging percentage (.453)...have 16 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (18)...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed six runs in each of the last two games after surrendering just two runs total over the previous three...they are 6-9 with a 5.30 ERA (62 er in 105.1 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League (Chicago, 5.99) and are tied for third in losses...Sean Manaea is 2-2 with a 1.63 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 4-7 with a 6.61 ERA (57 er in 77.2 ip).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's allowed a season-high five stolen bases on Wednesday and have now allowed 15 stolen bases for the season...that is tied with Chicago for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 23)...A's base runners have stolen just four bases, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...have attempted just six, which is also tied for the fewest in the majors.

*BY INNING:* The A's scored three times in the first inning last night...did not score a run in the first inning over the first eight games this year but have 16 first inning runs in 12 games since then...only the Red Sox, with 18, have more first inning runs among American League teams...have scored 36 runs in the seventh inning or later, which is second most in the American League to Toronto (46)...are batting .279 (67-for-240) in the seventh inning or later, which is second best in the majors to Boston's .282 (62-for-220)...the pitch-

ing staff has a 3.05 ERA (21 er in 62.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 5.63 (75 er in 120.0 ip) over innings one through six.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (0-1)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2) and are 6-6 at home for the season...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2)...leave following the game tomorrow for a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Texas (three games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for fifth best home record in American League but tied for the second worst road record.

*CLOSE CALLS:* The A's defeated Chicago 12-11 in 14 innings on Wednesday in a 5 hour and 48 minute game...it was third longest game by time in Oakland history (6:32 vs. Los Angeles-AL on April 29, 2013 and 6:00 at New York-AL on Aug. 9, 2002) and the A's have won all three of those games...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game, which is sixth longest in the American League...Wednesday was the A's second extra inning win and second walk-off win of the season (defeated the Angels 6-5 in 11 innings on Opening Day)...are one of five teams with two walk-off wins (Detroit, Milwaukee, Minnesota, San Francisco)...overcame a five-run deficit for the win Wednesday, topping the four-run comeback against the Angels in the season opener...improved to 3-1 in one-run games, which is tied with Los Angeles for the second best record in the AL to Boston (5-0).

*SCHEDULE NOTES:* This homestand concludes a season-opening stretch where the A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...the three-game series in Seattle last weekend were the A's only games outside of California...on Monday, the A's begin a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Texas, Houston and Seattle...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series.

*THE DISABLED LIST*: After reinstating Josh Phegley from the disabled list and optioning him to Nashville today, the A's have four players remaining on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...that is a season-low as Oakland began the year with five players on the DL...have used the DL eight times this year...had a season-high seven from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint... it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's vs. RED SOX:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2018 last night...won the season series last year 4-3 after losing the season series each of the previous two years (went 1-5 in both 2015 and 2016)...won three out of four in Oakland last year and lost two of three at Fenway...are 5-13 over their last 18 games against the Red Sox and have been outscored 131-63 (7.3 runs to 3.5 runs)...are 4-5 in the Coliseum over that stretch and 1-8 at Fenway...are 240-295 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 145-122 in Oakland, 94-172 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 882-1076 against the Red Sox.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Matt Chapman* is one of four Athletics to start all 20 games (Davis, Lowrie, Semien) and now has a consecutive games played streak of 100 dating back to last year...*Jed Lowrie* leads the majors with 32 hits, 22 RBI, 10 multiple hit games and five games with three or more hits and is tied for the lead with 55 total bases...has hit safely and driven in a run in each of his last six games and is 14-for-28 (.500) with five multiple hit games, three home runs and 11 RBI over that span.

