OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-11) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (8-15)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Boston over the weekend and have now won back-to-back series after going 0-3-2 over the first five series...have won six of the last seven games and are 7-3 over the last 10 games after starting the year 4-8...are in fourth place in the American League West for the 14th consecutive day...spent the first day of the season tied for first, the second day tied for second and every day since then in fourth (16 days) or tied for fourth (seven days)...swept a three-game series from Chicago last week for the first series win of the season...it came in the sixth series of the season, which matched the 1973 club for the second latest first series win of the season...the longest was in 1998 when Oakland went 0-3-3 before winning its seventh series.

CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sean Manaea was named American League Co-Player of the Week today along with Manny Machado...it is his first Player of the Week honor...on Saturday, Manaea tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston.

THE FIRST INNING: The A's have scored a run in the first inning in each of the last five games, which is one short of the Oakland record of six...that has been done four times but just once over the last 42 years (Sept. 20-26, 2001)...have 11 first inning runs over the last five games and 18 in the last 14...scored no first inning runs over the first eight games...the A's 18 first inning runs are tied with Boston for the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's will play all nine games on this road trip against American League West competition...are 5-9 (.357) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .252 (118-for-471) and are averaging 4.14 runs per game (58 runs in 14 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.79 ERA (66 er in 124.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (three games), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016...are now 8-6 at home...are averaging 5.88 runs per game on the road (47 runs in 8 games), 4.79 at home...have a 5.78 ERA (43 er in 67.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth consecutive game today...are 2-1 over the first three games of this stretch...for the season, are 3-6 (.333) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-5 (.615) against right-handers...the nine games against left-handed starters are tied with Kansas City for the most in the American League and the winning percentage is tied for fourth worst...are batting .275 with a .752 OPS against left-handers, .266 with an .804 OPS against righties.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .295 (109-for-370) over the last 10 games with 70 runs scored (7.0 per game) and 44 extra base hits (27 doubles, 1 triple, 16 home runs) after batting .245 with 3.7 runs per game and 31 extra base hits over the first 12 contests...rank second in the American League in batting (.269), on-base percentage (.344), doubles (44) and extra base hits (75), tied for second in home runs (28), third in OPS (.787) and slugging (.443) and fourth in runs (114), walks (82) and hit by pitches (11)...are tied with Kansas City and Texas for the fewest stolen bases (5), rank second in most grounded into double plays (19) and fourth in most strikeouts (203).

PITCHING: Over the last nine games, the A's have allowed either two runs or fewer (five times) or seven runs or more (four times)...are averaging 2.16 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors, and 7.29 strikeouts per nine innings, which is second lowest (Kansas City, 7.20)...have 17 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (21)...opponents have stolen 16 bases, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 25)...have the fourth highest opponents batting average in the AL (.260).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games, but have surrendered six runs in the other two...are 4-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) over the last seven games after going 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...Sean Manaea is 3-2 with

a 1.23 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 4-7 with a 6.21 ERA (58 er in 84.0 ip).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have not allowed a home run in the last two games after surrendering at least one in each of the previous 15 contests...that fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with a home run allowed (16, Aug. 5-22, 2015)...A's pitchers have allowed 26 home runs in the last 17 games and 30 for the season, which is third most in the American League...the A's offense has hit 23 home runs in the last 14 games and 28 for the season, which is tied with New York and Toronto for second in the AL (Los Angeles, 32).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning yesterday to break a 1-1 tie...improved to 3-0 in last at bat games with the win...are tied for second in the American league in last at bat wins and are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto)...are 9-3 when scoring first, 2-8 when the opponent scores first...are 4-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 7-9 in games decided by three runs or more...the pitching staff has a 2.78 ERA (21 er in 68.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 5.07 (76 er in 135.0 ip) over innings one through six.