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1981** Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900<sup>th</sup> career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-2, 1.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first four starts, which matches the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on the A's Opening Day roster over the last 28 years...the last longer streaks were in 1990 by Dave Stewart (7 games) and Bob Welch (5 games)...has a 1.63 ERA, which is tied for 10th in the American League...is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster and is beginning his third season in the majors.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his four starts and his average of 1.30 walks per nine innings is tied for fourth lowest in the American League...his .168 opponents batting average is eighth best...opponents are 1-for-20 (.050) with runners on base, including 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position...has surrendered four home runs, all solo shots...last year, 12 of the 18 home runs he surrendered came with the bases empty...opponents are 2-for-27 (.074) with no walks and a hit by pitch (.107 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received zero runs of support in his two losses...last year, he received no runs of support in four of his 10 losses...has no run support in 10 of his 21 career losses...has received just eight runs of support in 27.2 innings this year and his run support average of 2.60 is 10th lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) in two starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts on the road...has allowed three of his four home runs on the road...last year, he went 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA in 13 starts in Oakland and allowed just five home runs in 68.2 innings (0.66 per nine innings)...was 6-7 with a 4.50 ERA in 16 starts on the road and yielded 13 home runs in 90.0 innings (1.30 per nine innings)...is now 12-7 with a 3.33 ERA (62 er in 167.2 ip) in 29 career games at home, 9-14 with a 4.52 ERA (82 er in 163.1 ip) in 29 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start during the day compared to 1-2 with a 1.74 ERA (4 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts at night... last year, he was 6-1 with a 3.57 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 6-9 with a 4.89 ERA and .292 opponents average in 18 starts at night...tied for sixth in the American League in day wins...is now 9-3 with a 3.39 ERA (42 er in 111.2 ip) in 19 career day games, 12-18 with a 4.19 ERA (102 er in 219.1 ip) in 39 starts at night.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed three of his four runs in the first inning (3 er in 4.0 ip, 6.75 ERA) and has a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) from the second inning on...last year, he yielded 43 of his 88 runs over the first two innings of his starts...had a 5.91 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 3.08 ERA over innings three through five and a 7.13 ERA in the sixth inning...did not allow a run after the sixth inning (8.2 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter of the game, Mike Trout, but that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings.. retired 12 straight at one point and set down 21 of the final 23 hitters...left trailing 1-0 as the A's scored their only run in the bottom of the ninth.

SECOND START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-2 win over Texas April 4 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just one run for the second consecutive start...became the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Mazara led off with a single, went to second on a Chrinos walk, third on a Profar sacrifice fly and scored on a Rua fielders choice...did not allow a run over his final three innings and retired each of the final 12 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles (NL) on April 10...allowed back-to-back home runs to Taylor and Seager to start the bottom of the first but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...Ryu and three Dodgers relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

LAST START: He was the wining pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Seattle last Sunday...the A's scored twice in the top of the first and he did not allow a hit over the first three innings...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks before Motter hit a one-out solo home run in the fifth inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

allowed two runs in the second inning on a Ramirez home run and a Rutledge RBI ground out, but Oakland came back to tie the game in the bottom of the second...allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Pedroia RBI single but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...then took the loss in an 11-1 decision at Boston Sept. 12...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 11 hits in 3.2 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he yielded five runs in the second inning on RBI singles by Bogaerts, Vazquez and Pedroia and a tworun triple by Betts...also allowed a two-run home run to Betts in the fourth... his other loss came in a 13-5 decision at Boston on May 10, 2016...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...also allowed five runs in the third inning.

2017 RECAP: Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...this marked just the third time in Oakland history (Wengert, 161.1 ip in 1996 and 134.0 ip in 1997) and fourth time in Athletics history (Garver, 145 ip in 1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the fifth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (Karsay, 24 in 1997; Wengert, 25 in 1996; Young, 27 in 1986; Langford, 29 in 1979)...struck out 264 batters over his first two seasons, which are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors (Hudson, 301; Zito, 283)...his 19 wins tied for sixth most...allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 18 home runs and issued 49 of his 55 walks to righties...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties...now has a .203 (52-for-256) career batting average and .561 OPS against lefties compared to .264 (266for-1007) with a .764 OPS against righties...allowed a .160 batting average with two strikes...held the three hitter in the batting order to a .216 batting average but the two hitter batted .377...now has a .212 (31-for-146) career average against the three hitter...went 5-7 against AL West competition, 7-3 against all other teams ... tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (4), tied for fifth in triples (5) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (11) and hit batters (10).

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (2-2, 4.50 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) over his last two starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...the two-game winning streak matches his career high (Sept. 15-20, 2017)...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his four starts and his average of 1.13 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League... has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.00, which is fifth best...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's win over Chicago (AL) on Monday (8.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Boston, a start in the A's 11-2 loss in Oakland on Sept. 3, 2016 (2.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...went 0-0 with a 6.12 ERA in seven games, including five starts, during the spring...ranked fourth among Cactus League pitchers with 25.0 innings pitched...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland last year.

**2015**—Went 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA in 26 games, three starts, between the Atlanta Braves and Chicago Cubs...went 1-0 with a 2.12 ERA in 11 relief appearances for the Cubs...posted eight scoreless appearances, including four scoreless outings of at least 2.0 innings...limited opponents to a .143 average and a .226 on-base percentage at Wrigley Field...went 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in six post-season relief appearances...earned the win in the NLDS Game 4 against St. Louis...entered Spring Training with Arizona but was traded to Atlanta along with cash considerations in exchange for OF Josh Elander on April 2...went 0-3 with a 7.52 ERA in 15 games, three starts, with the Braves before being designated for assignment June 11...signed as a minor league free agent with the Los Angeles Dodgers on June 30 but was released on Aug. 14 after making eight appearances between the Arizona League Dodgers, Single-A Rancho Cucamonga, and Triple-A Oklahoma City...signed as a minor league free agent with the Cubs on Aug. 18 and tossed 7.2 scoreless innings across five relief appearances before having his contract selected by Chicago on Sept. 1.

**2014**—In his third full season with the Arizona Diamondbacks, went 3-12 with a 5.61 ERA in 32 games, 17 starts...was one of three pitchers in Major League Baseball with at least 15 starts and 15 relief outings (David Phelps and Brad Hand)...went 2-10 with a 6.31 ERA as a starter and 1-2 with a 3.04 ERA in relief...averaged a career-best 0.73 home runs per nine innings (0.80 in 2013)... started on March 23 vs. Los Angeles (NL) in Sydney, Australia...allowed five earned runs in 4.0 innings and took the loss...on April 13 against New York (NL), he became the second Arizona starter in club history to strikeout at least eight batters in 4.0 innings or less (also, Randy Johnson Sept. 1, 2008 vs. St. Louis; eight strikeouts in 3.2 IP)...earned his first career save on April 18 at Los Angeles (NL)...was designated for assignment June 9...posted a 2-3 record with a 4.45 ERA in seven starts between Single-A Visalia and Triple-A Reno...his contract was selected from Reno on July 14 and he returned to the Arizona rotation on July 18 against Chicago (NL).

**2013**—Appeared in 26 games, 25 starts, in his second season with the Arizona Diamondbacks, posting an 8-10 record with a 3.99 ERA...held opponents to four earned runs or fewer in 29 straight starts from June 27, 2012 to May 27, 2013, which was the second-longest streak in club

history behind Randy Johnson's 30 games (April 13 - Sept. 22, 2011)...limited opponents to a .214 average with runners in scoring position, which was seventh-lowest in the National League... went 5-0 with a 2.70 ERA in the second half...joined Mariano Rivera as the only two pitchers to go 5-0 after the All-Star Break...recorded 10 strikeouts on June 14 at San Diego, matching his career high (also June 26, 2010 against Pittsburg)...was placed on the 15-day disabled list with a right hip contusion July 1...was reinstated Aug. 18...earned the victory in his first relief appearance in an 18-inning affair on Aug. 24 at Philadelphia, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings...collected a triple on May 6 at Los Angeles (NL), his first career extra-base hit.

**2012**—Recorded at least 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 innings for the second straight season, going 13-12 with a 3.78 ERA in 32 starts with the D-Backs...established a career high with 156 strikeouts...ranked among National League leaders in ground ball percentage (second, 71.8), ground balls (second, 351) and GIDP (tied-second, 23)...also finished seventh in the NL with a 2.91 road ERA...tossed a six-hit shutout June 3 at San Diego, which was his second career shutout and complete game...tossed his third complete game Sept. 29 against Chicago (NL).