SCHEDULE NOTES: After playing each of their first 22 games on the West Coast, the A's will play their first game outside of the Pacific Time Zone tonight...19 of the A's first 22 games were in California...follow this three-game series with Texas with a three-game series at Houston...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 games on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have a season-low four players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's and Rangers split a four-game series in Oakland April 2-5 to open the season series...the A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games but have lost 11 of the last 16 road games...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 51-48 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 354-363 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 188-172 in Oakland and 166-191 in Texas...are 99-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 451-444 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is one of four Athletics to start all 22 games (Davis, Lowrie, Semien) and now has a consecutive games played streak of 102 dating back to last year...**Khris Davis** is a .296 (42-for-142) career hitter against Texas with 18 home runs and 39 RBI in 41 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...is a .338 (23-for-68) hitter at Globe Life Park with eight home runs and 13 RBI in 18 games...**Jed Lowrie** is 15-for-36 (.417) with three doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI and five multiple hit games over his last eight games...leads the majors with 33 hits and five games with three or more hits...is tied for the lead with 23 RBI, 10 multiple-hit games and seven go-ahead RBI.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1978** the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in **1985** the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the first A's first 14 games...in **1988** Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings to defeat Chicago (AL) that night...it was his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle when he combined with Craig Breslow and Jerry Blevins on a four-hit shutout (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...was originally selected by Oakland in the second round of the 2006 draft out of high school and made his Major League debut in 2009 at the age of 21...went 40-35 with a 3.91 ERA in 96 starts over three seasons with the A's before he was traded to Arizona following the 2011 season...went 33-44 with a 4.29 ERA in 187 games, 92 starts, over the next six seasons with the Diamondbacks (2012-14), Braves (2015), Cubs (2015-16), Padres (2017) and Royals (2017).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks...retired the side in order just once and that came in his final inning...was relieved by Dull to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 8-0.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 10-4 with a 2.69 ERA (110.1 ip, 98 h, 38 r, 33 er, 32 bb, 66 so, 9 hr) in 17 career appearances, all starts...the 10 wins are his most against any team...nine of those wins have come with the A's, which is tied for second most in Oakland history against the Rangers...the only pitcher with more is Barry Zito with 17...is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts at Globe Life Park and 6-3 with a 2.96 ERA (23 er in 70.0 ip) in 11 starts in his home ballparks...is 5-3 with a 3.18 ERA (20 er in 56.2 ip) in nine starts in the Coliseum...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, a 5-1 Padres win at San Diego on May 8...shutout the Padres on a hit and five walks over 5.1 innings...was relieved by Brad Hand with a 4-0 lead and one out in the sixth inning with runners on first and second.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (1-0, 5.82 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...allowed six runs in 1.1 innings in his last start after allowing five runs in 15.2 innings (2.87 ERA) over his first three starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 12-11 A's win over Chicago (AL) in 14 innings last Wednesday in Oakland (1.1 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.02 ERA (17.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Texas...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's win on April 2 in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts, this spring...allowed a .227 opponents batting average...struck out 25 batters, which tied for fourth in the Cactus League...was fifth in innings pitched (24.1)...was on the A's Opening Day roster in 2017 and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury.

with a 3.69 ERA in 11 starts with the Padres and 0-0 with an 8.22 ERA in 10 games, three starts, with the Royals...combined for a 4-3 record and a 4.93 ERA in a career-low 21 appearances overall...missed 12 weeks of the season due to three stints on the disabled list...surrendered 16 home runs in 84.1 innings, including 10 in 23.0 innings with the Royals...his average of 1.71 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark of his career...also had career highs in walks per nine innings (4.82), strikeouts per nine innings (9.32), opponents slugging percentage (.483) and opponents OPS (.850)...had a Major League leading 16 wild pitches, including 14 with San Diego...tied for the National League in wild pitches (Arrieta, CHC) despite making just 11 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .241 (35-for-145) by left-handed hitters compared to .301 (56-for-186) by right-handers...13 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents hit .236 with runners in scoring position.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Went 4-3 with a 4.38 ERA in his 14 starting assignments...compiled an 8.25 ERA in seven relief appearances...did not inherit a runner and first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400) with two walks.

HOME AND AWAY: Combined for a 4-0 record, a 1.83 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in seven games in his home ballparks...was 0-3 with a 7.07 ERA and .320 opponents batting average in 14 games on the road...now has a seven-game home winning streak and a four-game road losing streak.

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-3 with a 3.38 ERA and .226 opponents batting average in nine starts before the All-Star Break, 1-0 with a 7.29 ERA and .340 opponents average in 12 games after the break...went 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in four interleague starts and is now 11-4 with a 3.10 ERA (47 er in 136.1 ip) in 26 career interleague appearances, including 21 starts...opponents were successful in 17-of-19 (89.5%) stolen base attempts...batted .286 (4-for-14) with a double, walk, two RBI and a run scored.

MORE 2017: Was signed by San Diego Feb. 23 and started the Padres first game of the season on April 5 at Los Angeles (NL)...allowed three runs in 5.2 innings for the loss and went on the disabled list the next day with a strained back...was reinstated April 16 and, after taking the loss that day at Atlanta, compiled a season-best three-game winning streak from April 21 to May 8...logged a 2.25 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over that four-start stretch...began the streak by allowing one run in a season-high 7.0 innings April 21 against Miami...then struck out a season-high nine batters but also allowed a season-high nine hits in 5.2 innings at Arizona on April 26...went 2-0 with a 1.56 ERA in three starts in May before returning to the disabled list on May 14 with an inflamed right shoulder...made one rehab start with Single-A Lake Elsinore on June 22 at Inland Empire (L, 2.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and one with Triple-A El Paso on June 28 against Sacramento (L, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so) before he was reinstated from the disabled list July 4...surrendered a season-high six runs in 3.2 innings in his final outing with the Padres on July 21 at San Francisco, but had a no decision in a 12-9 win...was traded to Kansas City with pitchers Ryan Buchter and Brandon Maurer for pitchers Matt Strahm and Travis Wood, minor league infielder Esteury Ruiz and cash on July 24...made each of his first three appearances as a Royal as a starter and had no decisions and an 8.18 ERA before going on the disabled list a third time Aug. 10 with right shoulder impingement syndrome...was reinstated Sept. 1 and pitched exclusively in relief following his return...logged an 8.25 ERA and .313 opponents batting average in seven outings in September...allowed six home runs and walked 12 in 12.0 innings.