2011—Had one of the best starts to a season in Oakland history, going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 6-14 with a 4.98 ERA and .288 opponents average over his final 26 starts...the six wins were tied for the Major League lead through May 14 but his 14 losses tied for the most in the majors from May 15 through the end of the season...was 12-14 with a 4.16 ERA in 34 starts overall...tied for the American League lead in games started...had career highs in game started and innings pitched (207.2)...allowed a .269 opponents batting average, including .264 against left-handed hitters and .274 against righthanders...was the A's Opening Day starter April 1 against Seattle...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...was the youngest since Vida Blue in 1971 (21 years, 251 days)...went 4-0 with a 1.88 ERA in six starts in April...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 win at Texas May 9, allowing just one run for the seventh time in his first eight starts...became the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...then took the loss May 15 against Chicago, despite allowing just two earned runs in 7.0 innings...the loss snapped a career-high tying seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010, Oct. 1 at Seattle...allowed a career-high 10 runs in 2.0 innings in the A's 17-7 loss at New York July 22...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow 10 runs with 2.0 innings pitched or fewer...went 0-4 in August to drop his overall record to 9-13... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is just the fourth pitcher since 1900 start a season 6-0 or better and then fall at least four games under .500 later that season: Joe Benz, CWS (6-0, then 12-17), Jim Lonborg, BOS (6-0, 7-11) and Rick Honeycutt, SEA (6-0, 10-17).

**2010**—Began the season on the disabled list and was optioned to Sacramento before returning to Oakland April 30 to lead the A's with 18 wins...posted an 18-8 record in 30 starts with a team-leading 2.97 ERA...ranked third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), fourth in ERA and opponents on-base percentage (.287), tied for fourth in wins, tied for fifth in winning percentage (.692) and sixth in opponents slugging (.332)...his 18 wins tied for third most in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 23...the last AL pitcher under the age of 23 with at least 18 wins was Bret Saberhagen, who won 20 games for Kansas City in 1985 at the age of 21...the last major leaguer was Mark Prior, who won 18 for the Cubs in 2003...his 2.97 ERA was the lowest by an AL pitcher younger than 23 since 1990 (Kevin Appier, KC 2.76)... all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...his opponents batting average included a .198 mark against righthanded hitters and .237 against left-handers...the average against righties was the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...went 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25...led AL pitchers with 54 assists and tied for second with 61 total chances...began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula...was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA and .226 opponents batting average in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 30...allowed six hits or fewer while pitching five innings or more in 20 consecutive starts from May 5 to Aug. 14...that matched the longest such streak in modern Major League history (since 1900)...Nolan Ryan of the California Angels also had a 20-game streak from July 27, 1972 to April 18, 1973...was 4-1 with a 1.96 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in six starts in May...put together a career-high seven-game winning streak that spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 1...posted a 2.12 ERA and allowed a .194 opponents batting average during the streak...had his first career 10-strikeout game June 26 against Pittsburgh...was named to his first American League All-Star team but was ineligible to pitch because he started on the Sunday before the game...had his first career complete game Aug. 2 against Kansas City, a three-hit shutout...allowed two unearned runs in the sixth inning Aug. 8 against Texas, ending his scoreless streak at a career-high 23.0 innings...yielded an earned run in the third inning Aug. 14 at Minnesota, snapping a streak of 28.0 consecutive innings without an earned run...went 5-1 with a 0.77 ERA over a six-start stretch from July 28 to Aug. 25.

**2017 RECAP:** Went 4-11 with a 6.11 ERA in 18 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...his .267 winning percentage was third lowest in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since Steve Karsay went 3-12 (.200) in 1997...had 91.1 innings pitched and did not qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 90 innings pitched, he had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.549), the fourth highest batting average (.306) and OPS (.906) and the fifth highest ERA...using the 90 inning minimum, his slugging percentage, OPS and average of 2.07 home runs per nine innings were second highest in Oakland history to Gil Heredia in 2001 (.554, .911, 2.22)... his ERA was sixth highest and the highest since Omar Olivares had a 6.75 ERA in 2000...ranked fifth among AL rookies in games started (18), sixth in innings pitched (91.1) and eighth in strikeouts (72)...tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in wild pitches (10).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .296 (63for-213) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .319 (53-for-166) against left-handers...surrendered 15 of his 21 home runs to righties...yielded a .315 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .225 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .360 after that... opponents hit .359 with a .410 on-base percentage and .543 slugging per-

centage when leading off an inning...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .200 batting average but the nine hitter batted .419.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.50 ERA in the first inning, a 5.19 ERA in innings two and three and a 9.08 ERA from the fourth inning on...his opponents batting average over those splits were .209, .259 and .379...made 12 of his 18 starts on the road and 10 during the day...received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and was 0-10 in those starts...went 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...was 1-7 in eight starts against AL West competition, 3-4 against all other teams.

MORE 2017: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14... became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...had a sacrifice hit in his first professional plate appearance but then had an infield single off Edinson Volquez in the fourth inning for his first ML hit...joins Tim Hudson (June 8, 1999 at San Diego) as the only pitchers in Oakland history with a hit in their ML debut... earned his first ML win in his third start, allowing two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 win at Chicago (AL) June 24...yielded a career-high nine hits in a 7-6 win over the White Sox July 4 but had a no decision...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games through July 4 (3 bb in 26.0 ip, 1.04 walks per nine innings)... is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more...then walked two batters or more in nine of his final 13 starts (28 bb in 65.1 ip, 3.86 per nine innings)...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...allowed a run on three hits in a career-high 7.0 innings at San Francisco Aug. 2 and picked up the win...however was optioned to Nashville the next day with a 3-6 record, a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in 10 starts...was recalled Aug. 23 and went 1-5 with a 7.47 ERA and .342 opponents batting average in eight starts following his return...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 28...finished August 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts...then went 1-4 with an 8.42 ERA and .336 opponents batting average in six starts in September...based on a minimum of 25 innings pitched, his ERA was the highest in the majors in the month and the highest by an A's pitcher in September since Hod Lisenbee had a 9.10 ERA in 1936...tied for the ML lead with nine home runs in September...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3...struck out a career-high seven in an 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader Sept. 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Detroit Sept. 19 ... yielded a career-high four home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-1 loss to Seattle Sept. 25...allowed four runs in a career-low 1.2 innings and took the loss in his final start Sept. 30 at Texas.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Compiled a 4-4 record with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against left-handers...opponents hit .161 with runners in scoring position and two outs...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road... walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...tossed six innings or fewer 12 times...walked a season-high five batters in 5.0 innings in his first start April 6 at Round Rock...allowed his first two home runs of the season and also had season highs in runs (6) and hits (9) on April 19 at Oklahoma City...followed that with a seven-start, 42.2-inning, 173 batter faced homerless streak...earned his first win May 12 against Albuquerque when he al-lowed one run in 6.0 innings...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27 the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May...took the loss in his only start in June on the 5th at Omaha and was 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts when he was promoted to Oakland June 14...ranked sixth in the PCL in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time...returned to Nashville following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland and went 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Memphis Aug. 12.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

*RHP Andrew Triggs (0-0, 1.80 ERA):* Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...had a no decision in his first start, a 3-1 A's win over Texas last Monday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17.0 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 8 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Los Angeles...went 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA in two starts last year...went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts this spring...allowed a .227 opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...was on the A's Opening Day roster last year and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-3, 9.87 ERA)

*FOR STARTERS:* Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed 19 runs in 17.1 innings over his first four starts...the runs are tied for the most in the majors (Archer, TB; Perez, TEX) and his 9.87 ERA is the highest among all ML pitchers with 15 or more innings pitched (Archer, TB 7.84)...is tied for the ML lead in losses (3) and ranks third in the American League in hits allowed (28)...struck out five batters in 4.0 innings after fanning just five in 13.1 innings over his first three starts...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster.

*FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER, FOUR RUNS OR MORE:* Has allowed at least four runs while tossing 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first four starts...the only pitcher in Oakland history with a longer such season-opening streak is Rick Langford in 1983...Langford had five starts during his streak but he had two stints in the minors during the streak, which spanned from April 4 to July 17 (0-4, 13.50 ERA).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has surrendered at least one home run in each of his first four starts and his six home runs are tied for second most in the majors to Cole Hamels (TEX), who has 7...has a streak of six consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to Sept. 22, 2017 (eight home runs total)...has surrendered six home runs in 17.1 innings this year (3.12 per nine innings) after allowing 12 in 105.1 innings last year (1.03 per nine innings)...five of the six home runs are solo shots...last year, eight of his 12 home runs came with runners on base.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .364 opponents batting average breaks down to .298 (14-for-47) against right-handed hitters compared to .467 (14-for-30) against left-handers...held lefties to a .238 batting average last year...opponents are 8-for-19 (.421) with three home runs when leading off an inning and 8-for-20 (.400) with runners in scoring position...they are 7-for-8 (.875) with two home runs when putting the first pitch in play...the opponents three hitter is 1-for-10 (.100) but the five hitter is 6-for-6 with two doubles, a triple and a home run

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-2 with a 12.27 ERA (10 er in 7.1 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he went 5-0 with a 2.94 ERA in 11 starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA in eight starts on the road...joins Kenny Rogers (11-0 in 1998) and Todd Burns (5-0 in 1988) as the only starting pitchers in Oakland history to go undefeated at home with five or more decisions...in four seasons with the A's, he is 12-11 with a 3.66 ERA (92 er in 226.0 ip) in 37 starts in Oakland compared to 10-16 with a 5.13 ERA (113 er in 198.1 ip) in 38 starts on the road.

*FIRST START:* He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win on Opening Day, March 29 in Oakland...it was his second consecutive Opening Day start and he joins Sonny Gray (2014-15) as the only A's pitchers to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Simmons RBI single and a Maldonado RBI double...then surrendered solo home runs to Calhoun in the fourth, Cozart in the fifth and Pujols in the sixth...the three home runs allowed matched the Oakland Opening Day record set by Carlos Reyes in 1996...left trailing 5-4 but the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh to get him off the hook.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Texas on April 3 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Chirinos RBI ground out and an Odor RBI single, and one more in the third on a solo home run by Gallo...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the third, but he allowed another run in the fourth inning on an Odor RBI single.

**THIRD START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 8...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Pujols and a RBI single by Calhoun...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Trout in the third and was charged with two more runs in the fourth...yielded a RBI single to Trout and was relieved by Hendriks who allowed one inherited runner to score.

*LAST START:* He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-8 loss at Seattle last Saturday...allowed a three-run home run to Segura in the second inning but Oakland tied the game with three runs in the third...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a two-run single by Haniger...was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's trailing 5-4.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-2, 1.63 ERA)

*FOR STARTERS:* Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first four starts, which matches the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on the A's Opening Day roster over the last 28 years...the last longer streaks were in 1990 by Dave Stewart (7 games) and Bob Welch (5 games)...has a 1.63 ERA, which is tied for 10th in the American League...is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster and is beginning his third season in the majors.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his four starts and his average of 1.30 walks per nine innings is tied for fourth lowest in the American League...his .168 opponents batting average is eighth best...opponents are 1-for-20 (.050) with runners on base, including 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position...has surrendered four home runs, all solo shots...last year, 12 of the 18 home runs he surrendered came with the bases empty...opponents are 2-for-27 (.074) with no walks and a hit by pitch (.107 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received zero runs of support in his two losses...last year, he received no runs of support in four of his 10 losses...has no run support in 10 of his 21 career losses...has received just eight runs of support in 27.2 innings this year and his run support average of 2.60 is 10th lowest in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his third in a day game...last year, he made five of his seven starts during the day and has made 13 of his 25 career starts in day games...is 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts during the day this year compared to 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts at night...is now 2-9 with a 4.44 ERA (36 er in 73.0 ip) in 13 career starts during the day, 5-4 with a 5.86 ERA (43 er in 66.0 ip) in 12 starts at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Picked up his first career win in the Coliseum in his last start, snapping a career-opening 10-game home losing streak...that is the longest career-opening home losing streak by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty lost 11 straight from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history and fell three short of the record of 14 set by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...is 1-2 with a 4.26 ERA (9 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in one start on the road...is now 1-10 with a 5.88 ERA (49 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 6-3 with a 4.22 ERA (30 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has won each of his last four road starts dating back to Sept. 15 of last year and has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) over that stretch...allowed a run in the first inning of his first road start this year, snapping a 23.0-inning road scoreless streak...that fell two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991).. went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in three starts at home last year, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA in four starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .190 (8-for-42) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .309 (17-for-55) against right-handers...last year, he had a .268 average against lefties, .187 against righties...has issued all three of his walks this year to right-handed hitters...issued seven of his nine walks to righties last year...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning this year...both of the home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots... has a .382 (13-for-34) batting average the first time through the lineup, .114 (4-for-35) the second time and .286 (8-for-28) after that...last year, he had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that.

- Had his first two-homer game of the season April 13 at Seattle...it was the 16th of his career.

#### CHRIS HATCHER

 Was the winning pitcher on Opening Day, March 29 against Los Angeles (AL)... became the seventh Oakland reliever to record a victory in the opener, the first since Chad Bradford in 2004...also picked up the A's second victory of the season April 2 against Texas to become the first pitcher to be credited with each of the A's first two victories since Bobby Shantz in 1952 for the Philadelphia A's.

#### JONATHAN LUCROY

• Made his seventh consecutive Opening Day start at catcher on March 29 against Los Angeles (AL).

#### MATT OLSON

- Was the A's Opening Day starter at first base on March 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and became the second player in Oakland history and the fifth in Athletics history to make on Opening Day start on their birthday (Ray Fosse, 1974; Pete Suder, 1952; Charlie Pick, 1916; Ossee Schreckengost, 1907)...went 1-for-5 with a home run to become the fourth Major Leaguer dating back to 1908 to hit an Opening Day home run on his birthday...joins Jeff Mathis (2011), lan Stewart (2010) and Scott Rolen (2000)...was the A's seventh different Opening Day starter at first base in the last seven years (Alonso, Canha, Davis, Barton, Moss, Allen).
- Stole the first base of his career April 3 against Texas.
- Went 3-for-4 as a substitute on March 11 at Los Angeles (NL) to tie an Oakland record for most hits in a game by a non-starter...it was the 10th three-hit game by a substitute, the first since Rajai Davis on Aug. 22, 2008.

#### YUSMEIRO PETIT

 Stranded his first inherited runner of the season but then allowed two inherited runners to score April 1 against Los Angeles (AL), snapping a streak of 32 consecutive inherited runners stranded...prior to that, had not allowed an inherited runner to score since May 8, 2016 at Chicago (NL).

#### **BOOG POWELL**

- Went 2-for-5 with a double and a triple in his first career Opening Day start March 29 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the sixth player in Oakland history with a triple on Opening Day, the first since Sam Fuld in 2015...is the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in center field in the last five years (R.Davis, Burns, Fuld, Crisp).
- Stole the first base of his career April 4 against Texas.

#### MARCUS SEMIEN

- Made his fourth consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop for the A's on March 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and went 3-for-5...that included his first career walk-off RBI, a single in the 11th inning...it was the fourth Opening Day walk-off in Oakland history (1972, 1982 and 1984), but he was the first Athletic with walk-off *hit* in an opener since Bing Miller had a walk-off single on April 17, 1934 in a 6-5 win over the Yankees.
